Wheat Crop fair

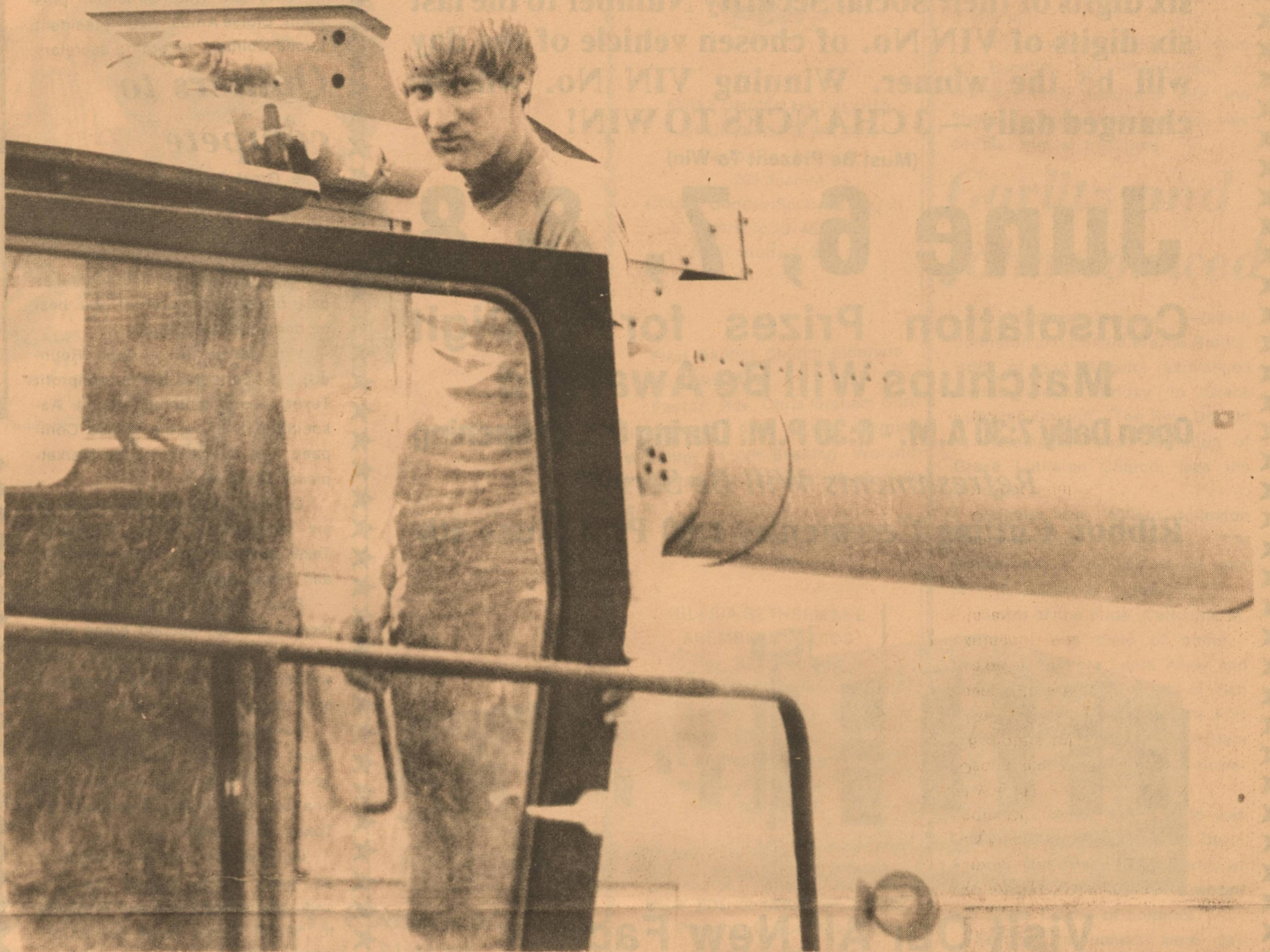
One of Schleicher County's secondary but yet essential, cash crops is well into being harvested now. Dave Jones said Wednesday, that the company he is employed with has cut about 3,000 acres of wheat during the last few days in Schleicher County.

Estimations of the number of acreage planted in the county boundaries go as high as 6000 acres, 3,600 of which are recorded under the government programs.

Jones, a member of the Dave Dosdall Combine Company of Cyrus, Minnesota have been in the county for just under a week with their four combine crews having started this year's wheat harvest run in Eden. The combine crew seems to be making good time considering they have to move their equipment

from field to field while dodging recent thundershowers but with the 30 ft. swath cut by the 8820 John Deeres the stubble falls behind pretty fast.

This year the county seems to have a little bit better crop than last year by averaging between 20 and 22 bushels per acre. The Schleicher County Co-op Gin and Elevator has recorded as low as 12 bushels per acre yield and as high as 27 bushels per acre. The moisture content they record ranges between 8.9 and 12% and with the price of number one wheat selling on a cash market at \$2.85 this year's crop could be worth as much as \$340,000. That is, barring we don't have a widespread hail storm, driving rain or high winds before the harvest is complete.

The 1985 West Texas Masters Track Meet will be held on July 13 at the Ozona Lions Stadium in Ozona, Texas.

Combination works for Social Security

The Social Security programs are characterized by a combination of stability and flexibility, Franklin H. Upp, Social Security manager in San Angelo said recently.

"Since the Social Security Act became law on August 14, 1935, its basic principles have remained unchanged," Upp said. "However, the law has been amended on several occasions to meet society's changing needs. The ability to adapt as the times require is the best guarantee that Social Security will

be as relevant to the decade of the 1980's and beyond as it was to the postwar years of the 1940's and every decade since."

In terms of history, 50 years is a relatively brief period of time, Upp said. But, the past half century has seen Social Security established as the cash benefits program in which virtually all Americans have a stake.

Kristin Lamb served as flower girl, and Mathew Bramlett was ring bearer.

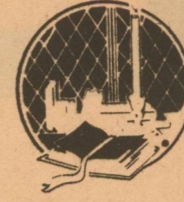
