coholice wo the misdemeanor with a possible fine of $\$ 25$ to $\$ 200$ It is also a crime for the underage person to pesent false identification or to misrepresent present false identification or to misrepresen beverages, or to successfully make such purchase even without misrepresenting his age. In either case, the first offense fine is the same as for possession. Giving alcohol to a minor carries a fine of $\$ 100$ to $\$ 500$.
