Perennial broomweed is poisonous to cattle, sheep, goats, and swine. The most common problem with this plant is abortion in cattle. Up to 60 percent of a herd may abort, delivering dead or small, weak calves. Animals often retain the afterbirth and secondary infection causes some deaths.

Heaviest losses occur when

alternate, and thread-like

broomweed leaves grow rapidly, on sandy soils, and when large amounts (20 pounds or more) are consumed by cattle. Poisoning will occasionally occur on tight soils. The most common danger period is late winter and early spring, but rapid leaf growth may occur in danger periods, cattle should be moved to pastures with tight soils or ones that are broomweed-free. Poisoned cows should be fed in pens until they recover, and those with retained afterbirths should be treated by a veterinarian. Weak calves that survive should be kept in the shade and helped to nurse

Some success in spraying plants has been reported. Spraying must be done under optimum growth and moisture conditions and it appears that two successive years of treatment may be necessary to get good


