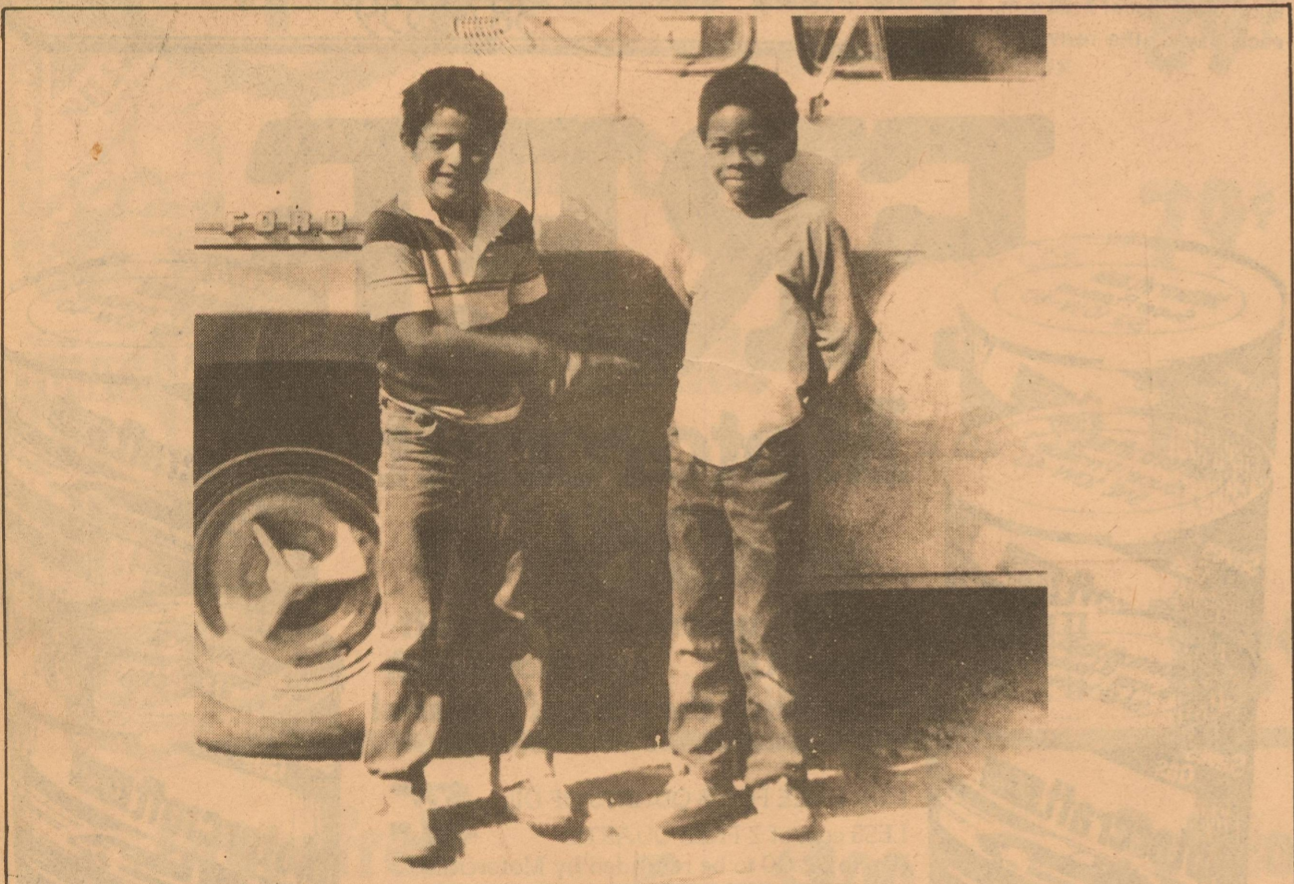
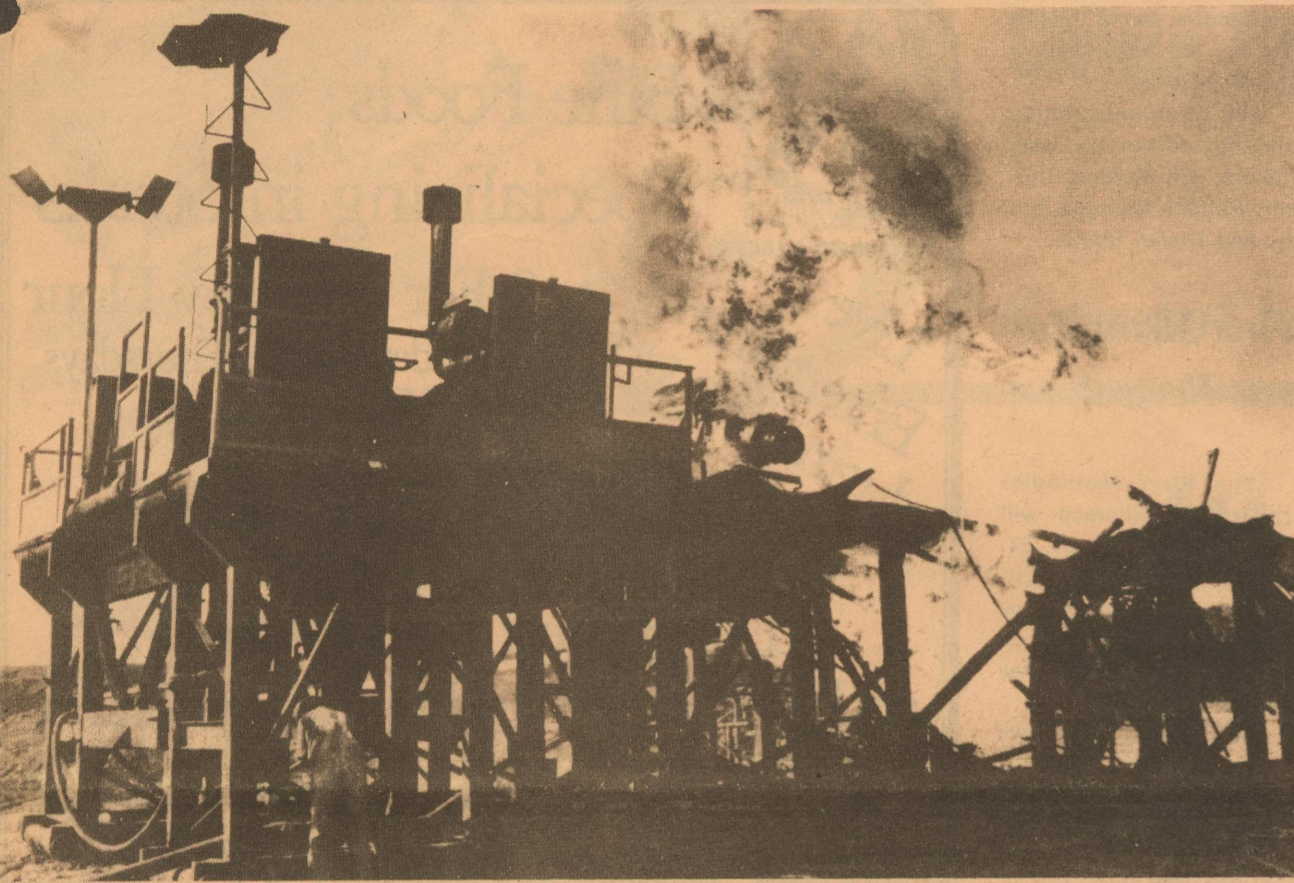

Hospital Board draws largest voter turnout

The Hospital Board election voting site turned out to be more popular than any other polling place in last Saturday's April 2 elections.

Two hundred and sixty five voters along with 56 absentees elected William Edmiston, Penny Bland and Pan White as new members on the Hospital board. Edmiston led all candidates with 217 votes. Mrs. Bland had 144, Mrs. White 143, Julie Griffin 115, Jimmy Belk 105, Barbara Nichols 100, Carmilla Reidy 78 and Bill Hodges had 42 votes.

The School Board election drew the next largest turnout when 254 pollers and 55 absentees voted incumbent Lynn Meador and John Nikolauk into office. Meador drew 272 votes while Nikolauk had 222 and Cliff Schooley, Jr. had 92. Billy Williams had one write in vote.

Three incumbents were re-elected Saturday in the City Council election. Bob Lester was re-elected as Mayor when he drew 197 votes. Four citizens drew one write-in vote each. Bob Bradley, Bob Sykes, Johnny Griffin and Bobbie Sanders were all nomi-

ated for mayor. Wayne McGinnes and Ronnie Sauer were re-elected as they won 136 and 124 votes respectively. Barbara Jackson had 95, Walt Bosmans, Jr. 52, Bill Hodges 29 and Dennis Lampman received 17 votes. Richard Preston, II. received one write-in vote.

Howard Derrick, running unopposed, had 65 votes to earn another berth on the Water Board. Derrick was the Precinct 2 candidate. Steve Sykes of Precinct 3 had 32 votes to gain another term on the Board.

Brucellosis dangerous

According to County Extension Agent, Jerry Swift, many Schleicher County ranchers have failed to get their heifers vaccinated for brucellosis.

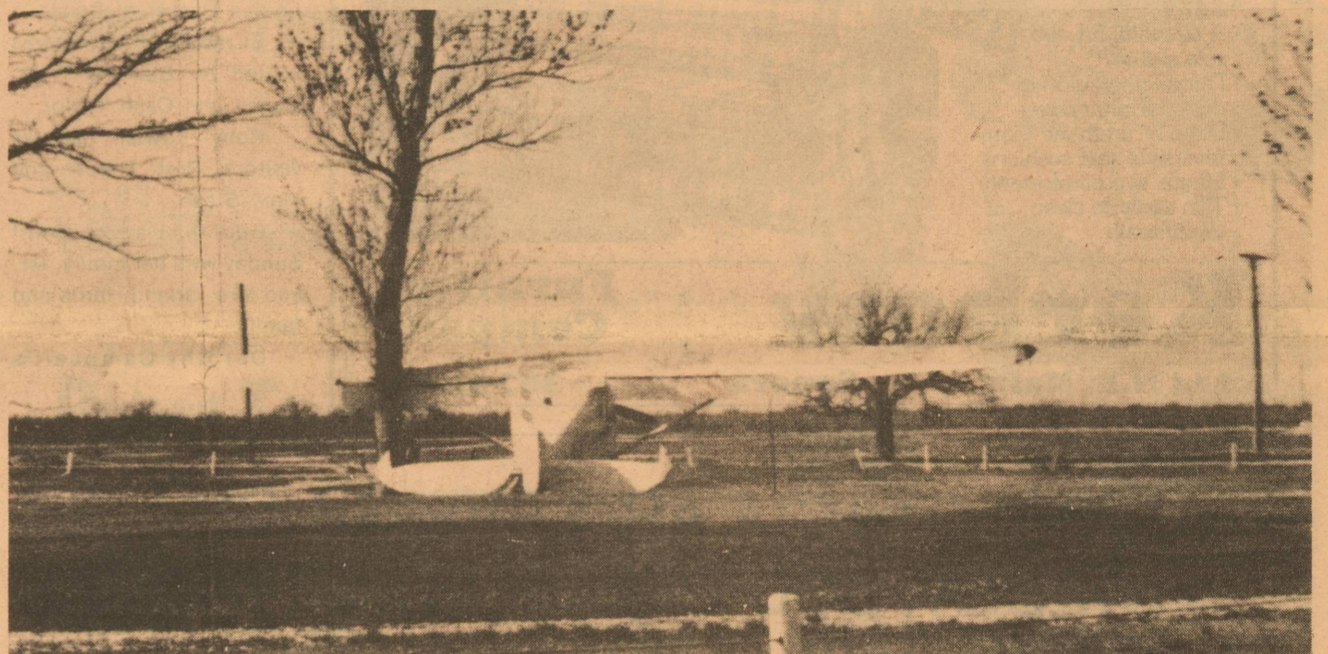
With approximately 20,000 cows in Schleicher County, that would produce about 10,000 heifers annually. Of this estimated count, only 651 heifers have been vaccinated.

There is no charge for vaccination

and ranchers are urged to have their heifers vaccinated.

Within the class B area, a movement upon change of ownership requires vaccination for all females born after January 1, 1983.

Also, movement into the class B area requires vaccination after July 1, 1983 to all cattle four months of age and older. They must be officially vaccinated prior to entry.

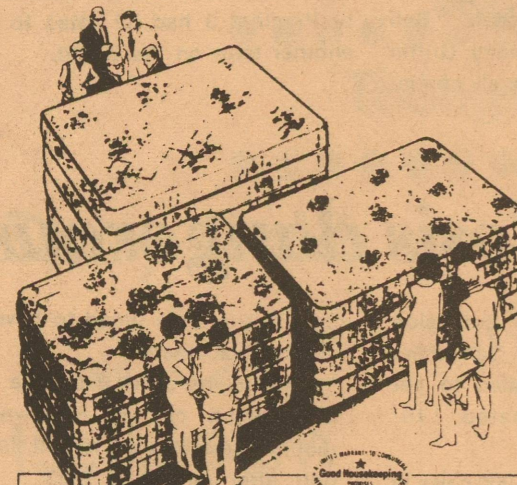

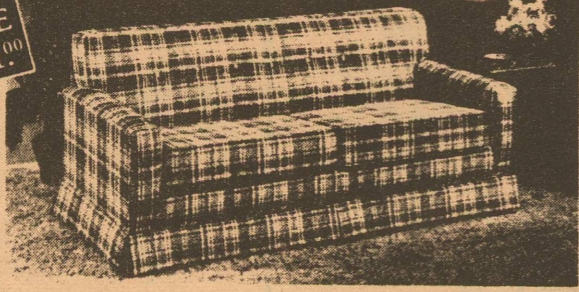

Evangelist Carl Westbrook of Victoria will be preaching and music director will be Johnny Ray Watson of Weatherford.

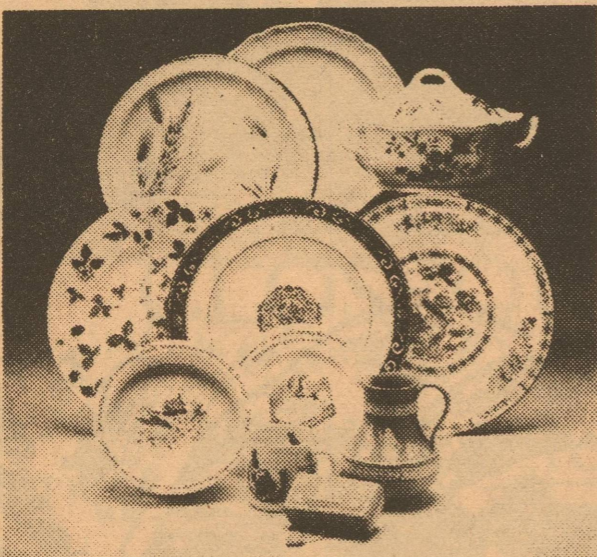

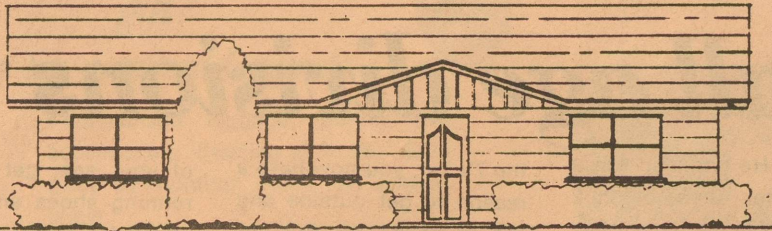

Eldorado Track and Field Classic open to all age divisions
