Pace Quickens In Local Races

Competition for places on Schleicher County governmental bodies is becoming stiffer from day to day as deadlines for filing approach.

Deadline for the Schleicher County Independent School Board of Trustees was March 2nd. Three people are contending for two spots left open by the expiration of Billy Williams' and Lynn Meadors' terms. Cliff Schooley, Jr. has joined John Nikolauk and incumbent Meador in the race.

Friday, March 11 will be the last day to cast your hat into the ring for candidacy on the Water Board. Two seats are open as Steve Sykes,

Precinct 2 and Howard Derrick, Precinct 3 will run for re-election in their respective precincts. Both men are unopposed at Leader presstime.

Pam White, Bill Hodges, William Edmiston, Barbara Nichols, Penny Bland, Carmilla Reidy, Jimmy Belk and Julie Griffin have all filed for positions on the Hospital Board. They will be competing for three seats left open by the termination of Reuben Minor's, Becky Sterling's and Pat Sykes' interims.

March 2 was the filing deadline for the City Council. Three seats are up including Mayor Bob Lester's. Lester will run again and will be unopposed.

Incumbents, Ronnie Sauer and Wayne McGinnes head the list of candidates for the other two open spots. Also running for positions are Walt Bosmans, Jr., Barbara Jackson, Dennis Lampman and Bill Hodges.

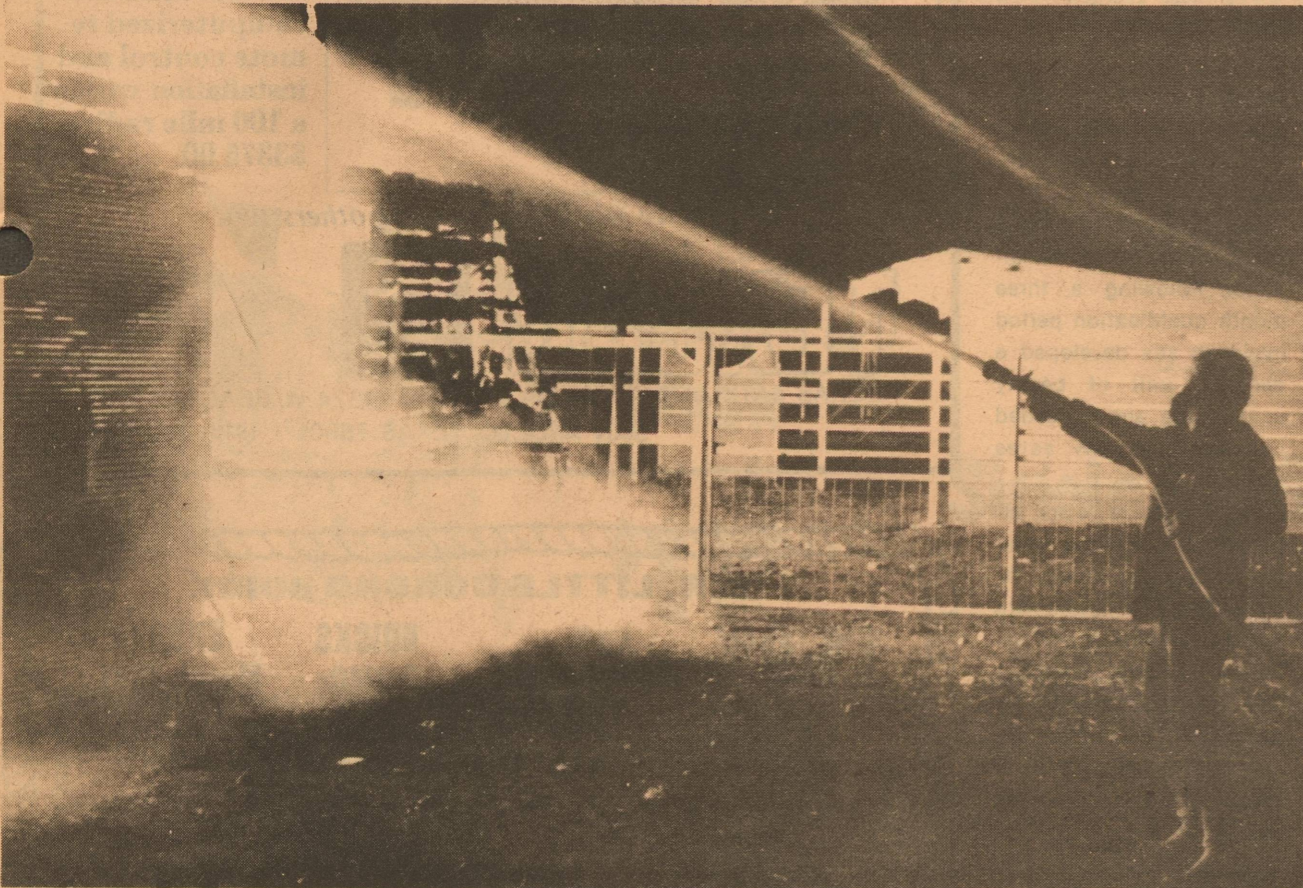

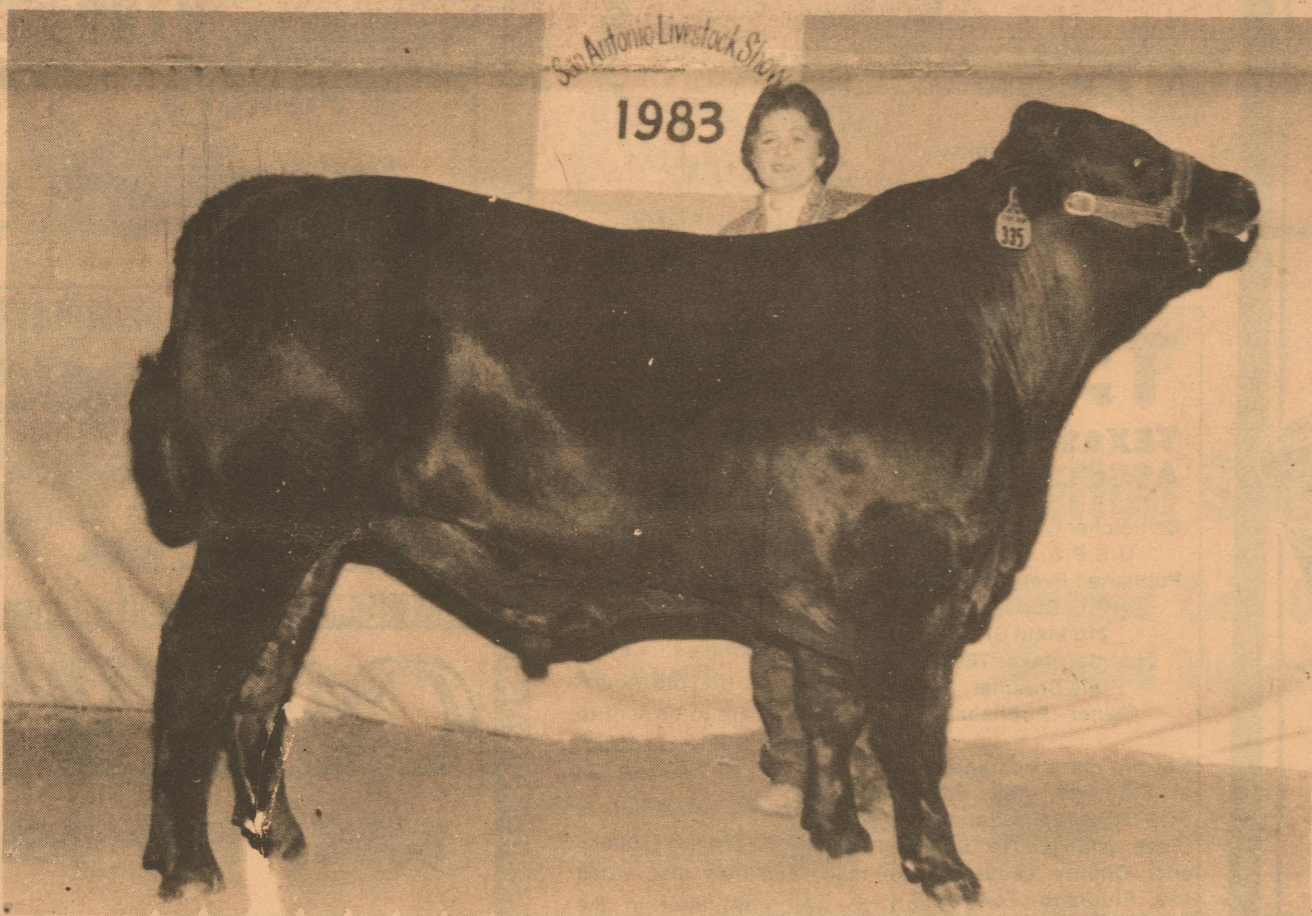


Steve Nelson helps extinguish the blaze which totally destroyed John Ed Meador's barn last Saturday.

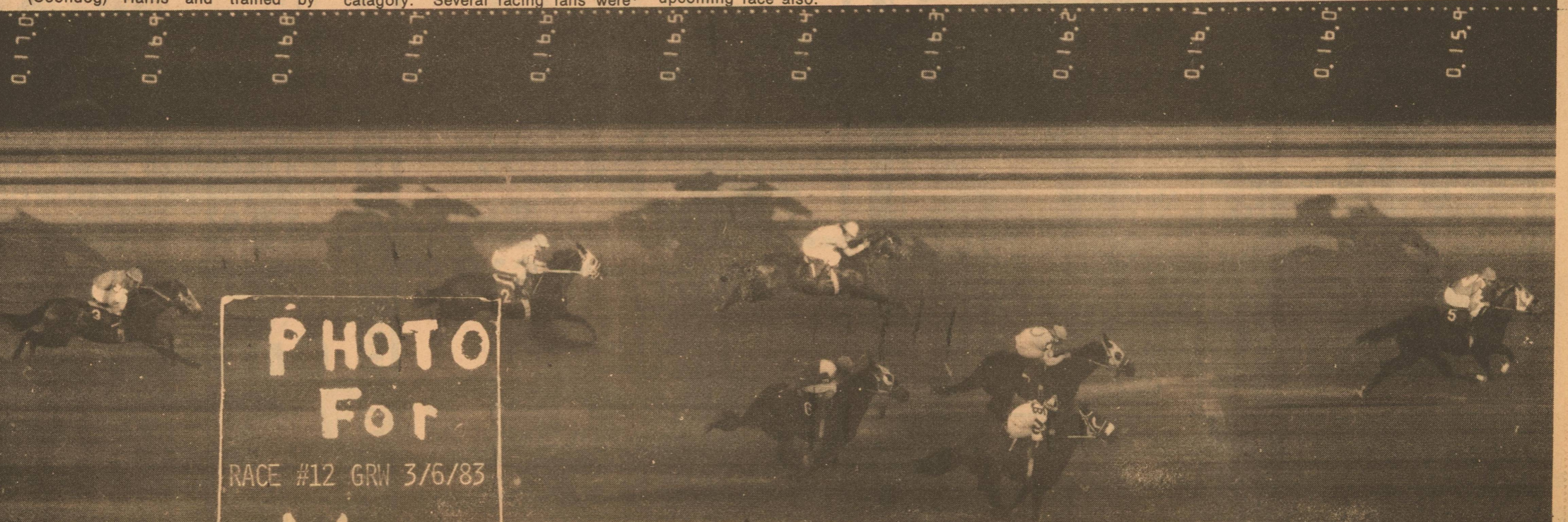

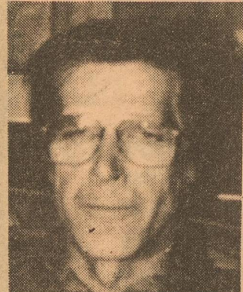

Swift Says "Thin Trees"

Jerry Swift, Schleicher County's Extension Agent reminds everyone that it will soon be time to thin your peach trees. Most of us especially enjoy the blooms of spring. But to a peach producer the joy of spring blooms signals an approaching fruit thinning task.

Homeowners should realize the importance of this necessary evil of relieving peach trees of their

"overload" when they still have too many peaches on it to size properly. Eight percent of blossom set equals a full crop of quality peaches. This means 92 percent has to go!

The decision is whether to have a lot of small, worthless peaches or a few, high-quality fruit. Too many fruit on a tree results in damaged trees and pit-and-skin peaches. Remember that it takes 191 peaches of a 1 3/4 inch diameter to make a half bushel, while it only takes 79 peaches of 2 1/2 inch diameter size for the same half bushel.

Thinning is the hardest of all tasks for the novice fruit grower. Peaches should be thinned when the fruit is still as small as a dime. Thinning at bloom time is often best, especially for earlier-ripening types such as Springgold and June Gold. The longer the fruit has to mature under the ideally thinned situation, the larger it will be; less nutrient competition equals larger fruit.

Thin fruit until all small peaches are at least 4 to 6 inches apart on the branch and there are no partner (side by side) fruit. Remove small fruit by hand plucking or limb beating. When you complete this

task, the ground will be covered by small peaches. Commercial producers use a rubber hose on the end of a broom handle to avoid limb injury upon impact.

No peach tree can size fruit properly unless thinned. The pretty picture of the mammoth peach on the sales advertisement will never occur in your backyard unless you thin.
