

"BEWARE OF FLIES"

A circular entitled "Beware of Files" is being scattered broadeast in Massachusetts by the associded boards of health. The states of Ohio, New York and New Jersey have issued similar circulars. In Washington, and in other States, newspapers are urging the people to begin a war of extermination upon the common house-fly. This insect is now know to be a deadly enemy to human health. Some news paper are changing its name from "hous-fly" to typhoid fly."

The fly does not in itself cause disease, but it is a carrier of disease germs. It is said that 10, 000 typhoid feyer germs can cling to one of a fly's numerous feet. If these germs are left upon human food they may cause the person who eats it to have typhoid fever. Other diseases of the in testines such as cholera infantum, may be carried in the same way.

Great care should be taken to shut flies out of houses, and especially to keep them from alight ing on anything that is to be eaten to eat fruit or other food that has may get at it. - Current Events.


