## Education is learning and growing. And it is one of the most important things

 a community can give its youth. The schol in Ildorado is ano . That is plain to see by the number of students winning honors inwinning scholarships to universities and doing so well in the outside world However, the local system has a few problems that the school board feels colld be alleviated by the passage of a 51.2 million bond issue. First of all, the
school school is crowded. Elementary students needing extra help have to meet with
teachers in hallways or in corners of workrooms; high school classes have to be shuffled around in all directions, even to dressing rooms off the stage and teachers do not have a place to hold conferences with students. The cafeteria is also crowded, with students having to rush in and eat to make room for other students. Also, there is lititle room to store visual aids and other materials so If the bond issue passes, the board will build three new buildings, an elementary classroom buitiding, cafeetria and learning center.
These conditions have existed for at least two years, and the shool board
 expected to coninad to grow stea hly as in has in the pastirw years. The financial condition of the shool system is excellent, with the only debts
being two payments on the new football field. In fact, the board has a surplus fynnd of about 5280,000 .
