SPRING FLOWERING ANNUALS
Unusually cold win has killed or severely damged many fall planted spring flowering annuals.
Excessive moisture and cloudy weather have
further aggravated the situation. Pansies and some
snapdragons have survived but most calendulas, alyssum, petunias and many other annuals will have to be replanted.
For best res
For best results set out
new plants as soon as they
become availabe become available and
planting areas can be planting areas can be
adequately prepared. Most springately prepared. Most
thrive in sunny, well-draialsed beds high in organic
content. In most cases, spring
flowering bulbs should not flowering bubs bhould not
have been damaged by
excessive cold. Most tulips excessive cold. Most tulips,
daffodils and hyacinths actually prefer consistently cold winters. They estab-
lish root systems lish root systems during the
cool days of spring. Flowering of ornamental
fruit trees and many defruit trees and many de-
ciduous shrubs should also ciduous shrubs should also
profit from the continued profit. Such favorites as
clowering quince, weigelia, flowering quince, weige and
lila, flowering pears
crabapples should all procrabapples should all pro-
vide an unusually fine dis-
