## Absentee <br> Extended Absentee Voting Period <br> For April 10 Runoffs

The extended absentee bal-
loting period opened Monday, April 2, for those registered to vote in the Tuesday, April 10
runoffs, Texas Secretary of State George Bayoud said.
Registered voters will have until Friday, April 6, to appear at county courthouses and poll-
ing places across Texas to cast ing places across Texas to cast absentee ballots in the April 10
Democratic and Republican party Democratic and Republican party
primary runoff elections, said Primary runoff elections, said
Bayoud, the state's chief elections officer. The deadline to register to vote in the runoffs was March 11.
"If you have made up your mind who you are going to vote for, consider taking advantage of the extended voting period," Bayoud said. "It's real convenient
and you can avoid the lines on and you can avoid the lines on
election day". ${ }^{2}$

Under a 1987 state law that relaxed absentec balloting re-
quirements, registered voters quirements, registered voters
need not give a specific reason for casting in-person, absentee ballots during the extended period, Bayoud explained. In the March 1.3 primaries, about 15

## Taxpayers' Information Pamphlet Available From Appraisal Office

Ray Ballew, chief appraiser for the Schleicher County Appraisal District, offers area property owners a pamphlet called "Taxpayers' Rights, Remedies, Responsibilities" to help them save on their property taxes.
Published in both Engli
Published in both English and Spanish by the State Pro-
perty Tax Board in Austin perty Tax Board in Austin, the perty tax system in Texas oper\$ ates and offers suggestions for possible tax savings. Ballew noted that the pamphlet applies to property taxes collected by all types of taxing units: counties, cities, school districts and special districts (such as municipal utility, junior college, and hospital dis tricts).

Homeowners may qualify for various property tax exemp. $i^{\text {tion }}$

said. In Texas, a homestead is generally the house and yard sed as the owner's principal residence. The pamphlet lists and explains cach exemption and how to apply for them. For example, all school district homeoowners are eligible fo stead excmption. In addition tain disabled homeowners and those aged 65 or older may ify for an additional $\$ 10,000$ school exemption for the value or their homesteads. "A school tax freeze, or ceiling, on the residence home stead is a benefit for a home owner who was 65 or older on January 1 of this year," Ballew said.

In other words, the home owner's school taxes cannot in crease above the amount assessed in the year the homeowner first receives the over-65 homestead exemption. This tax ceiling stays in effect as long as the elderly homeowner owns the homestead ment or addition to the house such as a pool or patio," Ballew continued.

New legislation presides additional tax bencfit for certain homeowners. If the surviving homeowners. If the surviving spouse of an over-65 homeowner is at least 55 at the time of the older spouse's death, then he or she can retain the tax ceiling. Before this new legislation took effect, the younger surviving spouse would have lost the tax ceiling.

The chief appraiser pointed out, though, that over-65 homeowners do not need to reapply

Homeowners are also eli gible for a $\$ 3,000$ general home stead exemption if the county roads or flood control.

Ballew added that any taxing unit may offer a local oxing unit may offer a local allows a percentage of each residence homestead's appraised value to be exempt. In 1990, a taxing unit may exempt up to 20 percent of each qualified homestead's appraised value.

The pamphlet also describe her exemptions available, suc as those for disabled veterans, other disabled persons, and enior citizens.

ceiving $1-d-1$ appraisal do not need to reapply, unless the chief appraiser requests in writing that they do so.

Because the qualifications are less restrictive, many landowners choose to apply for 1-d 1. However, if the land's use is changed to a nonagricultural one, the period for recapturing lost taxes is longer than for $1-\mathrm{d}$ ap-
praisal. praisal.
"Appraisal district personnel can offer more information about special land appraisal, tax renditions, and excmptions," Ballew said. The information is also found in the "Taxpayers' Rights, Remedies, Responsibilities" pam-
phlet. He said the pamphlet also He said the pamphlet also must be filed by May 31 ,
contains information about preparing and presenting a protest on the appraisal review board (ARB). The ARB is an appointed body that examines appraisal records and hears protests 10 ensure that property values are fair and uniform.

Another section deals with the procedures voters must follow to petition for an clection to limit the amount of tax increas adopted by any taxing unit.

## Cattle, Ranch Thefts Were Multi-Million Dollar Problem In 1989


#### Abstract

The theft of livestock and ranch equipment in 1989 cost Texas and Oklahoma cattlemen according to Texas and South according to Texas and South western Cattle Raisers Associa tion, a Fort Worth-based producer group that has fought the problem for more than a century. In an annual report given to its members, TSCRA Secre-tary-General Manager Don King said in 1989 the associa tion's 32 field inspectors, all certified peace officers with special Ranger commissions, de- veloped 103 theft cases, primarily veloped 103 theft cases, primarily involving cattle thefts. Working closely with state and local law enforcement officers, the inspec tors recovered or accounted for 4,478 head of cattle and horses, 23 trailers, 216 saddles and miscellaneous ranch property valued $\$ 9,841.68$ per day trongly the emphasize too brand inspection in Texas played in resolving many of these cattlerelated cases and the eventual recovery of these valuable animals for their owners," King said.

The cattle raisers group also employs approximately 82 brand inspectors who identify five to six million head of cattle at the time of their sale each year. They re- port their findings to the group's
