Dick Bearce had the honor of ringing the old Eldorado School bell for the annual Mias Amigas celebration this past week-end.

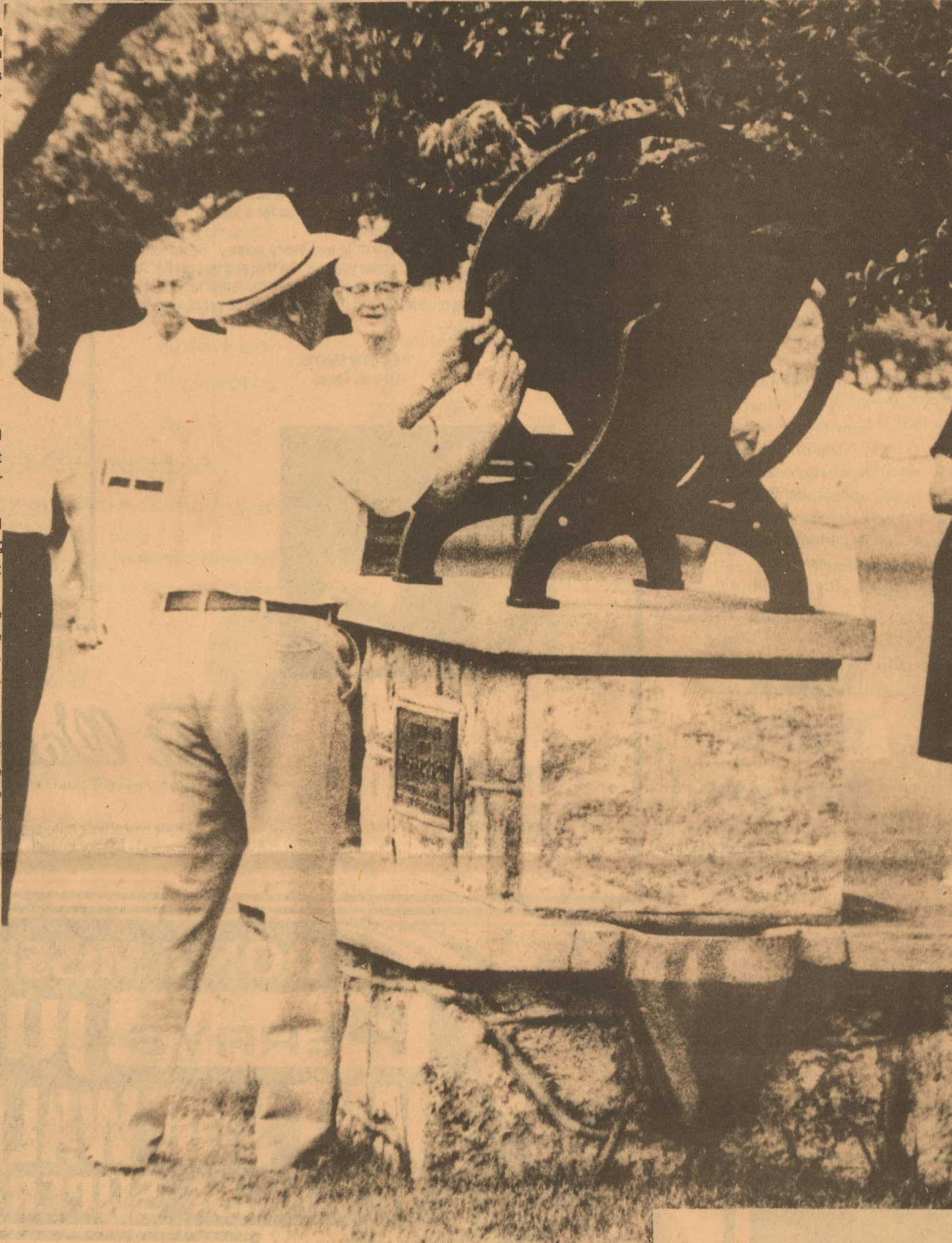

# More history on City Manager

The commission form of government inaugurated at Galveston, Texas in the period of 1901 to 1903 and perfected in Des Moines and Cedar Rapids, Iowa, in 1908, presented evidence of a new willingness to discard traditional, or received, forms of government in favor of a more focused, rational and businesslike system. The commission form, with its emphasis upon the policy-making role of the commission and the unique administrative roles of each of the commissioners, was the first instrument of municipal governmental reform widely adopted.

By the beginning of the third decade of the century, as many as 500

municipalities were commission form cities. The nonpartisan ballot and the popular governance devices of the initiative, referendum, and recall became associated with the commission form and reinforced that form's break from the older tradition of urban government with its reliance upon partisan political parties to provide popular linkage and channels of influence.

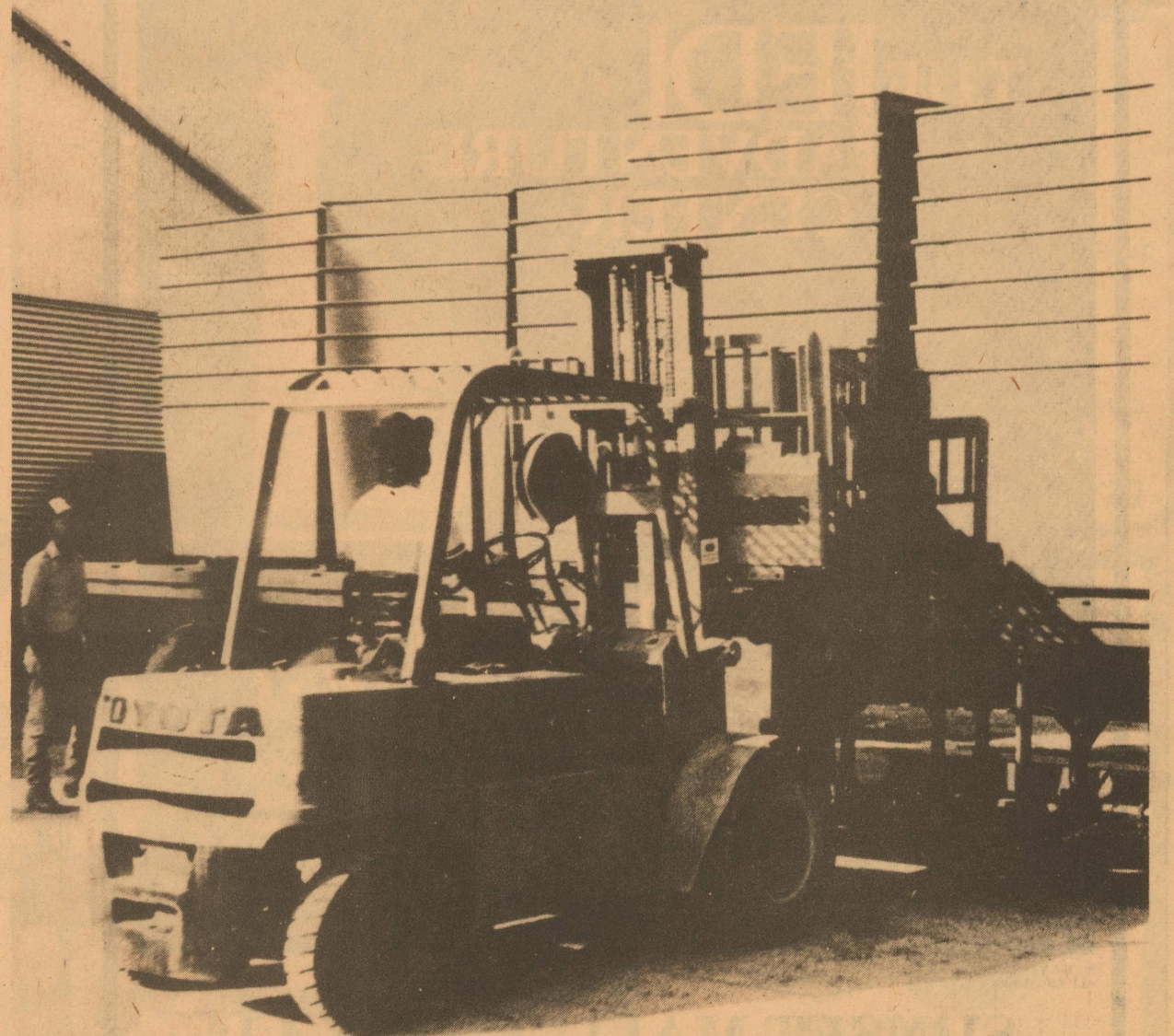
The National Short Ballot Organization, of which Richard S. Childs was secretary, was an important organizational arm of the Progressive movement in this country from the time of its founding in 1909 until its demise in 1920. The object of this organization was to break the power of political machines by electing only a limited number of offices, essentially those of the governing body, and by providing an electoral process that permitted only self-selected candidates acting as individuals and not collectively as slates to stand for office. The intention was not only to

break the power of the party, but also to build a career service in municipal government by removing administrative personnel both from active election and from partisan participation in the electoral process.

The business corporation and the corporate ways of doing business provided a major intellectual model for those advocating the implementation of the council-manager plan and most specifically the analogue of the corporate or general manager. The model presumed a corporate board that set policy and a general manager who implemented that policy.

The manager was appointed by the board and was responsible to it. His methods were business methods and his techniques were those appropriate to the commercial or manufacturing enterprises engaged in by the corporation.

The general manager was the major element jacking in the commission form of government, and its introduction in the Lockport Plan completed the package which was to become the council-manager plan.

Mark S. Wallis of Eldorado, junior biochemistry major, has earned "Distinguished Student" status at Texas A&M University.

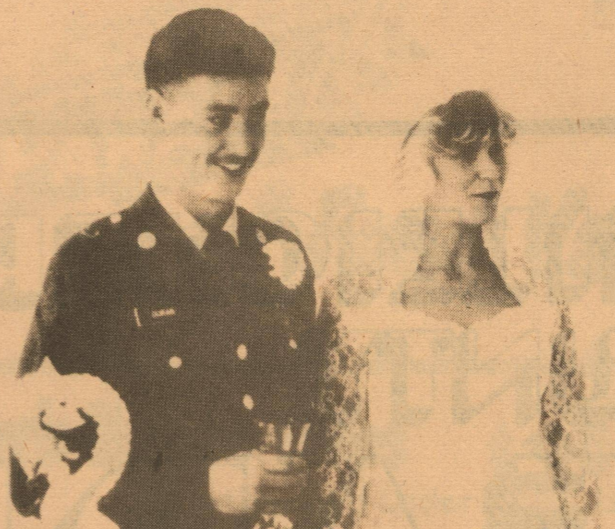

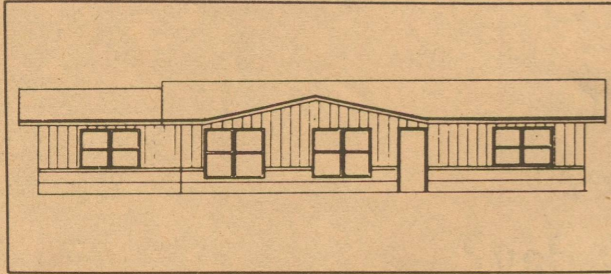

## Public Notice

Southwestern Bell, in accordance with the rules of the Public Utility Commission of Texas, hereby gives notice of the company's intent to implement a new schedule of telephone rates in Texas, effective August 1, 1983, unless otherwise determined by the Commission.

A complete copy of the new rate schedule is on file with the Texas Public Utility Commission (PUC) at Austin, Texas, and with each affected municipality served by Southwestern Bell, and is available for inspection in each of the company's public business offices in Texas. The Commission staff has contended in the past that all rates are subject to change as a result of Southwestern Bell's rate application.

As a result of the settlement of a lawsuit brought by the U.S. Department of Justice against AT&T, Southwestern Bell, on January 1, 1984, (or as otherwise ordered by the United States District Court) will no longer be a part of the Bell System, but will be owned by public shareholders. Under the terms of the settlement, Southwestern Bell has identified 15 areas in the state within which it may provide service, and the federal court with jurisdiction of the settlement has tentatively approved these areas, called LATAs (Local Access and Transport Area). On or about January 1, 1984, Southwestern Bell can not provide service between these LATAs, and in addition, must transfer to AT&T customer premises equipment that it leases to customers.

Southwestern Bell has filed a proposed revised rate schedule with the PUC reflecting these changes. These rates would become effective August 1, 1983, if they are not suspended by the PUC; however, it is expected that they will be suspended and that the rates ultimately set by the PUC will become effective on or about January 1, 1984. If the rates were to become effective as filed, they would produce a 48.2% increase in Southwestern Bell's unadjusted test year revenues (or a 76.36% increase in Southwestern Bell's test year revenues adjusted to reflect the effect of Southwestern Bell's divestiture from AT&T). Any change in the rates for any interLATA services offered by AT&T or a subsidiary after January 1, 1984, could affect customers of Southwestern Bell Telephone Company.

### Notice to Customers of Other Telephone Companies

While Southwestern Bell has proposed no increase in rates for intraLATA interexchange toll services, any change in those rates could also affect customers of other telephone companies. Southwestern Bell is proposing changes in the structure of the present private line and foreign exchange services. Changes in these rates may affect customers of other telephone companies. Any change in the rates for any interLATA services offered by AT&T or a subsidiary after January 1, 1984, could affect customers of other telephone companies.

Bajo las condiciones de dicho arreglo, Southwestern Bell ha identificado 15 regiones dentro del Estado de Texas en las cuales puede proporcionar servicio, y el tribunal federal con jurisdicción en el arreglo ha dado su aprobación provisoria a éstas regiones, que se denominan "LATAs" (Local Access and Transport Area, ó Regiones Locales de Acceso y Transporte).
