## Trustees set bond price for new niddle school <br> make scheduling of rooms virtually


#### Abstract

Schieicher County Board of Trustees of the School District unanimously voted to present before the voters a $\$ 2,365,000$ issue with election date set for Saturday the 18 th of May.

The primary thrust of the bond new Middle School comprised of fourteen classrooms, an administration, library, science lab, resource room, multi-purpose area, rest rooms for student body as well as a teachers lounge, a computer center, and special education areas The building is in a $L$ shape configuration and consumes 22,000 square feet.
