

Schleicher picked as proposed primary site for Pave Paws

Proposed to select is the key word in a letter from the Department of Air Force to Representative Tom Loeffler when the announcement was made April 22nd that Schleicher County had been selected as the primary site location for Southwest Pave Paws.

The estimated \$100 million radar installation is projected to be located on the Jess Blaylock ranch to the north of Eldorado. Barring any negative responses that should arise in a town meeting to be held May 10th in San Angelo and another to be held May 11th in Eldorado, the site will

officially be selected by the Department of Air Force.

The five story structure will be located on a 60 acre unit and will be comprised of a maintenance area, office spaces and a cafeteria. The construction itself will be in the hands of the primary contractor Raythens and is anticipated to utilize approximately 300 people in 3 shifts per 24 hour period. About 240 military personnel will be attached and between 50 to 60 civil service employees will also assist in operating the Pave Paws. Lt. Chris Gissel,

attached to Col. Powell's office stated that the project should take approximately 1½ years in construction and that it was budgeted for the 1984 calendar year.

The Schleicher County location was selected as the proposed site over the alternate at Christoval because there were no negative public viewpoints as were found in Christoval. In an environmental assessment performed by the Air Force it was learned that the radio radiation frequency levels to which people can be exposed are well below the level considered

safe for humans. No evidence of threatened or endangered species are identified in the immediate area of the proposed site. A positive minor economic boost to the region is expected with the construction and operation of

the Southwest Pave Paws and as a result of the minor anticipated impact in all environmental factors a finding of no significant impact is concluded.

Any interested citizens are urged to attend the May 10th meeting at

7:00 p.m. in the Memorial Building should they have any questions concerning the proposed site of the Southwest Pave Paws.

County opens lots of sealed bids

Opening sealed bids consumed the majority of County Commissioners' time Monday. A total of ten bids were presented to the Schleicher County Commissioners on their last meeting of the month of April.

Four services were purchased by the Court, three of which pertained to the new fire hall. D.D. Griffin was awarded the contract for the concrete work around the sidewalk and the drive, which involved a combination sidewalk apron around the building itself. The winning one bid came in at \$10,170.00. Two other bids were cast for the contract, one by Albert Luma, Jr. of Sonora at \$10,016.00, the other bid made by Deryl Griffin came in at \$11,493.00.

One bid was received for the setting of the septic tank and installation of the lateral lines and filler valve. Griffin Services were awarded the contract for the 1,000 gallon septic tank at a turn key price of \$2,271.00 Griffin Services was also the only bidder for setting and installing two electric gas pumps and the gas tanks. This bid was awarded for \$3,590. Two bids were cast for the work on the west sidewalk of the

courthouse. The winning bid made by D.D. Griffin came in at \$1560 and the second bid was presented at \$3,242.

The bids for the county's used equipment are as follows: 1976 dumptruck with wrecked bed went for \$638 to Fred Spinks, the other bidder was Griffin Oil who bid \$300 for the truck and \$50 for the bed. The next bid was rejected by the court and only one bidder made an offer, the 1975 International dump truck saw a rejected bid by Griffin Oil for \$1800, and the only bidder for the track loader was Griffin Oil who received the bid for \$5800 from the county court. Floyd West was awarded the bid for the motor grader at \$4,251. Griffin Oil's bid of \$2,100 was rejected. No bids were received on the 1980 4-door Oldsmobile and the county clerk, Helen Bebee was instructed to re-advertise the automobile for an additional 2 weeks.

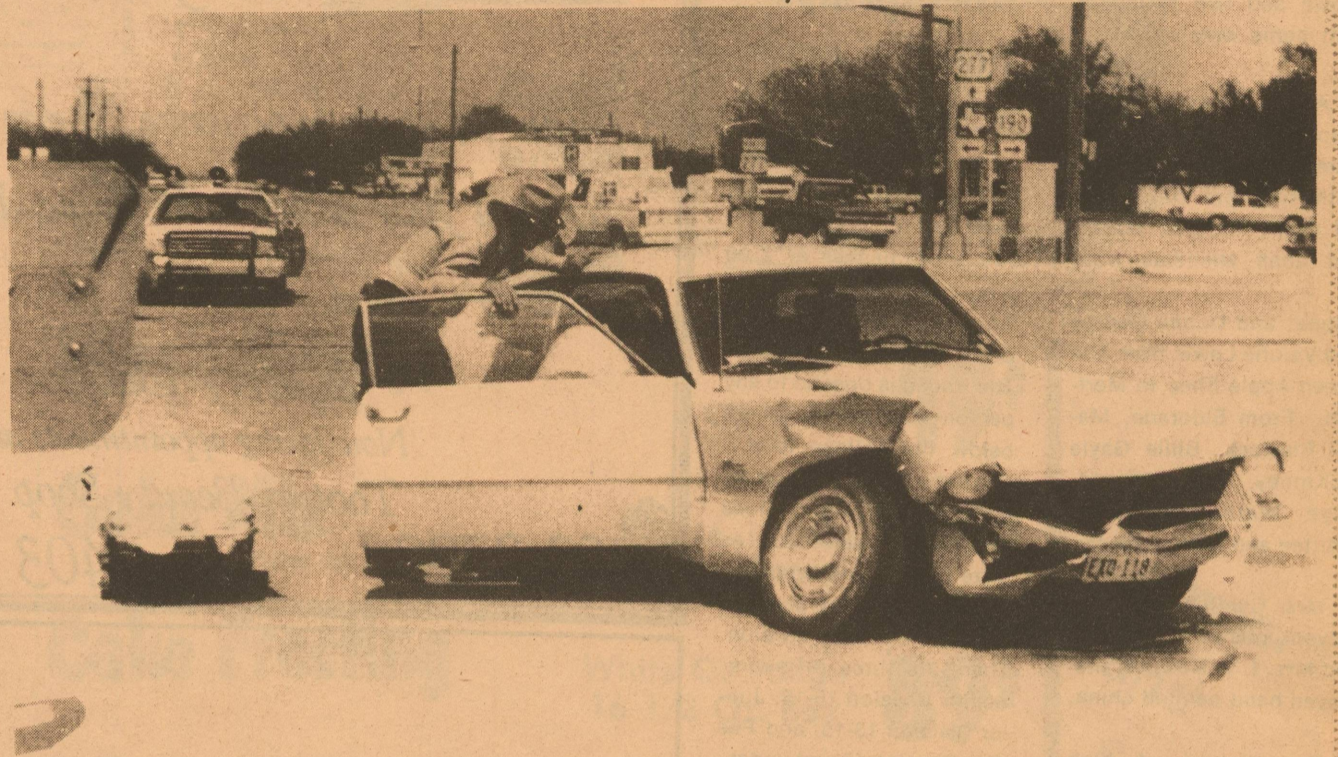
Three representatives from the Schleicher County Independent School District attended the county bosses' morning meeting, they were, board president, Lynn Meador; board member, Ronnie Mittel; and school superintendent, Guy Whitaker. The

entourage presented the commissioners with an outline of administrative guidelines pertaining to the Schleicher County Exhibit Hall which was funded by a co-op program between the court and the district. All the guidelines with the exception of one pertaining to the regulations of the building met with the court's approval. They requested that the wording be changed to reflect that the school did not have first priority above the 4-H and agricultural oriented programs, but equal priority.

Between the opening of the bids and entertaining guests the county court paid it's monthly bills and approved their current health insurance contract with Blue Cross and Blue Shield. The commissioners also voted to pay their hourly employees all regularly scheduled holidays that are acknowledged by the county court.

Also Walter Donaldson was awarded the one and only bid for the base radio located in the courthouse. The equipment was sold to Donaldson for \$21.21.

The county court adjourned shortly after lunch.

City fathers O.K. Sewer Bonds issuance Tuesday

Tuesday night found the Eldorado City Council in a special called session. One of the primary reasons the council met was to entertain a proposal made by Larry Skiles a representative of Rauscher, Pierce, Refsnes, Inc. of San Antonio over the purchasing of the \$650,000 sewer bonds. After a lengthy discussion, the Council unanimously voted to approve Skiles' proposal. His offer contained a 9.865 rate of interest with a total gross interest cost of \$828,165. Bringing the total cost of the sewer bonds to near \$1½ million. Skiles told the City Council that they had achieved a B-AA rating and that with their existing debt service which matures in 1992, his proposal and rate of interest would insure fast sale of the bonds through his firm.

The city's new debt service will begin in 1984 and will remain in the 6

digit range until 1999. Interest payments will take place beginning next year with principle service beginning in 1988.

The city officials also entertained two WTU representatives who informed the councilmen of two new WTU proposals concerning city lighting and a street light referred to as "high pressure sodium", which has a more effective light at a lesser fuel consumption ratio in comparison with the incandescent type. The council took no action on either proposal but did okay a city survey to be performed by WTU and that some of the new lights should be erected particularly in the Glendale Addition.

The City Council next amended a utility ordinance which increased the amounts of water and gas deposits; it also pertains to the use of PVC pipe in relationship to gas meters.

In other city business the council voted to adopt an ordinance clarifying it's definition of what a chartered city is, they also unanimously voted to make Wayne McGinnes Mayor Pro Tem for the coming year. Authorized signatures were vouchered for the block grant purposes and the city heard it's secretary, Carolyn Mayo present a report on her findings concerning the city's garbage service. She informed the councilmen that she had contacted several garbage collecting equipment distributors and that they were willing to meet with the council. Next the discussion moved into delinquent accounts and their possible collection. The final discussion of the evening was presented by councilman Ronnie Sauer and councilman Rooster Jackson, it concerned the installation and stability of the city's gas meters. With the conclusion of this discussion, the meeting adjourned.

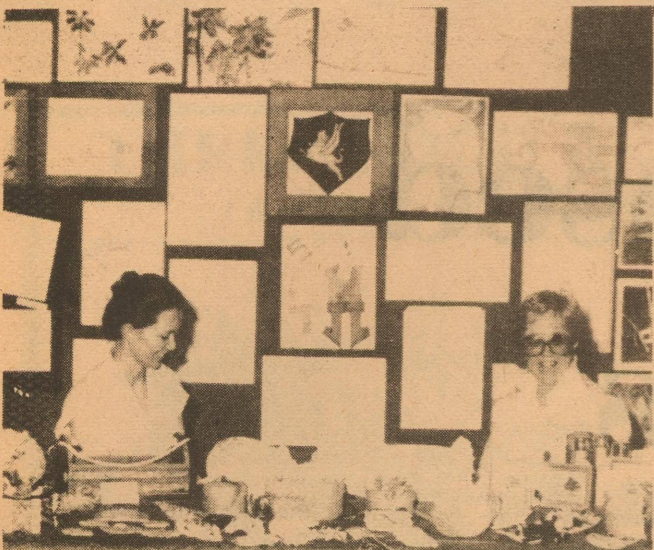



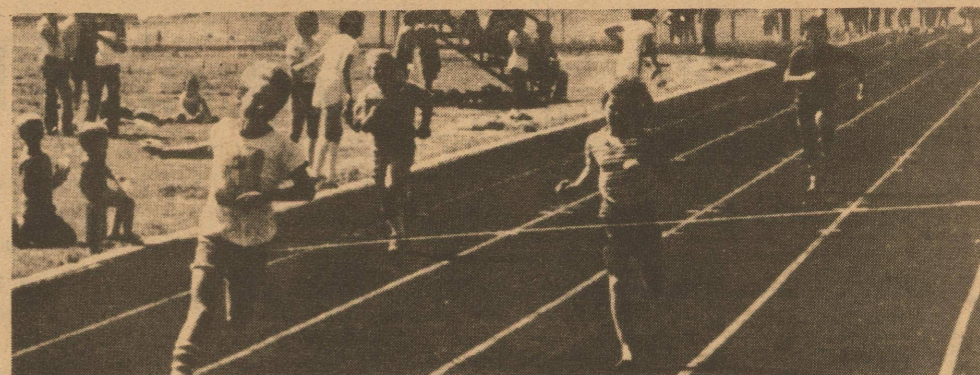
Sixth place went to Huichapa in the same event and two JV Eldorado track-
