Six Eldorado football players were selected for the first All-District Team and four other Eagles were selected for the second All-District Team honor.

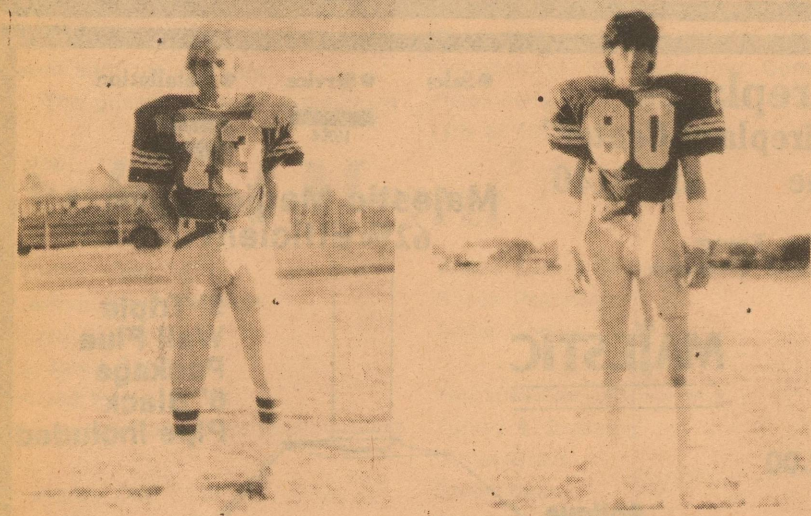
Sonny Dean received All-District First Team Defensive Lineman as

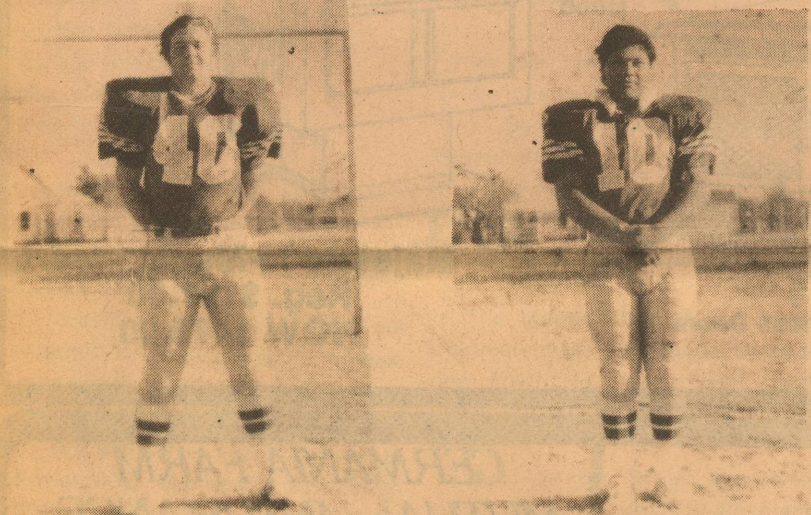

Five of the All-District notables are juniors this year. This is just another indicator of how strong the Eldorado football program will be next year.



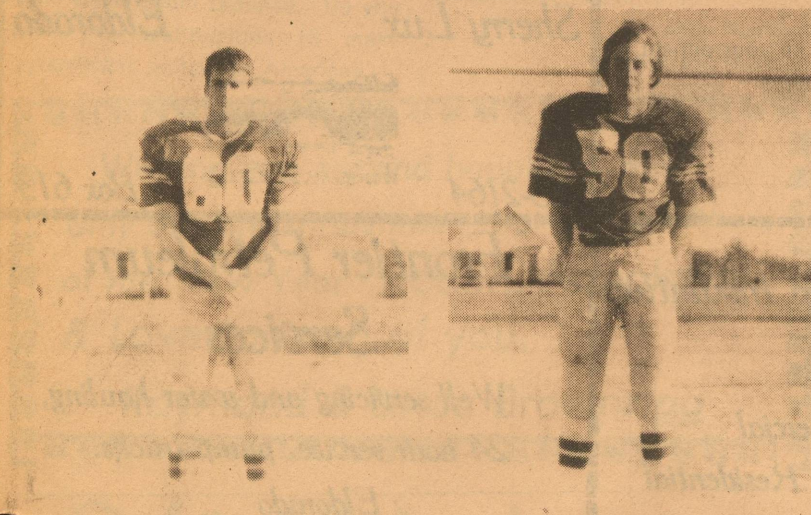

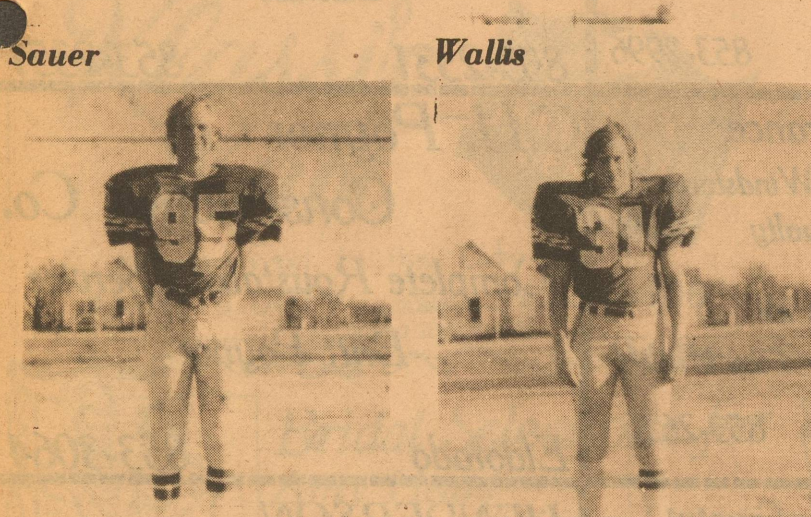

New loop to be Completed in two years

The State Department of Highways and Public Transportation (DHT) will open contract bids on December 11, 1984 for the new Christoval project on U.S. 277 according to San Angelo's District Engineer D. R. Watson. The 7.0 mile project will run 5.5 miles north to 1.3 miles south of Christoval. The new highway will generally follow the old railroad right of way west of town.

According to Joe W. Lane, Supervising Resident Engineer in charge of construction for the DHT, the completion will take approximately two years at an estimated

cost of 5.25 million dollars. Construction will not begin until January 1985 and will be done in sequences to provide the least amount of disruption to area travelers.

The Right of Way acquisition was completed about one year ago.

"When completed, the highway will boast two 12 ft. travel lanes and a 10 foot paved shoulder on each side," said Joe Lane.

The new project's purpose is to hopefully ease the curves in the Christoval area, and to construct a new bridge across the south Concho River.





Watch for broomweed

Perennial broomweed is a many branched heraceous plant that branches at the top of the ground.

The numerous branches terminate in heads that contain extremely small yellow flowers. Leaves are small,

alternate, and thread-like.

Perennial broomweed is poisonous to cattle, sheep, goats, and swine. The most common problem with this plant is abortion in cattle. Up to 60 percent of a herd may abort, delivering dead or small, weak calves. Animals often retain the afterbirth and secondary infection causes, some deaths.

Heaviest losses occur when broomweed leaves grow rapidly, on sandy soils, and when large amounts (20 pounds or more) are consumed by cattle. Poisoning will occasionally occur on tight soils. The most common danger period is late winter and early spring, but rapid leaf growth may occur in October and November. During danger periods, cattle should be moved to pastures with tight soils or ones that are broomweed-free. Poisoned cows should be fed in pens until they recover, and those with retained afterbirths should be treated by a veterinarian. Weak calves that survive should be kept in the shade and helped to nurse properly.

Some success in spraying plants has been reported. Spraying must be done under optimum growth and moisture conditions and it appears that two successive years of treatment may be necessary to get good control.
