

Hospital Board Members Look Over Auditor's Report

Monday night the total board of the Schleicher County Hospital District met for their regularly scheduled session of the month and reviewed their financial report.

The financial report was prepared by Eckert, Ingram, Tinkler and Oliphant, certified public accountants from San Angelo. The report analyzed

the year of 1982 and the bottom line reflected that the hospital through all its sources of income had derived a \$79,018.00 net profit for the past year. This figure showed an increase in net profit of \$66,563.00 as opposed to the audit prepared for 1981. The hospital district had it not had approximately \$400,000 in ad valorem taxes, would have found itself in the red for the year of 1982.

The auditors' report also reflected a total of \$208,473.00 in total current assets and total current liabilities at \$189,417.00. In the long term liabilities, the hospital has an indebtedness of \$4,601.00 in notes payable and a bond indebtedness of

\$100,000.00, bringing to a grand total of \$294,018.00 in total liabilities. When the total liabilities are combined with fund balances a total figure of \$1,110,586.00 is found. In the total asset columns the same figure is reflected.

In a survey compiled by the administration of the Schleicher County Medical Center a total of 1,928 patient days was accumulated in the year of 1982. 644 admissions and 53 baby deliveries were performed at the hospital. In other regular business addressed by the trustees during the meeting, it was learned that Dr. Webb, D.D.S. would not utilize the clinic's facilities for his 2 day dental practice

here in Eldorado. It is thought that he has found other officing area here in the community, but Dr. Steve Sesson of Ozona will take a 3 month lease to provide a one day dental practice at the hospital.

The hospital board unanimously voted to enter into a contract with Doug Garvin of Eldorado to keep the Schleicher County Medical Center grounds in order. The first two months he will be paid \$575 per month and from that time forward, \$470 per month beginning March 1st running through October 31st. His duties include keeping of the grounds and other horticultural needs pertaining to the hospitals property.

Twenty-four city fires were extinguished in 1982. Total man hours turned in by the fire department in both city and county fires was 1182.

Bob's Bucks

Thirty-five million dollars in local sales tax payments were returned to 974 Texas cities this month, according to Bob Bullock, state comptroller.

Bullock said that the payments are running 4.5 percent behind last year.

Houston received \$7 million, the largest check compared to the \$10.3 million last March. This was a decrease of 31.5 percent. Dallas' check of \$4.2 million was down 19 percent from last March.

City sales taxes are collected along with state sales taxes by merchants and rebated monthly to the cities in which they are collected by the comptroller.

Eldorado received a check of \$5,903.15. This was down 27.77 percent over last March's check of \$9463. Big Lake received \$13,479, Mertzon \$2910, Menard \$2216, and Sonora received \$10,500.

Six Honored At Press Conference

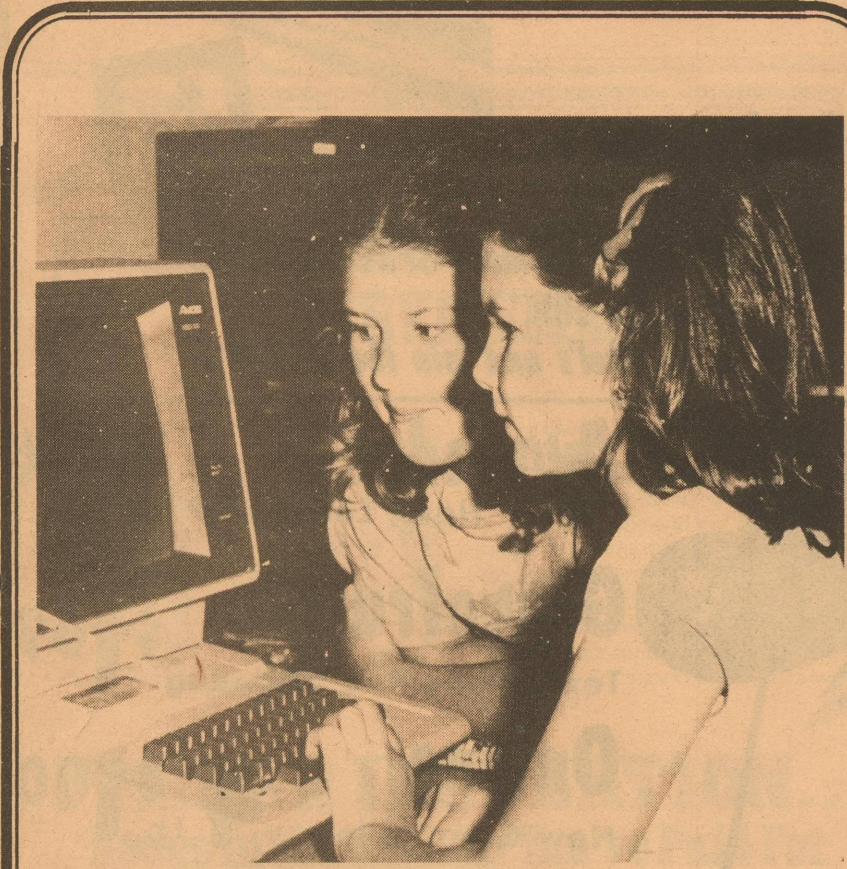

The "Apple" as it is called, draws attention to 21 gifted math students. These superior students come from the grades of 3 - 7.

Lois Dean, director of the program, says the program will help these kids in the near future since many of the jobs are now in the computer field. "Hopefully it's challenging them and computers are the

thing of the future. If they continue this program in high school, they should be able to get a job in the computer field," adds Mrs. Dean.

These dedicated, young students learn basic commands such as listing tasks for the computer and computer programming. The Apple also has another side to it and that's the fun part, playing games. The games which are played generally familiarize the students with numbers, and strengthen their learning.

championship by defeating another Sanderson player 6-1, 6-3.

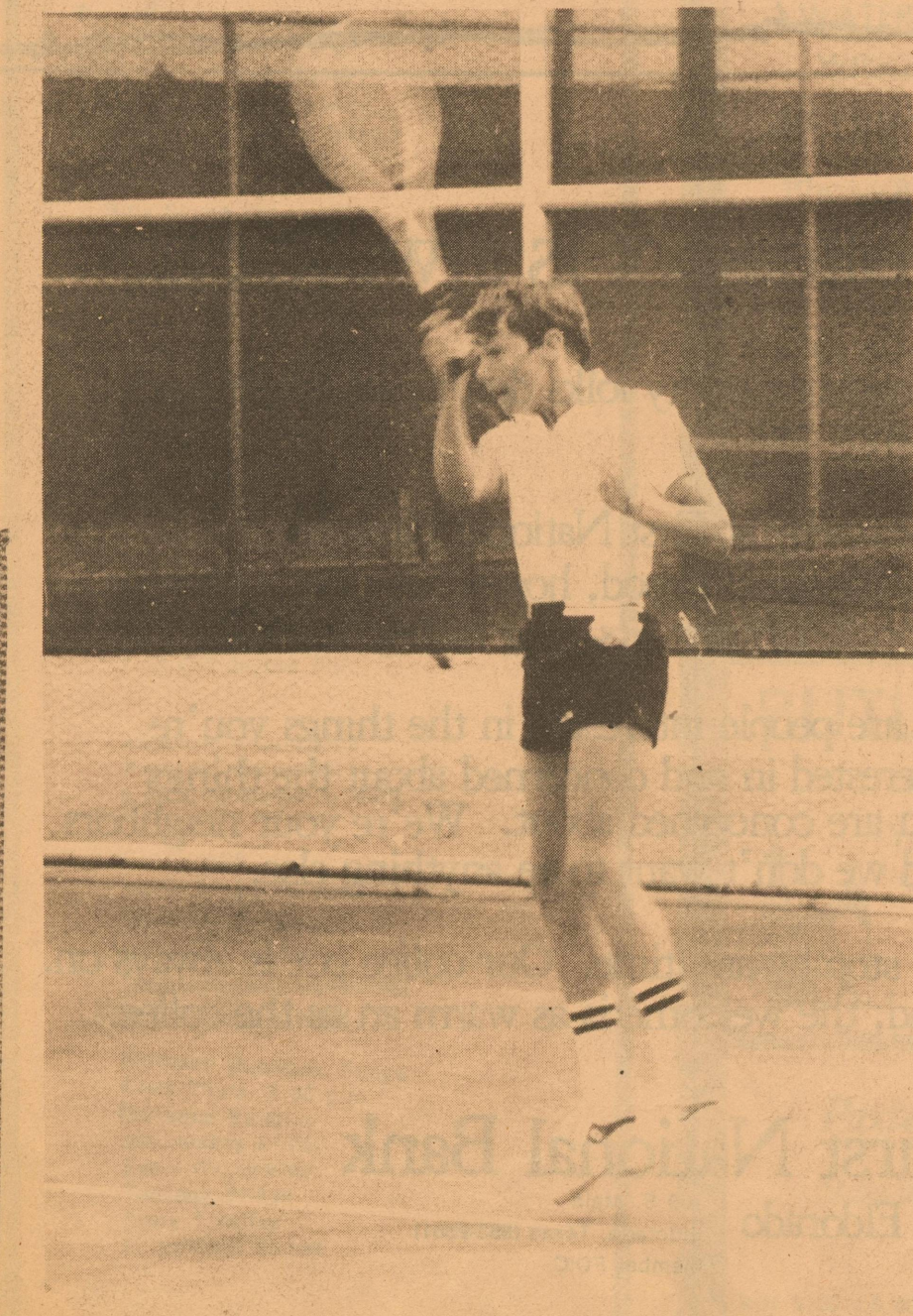
