PROPOSITION NO. 1
Senate Joint Resolution 8 propose a constitutional amendment that would allow the legislature to author-
ize cities, towns and other taxing units to grant exemptions from ad valorem taxes on an unproductive unerdeveloped or blighted area in
order to encourage its developen order to encourage its development.
The amendment would also allow the legislature to authorize a city or town to issue bonds or notes to finance this development and to
pledge future increases in ad valor em tax revenues from the property in such areas to repay these bonds or PROPOSITION NO. 2

#### Abstract

Flowerpot Barbecue Ha mburgers and hot dogs cooking on a flowerHa mburgers and hot dogs cooking on a flower- pot? As a matter of fact ng. Grill on rack, turning individual lettuce-lined often. The sticks allow for plates; The next time you dogs cookng on a fer of fact, pot? your flowerpotter can provide a a convenient grill for balconies or patios, as well as for backyard dinners and parties. To construct your grill, you'll need an 11-innch or larger unglazed clay flower- pot, dirt. some fireproof pot, dirt. some fireproof screening, charcoal brisscreening, charcoal bris- quets, and a cookie-cooling rack. Fill the flowerpot to within 4 to 5 inches of the within 4 to 5 inches of the top with dirt (sand or gravel top with dirt (sand or gravel will work also). Lay the screening $n$ the dirt then screening n the dirt, then place the briquets on the place the briquets on the screening so that the bri- auets don't sink into the screening so that the bri- quets don't sink into the dirt as they burn (thus dirt as they burn (thus smothering them). You smothering them). You may want to slip your hand may want to slip your hand into a sandwich bag "glove" to avoid a mess as you pile the briquets. Try the sides of the pot to prevent overheating. Light the briquets and let them heat. To make the grill,

Because the grill is small, if yourre planning a large you re planning a large dinner or party, you'll want to construct a grill for each person (or couple).
