## Payment For Social Security Representation

Persons dealing with the Social Security Administration (SSA) do not have to be represented by an attorney or
anyone else; however, some people feel more comfortable if they are represented.

The representative may be an attorney or any other qualified person and may be entitled to a fee even if the claim is denied; however, any fee cahrged must be approved by
SSA. Even a contract between SSA. Even a contract between
the claimant and his or her the claimant and his or her
representative for payment of a specified fee is not binding. Any fee due the representative is usually paid from money due the claimant when a claim is approved. If this amount is insuffieient to cover the fee, the claimant is responsible for paying the
balance. balance.
