 Chairman Ed Cox, Jr., of Dallas announced recently that the LocalPark Fund has addressed the quality Park Fund has addressed the quality of life issues envisioned by legislalive leaders when it was enacted in
1979. Cox stated: "The Parks and
Wild life Department has allocated $\$ 57$ million to 60 local governments for some 108 local park projects. Additional parkland, swimming pools, tennis courts, children's playgrounds, little league fields,
junior soccer fields, picnic facilities, junior soccer fields, picnic facilities,
and campsites are and campsites are only a few of the the Local Park Fund,"
"Funded by a one cent tax on each pack of cigarettes, the Local Park Fund has benefitted both small
communities and large cities and three state parks have been acquired in EI Paso. Tarrant, Harris and Montgomery counties," noted the Commission Chairman.
With state government currently facing a fiscal crisis, some consid-
eration may be given to eration may be given to abolishing the Local Park Fund or dedicating
fund revenues to other purposes.
