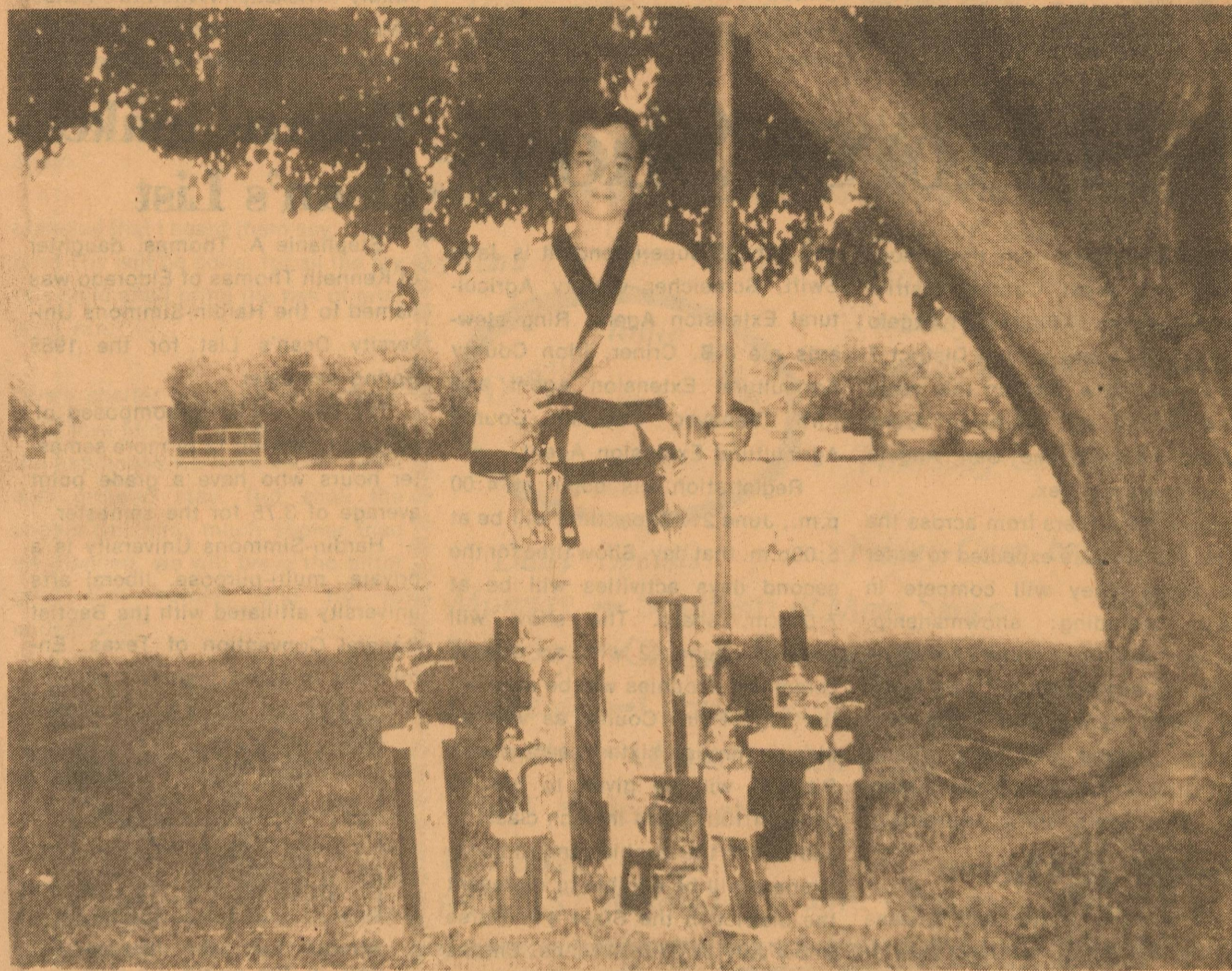
Vickie Hooten of Eldorado placed 4th in the Jr. Barrel Race and third in the Jr. Stake Race.

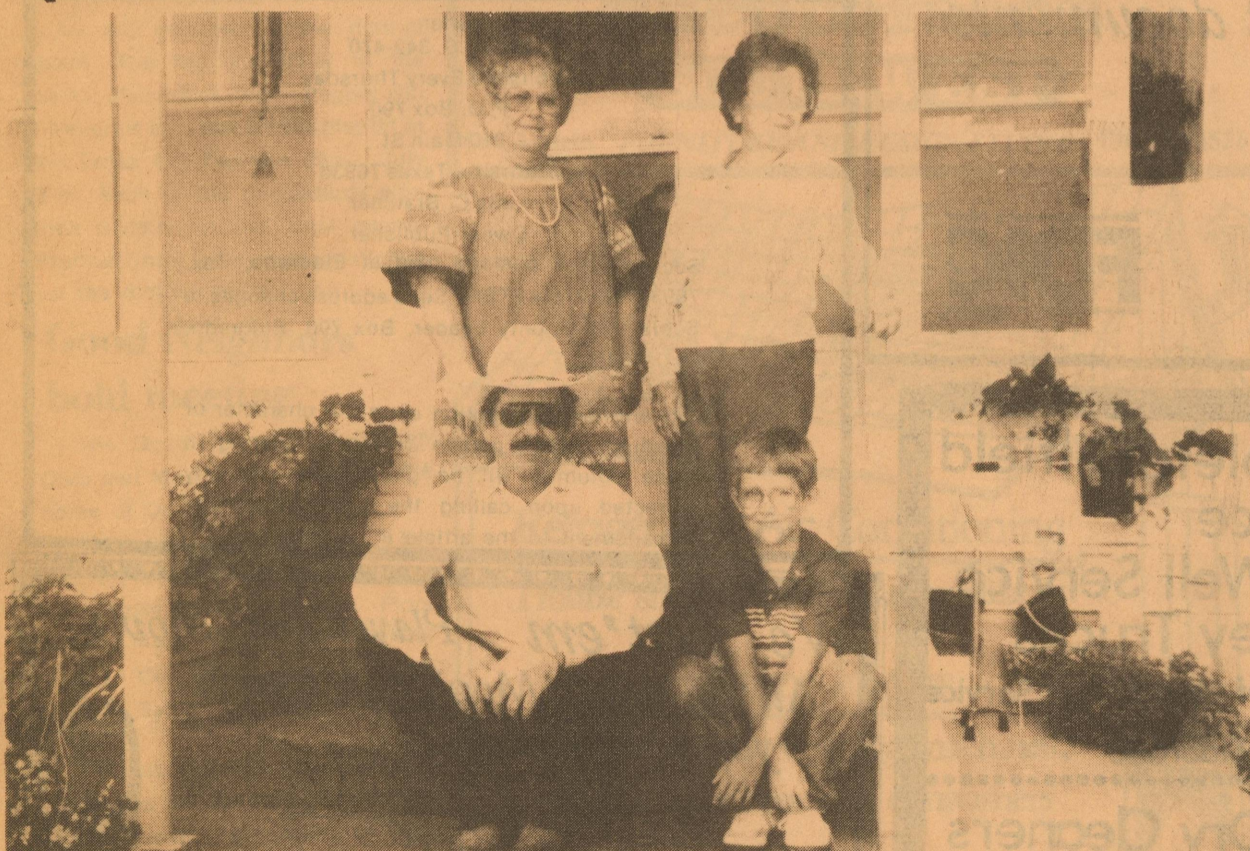
Although Cole is very young, he knows that Karate is a form of self-defense and is not to be used frivolously.

Expo activities will officially begin, Thursday, July 11, at 8:00 a.m. with steer and heifer check-in for the All-American Show totaling \$18,000 in premiums. At 3:30 p.m., state junior association teams will have the opportunity to prove their skills in the National Hereford Quiz Bowl preliminary competition.

The American Hereford Auxiliary will hold a membership meeting at the motel headquarters, the Holiday Inn, San Angelo, Texas, at 5:00 p.m.

The second day's events will kick-off with the National Showmanship Contest. A representative from each state will compete for the title of "National Champion Showman" and more than \$1,000 in cash and awards. Also slated for the morning program is a live animal evaluation contest open to all youth and adults in individual and team competition.

Expo participants will be guests of Rocking Chair Ranch for a social and 6:30 p.m. banquet at the ranch. During the banquet, two outstanding members of the AJHA will be presented with \$500 John Wayne Memorial Scholarships by the American Hereford Auxiliary. A dance will follow a special Texas Futurity Heifer Sale and A.I. Certificate Auction.

Saturday, July 13, will be devoted to the \$15,000 All-American Hereford Heifer and Steer Show.

Pitts Elected President of TIPRO

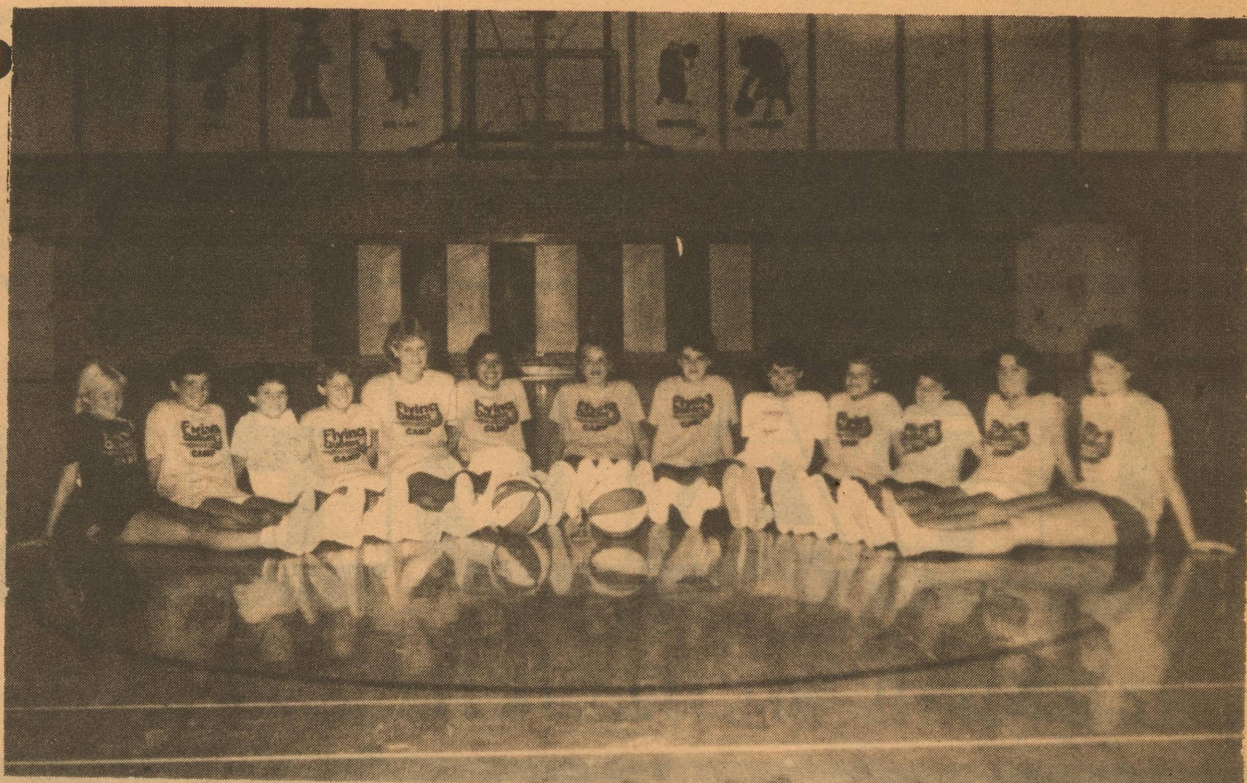

I fancied that I heard them say, "Dear Lord Thy will be done, for all the joy this child shall bring the risk of grief we'll run."

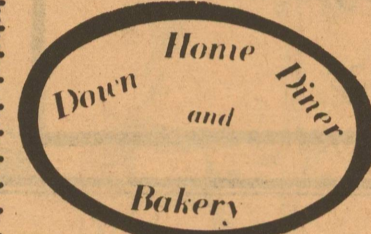

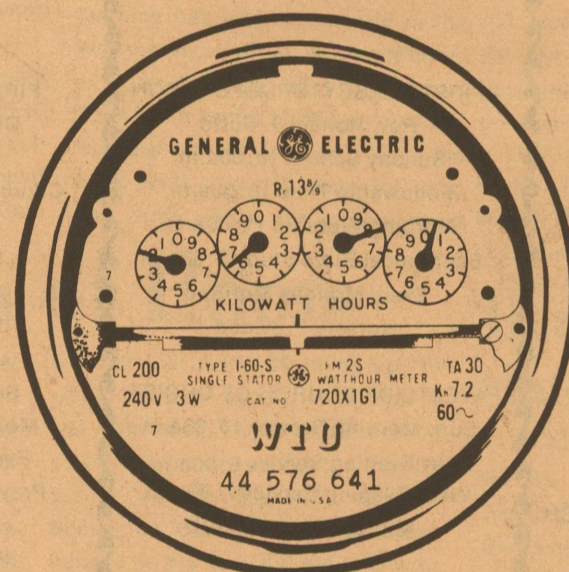

Said Plaintiff's First Amended Original Petition was filed in said court, on the 17th day of June A.D. 1985, in this cause, numbered 1877 on the docket of said court, and styled, Elodia Huichapa Plaintiff, vs. Felipe Huichapa Respondent.

The names of the parties to the cause are as follows: Elodia Huichapa is Plaintiff and Felipe Huichapa is Respondent. A brief statement of the nature of this suit is as follows, to wit: DIVORCE as is more fully shown by Plaintiff's Petition on file in this suit. If this citation is not served within ninety days after the date of its issuance, it shall be returned unserved.

The officer executing this process shall promptly execute the same according to law, and make due return as the law directs.

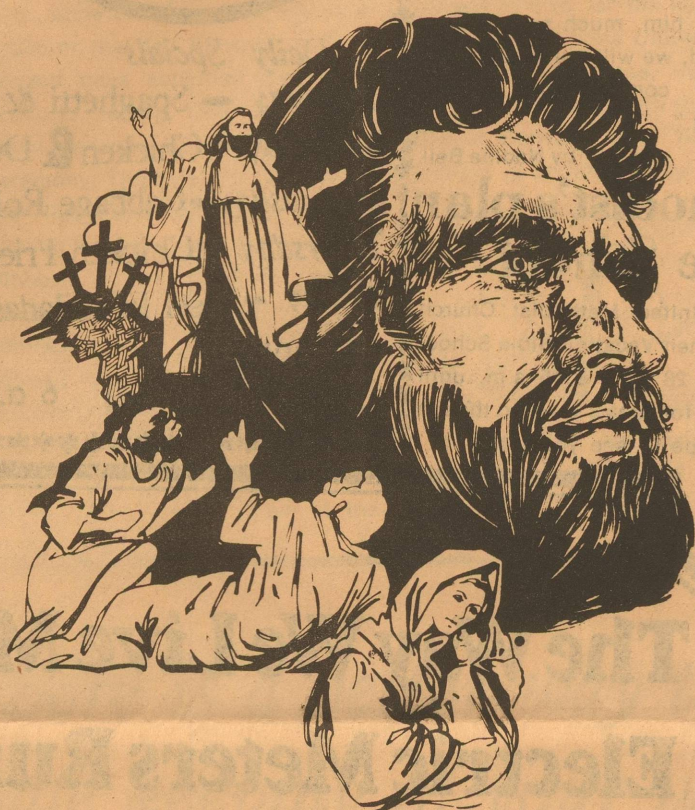
