## Conferees seek tax relief common ground

AUSTIN --- A committee of five House and five Senate confereves last week continued to search for common ground on a tax plan that would give property tax relief to Texans.

About $\$ 800$ million in new taxes would be raised and school property taxes would be cut by an average of 17 cents per $\$ 100$ valuaton under the Senate committee's plan, while the House plan would plan, while the House plan would
raise $\$ 3.8$ billion in new taxes to pay for lower school property taxes pay for lower school property

cents per $\$ 100$ valuation. The House plan would cut local school taxes by about $\$ 5$ bellion every two years, while the less-ambitious Senate plan would
bring cuts of about $\$ 25$ billion bring cuts of about $\$ 2.5$ billion over the period. Each plan has a
mix of business franchise, sales and service tax increases.
and service tax increases.
Gov. George W. Bush, who called for tax relief last year, offred a plan of his own that would cut school property taxes and raise business and sales taxes to pay for
the cuts. Bush's plan was opposed the cuts. Bush's plan was opposed
by most Republicans and many business groups.
"Some people thought the prothat it's here in committee it's historic opportunity," Bush was quoted in the Dallas Morning News.
A legislative analysis says that under either plan, once tax increases are subtracted from property tax savings, the average Texan would see a cut of about 2 percent

## Property Tax Protest and Appeal Procedures

## The law gives property owners the right to protest actions conceming their property tax apprais

You may follow these procedures if you have a concern about.

* the value placed on your property
exemptions that may apply to you;
cancellation of agricultural appraisal
whether your property is taxable;
be taxing your property; or

Informal Review: For an informal review of your property value, contact Ray L. Ballew, Chief Appraiser, at the appraisal district office located at 1 W Warner Avenue
Review by the Appraisal Review Board: If you can't resolve your problem informally with the :
: appraisal district staff, you may have your case heard by the appraisal review board.
The appraisal review board (ARB) is an independent board of citizens that reviews problems: : with appraisals and other concerns listed above. It has the power to order the appraisal district to: : make the necessary changes to solve problems. If you file a written request for an ARB hearing - receive written notification of the time, date, and place of the hearing. The hearing will be informal. You and the appraisal district representative will be asked to present evidence about your case. The ARB will make its decision based on the evidence presented. You can get a copy of a protest : form from the appraisal district office at 1 W . Warner Ave., Box 936, Eldorado, TX 76936.
Note: You shouldn't try to contact ARB members outside of the hearing. The law requires you to - sign an affidavit saying that you haven't done so before the ARB hears your case.

Review by the District Court: After it decides your case, the ARB must send you a copy of its: order by certified mail. If you're not satisfied with the decision you have the right to appeal to district : court. If you choose to go to court, you

- the date you receive the ARB's order.
If the appraisal district has appraised your property at $\$ 1,000,000$ or more, you must file a notice: - of appeal with the chief appraiser within 15 days of the date you receive the ARB's order.
