coryneum blight commonly damage leaves and sometimes the fruit of stone fruit trees in the spring and summer. Physical with small holes; in severe cases, trees are defoliated.

Spraying now will not eliminate the disease hut will reduce its incidence next spring and summer.

Another common disease is leaf curl, which causes extremely crinkled leaves in the spring. Leaf curl is caused by a fungus that quits once temperatures begin to get warmer.

Fall Spraying Aids Fruit Trees
Preparation for next ear's fruit crop can begin this fruit tree diseases.

Bacterial spot, bacterial canker, peach leaf curl and coryneum blight are ciseases that can be slowed by spraying now. Exten Dr. John A. Lipe, Extension Service horticulturist at Fredericksburg, says that
bacterial canker is the most serious of the targeted diseases It is a common cause of tre dieback and death.

Canker also cause bleeding or gumming along th trunk and branches. In eight ou 10 cases, fruit tree of 10 cases, fruit tree gumming is caused by canker rather than
borers, which are often mistakenly blamed for the problem.

Canker gumming is caused by a systemic bacteria tha plugs the tree's vascular system. The only thing that will help trees seriously infected with canker is good care: adequate ater, fertilizer and weed control. Bacterial spot and

fruit trees or other prune fruit trees or other
deciduous plants. Pruning stress, deciduous plants. Pruning stress,
especially when coupled with especially when coupled with
other stresses including drought, oor nutrition and disease, can make the tree more vulnerable to winter injury.

Lipe reported that soil moisture levels across much of the Hill Country are adequate to carry fruit trees and vines as they enter dormancy. The roots of deciduous trees, vines and shrubs are active throughout the fall and winter, and the soil should never be allowed to dry.

Due to the polygamous mating behavior of the males, this allows for $90 \%$ of the male population to be harvested each season as a surplus to breeding needs and their removal will have no direct effect on the annual increase. One male to every 15 females is normal.

Habitat improvement and population increases may represent two views of many people. For some, the opportunity to see habitat improvement and abundant wildlife is rewarding. Others may benefit from the enjoyment of recreational hunting as well as income generated by paying sportsmen.
