The Abilene Newspaper headlined the article "Downtown Rebound." This article featured as its subject the career of the Manager for the Abilene Downtown Business Association - Julie Caddel.

Miss Caddel is the speaker for the first meeting of the Marketing Committee for Eldorado and Schleicher County set for Monday, April 15 at 7:30 p.m. in the Memorial Building. Economic development, management and marketing techniques to strengthen the economy of Eldorado will be discussed. Short-term and long-

term goals will be established as well the formation of officers of the committee.

One of the suggested short-term goals, which would have an impact on the large number of cars passing through Eldorado, is the establishment of welcoming signs approaching the city. Simple, basic marketing tools are to be discussed which have been effectively and successfully used in other communities.

It is time Eldorado considers the alternatives to supporting their community. If we do not act positively today, the future of our town can only

be one of stalemata with no growth and not even sustaining the business community we now have. Without young families moving into Schleicher County, our tax base will continue to grow smaller, yet we will still have the same county and community out lay of expenses to maintain.

Come to this important meeting and visit with and listen to our speaker, Julie Caddel. Miss Caddel has ten years of experience in downtown revitalization and community development. She graduated from the University of Texas with honors and received her masters degree from Texas A&M University. Miss Caddel conducted the first Urban Main Street Project in Wichita Falls. She established five action working committees which produced special events, provided design assistance, and compiled a thorough data base for business recruitment efforts.

Miss Caddel served as the Director of the Downtown Revitalization Committee of Galveston where she implemented public improvements through the tax increment financing district. She facilitated a \$500,000 street improvement project and developed incentive programs for lighting and sidewalk renovation.

Today, Miss Caddel, as manager of Downtown Business Association of Abilene, works with local groups to maximize the benefits of downtown facilities like the Paramount Theatre and the Grace Cultural Center. She recently coordinated the Abilene Railroad Festival which attracted 12,000 people to downtown Abilene.

Miss Caddel serves on the board of the Paramount Theatre and the Texas Downtown Association.

Elementary Participates In "Book It!" Program

Eldorado Elementary recently participated in the BOOK IT! program sponsored by Pizza Hut.

BOOK IT! is a reading incentive program for students in grades K through six. It motivates children to read more by rewarding them for their

reading accomplishment. It also helps pre-readers develop a positive, enthusiastic attitude toward learning to read.

The program on October 1, 1991 and ran through February 28, 1992. At the outset of the program, the teacher sets monthly reading goals for each child in the class. County Agents Report

The Farmers Home Administration is launching a new program to help local farmers obtain credit from local lenders, according to Neal Sox Johnson, FmHA State Director for Texas. Known as the Interest Assistance Program, it provides strong incentives for commercial lenders to make loans to farmers who otherwise could not qualify.

Under the new program, FmHA will pay up to 4 percentage points of interest for farmers to help them qualify for

FmHA guaranteed loans. "If a creditworthy farmer can't cash flow with a guaranteed bank loan at - regular interest rates, we can pay part of that interest for him until he can," Johnson said.

The Percentage of interest FmHA will pay depends on the financial condition of the farmer. FmHA will pay only the number of points necessary to help the farmer cash flow with a small reserve.

An FmHA guaranteed loan is made by a bank, PCA, or other lender with an agreement

from FmHA that if the loan goes bad, FmHA will compensate the lender for up to 90 percent of its loss. "That guarantee plus the new interest assistance," Johnson said, "should greatly increase availability of farm credit through the private sector."

The program, made law in late 1990, was put on a fast track, so as to assist farmers in time for the 1991 planting season," Johnson added.

According to Johnson, the level of interest assistance will be adjusted each year, based

on a review of the borrower's need for continued assistance. In addition, a borrower must be able to project a positive cash flow, including a 10 percent debt-service reserve to qualify for assistance. This is the same rule for guaranteed farm loans not receiving interest assistance.

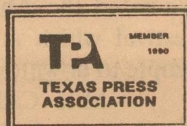

SCISD Board Of Trustees Meet

The regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of Schleicher County Independent School District was held on April 8, 1991, at 6:00 p.m. in the Administration Building.

Ray Ballew reported that eight parcels of property are available to be sold by the local taxing entities. He also indicated that tax collections are progressing well.

Elementary Principal Harold

Steele reported to the board concerning the recent happenings on his campus. Enrollment is presently 322, with 3 students in early childhood, 23 in pre-K, 59 in kindergarten, 67 in 1st, 54 in second, 60 in 3rd, and 56 in 4th grade. Mr. Steele also reported on teaching assignments for next year and then discussed events that have taken place since January and that will take place through the end of school.

School Nurse Awareness Week was observed, all faculty and most aides attended a Learning Styles Workshop. Mr. Steele attended an Effective Schools Conference, and Grades 3 & 4 participated in Bluebonnet Voting in January. During February the fourth grade took a field trip to KIXY Radio Station, volunteers taped many books to be used for improving reading skills, and teachers from St. James Episcopal School in Del Rio visited our district. March events included Open House, the kindergarten play, a trip to Fort McKavett and the Powell Ranch by first grade, the All-American Rodeo by the first grade, and the kindergarten Easter Egg Hunt.

Upcoming events for the month of April include the pizza Hut "Book It" Reading Program for the 1990-91 school year, the 2nd grade puppet shows, 3rd grade hot air balloon and kite project, 3rd grade play, 4th grade variety show, kindergarten spring round-up, and the elementary level UIL contest in Ozona. In May the 4th grade will see a demonstration by W.T.U., and the Shannon Harber Relays are scheduled for May 9th. The Student Awards and Recognition Ceremony is scheduled for May 15th and Kindergarten Graduation will be May 23rd at 1:00 P.M. Also, class picnics will be held during May.

Dr. Blair discussed with the board some possible summer projects involving maintenance and upgrading of school facilities. The projects include such items as installing exhaust fans for the gym, replacing the press box windows, painting various items, replacing thermostats with energy saving models, and constructing a concession stand on tennis court side of the football playing field. Board members voted to approve all summer projects as presented with the omission of an ice maker for the concession stand.

In order to plan for the 1991-92 budget, board members agreed to have a budget workshop on April 16, 1991, at 6:00 P.M.

The financial report and budget amendments for the month of March were approved, and no action was taken on personnel matters.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:26 p.m.

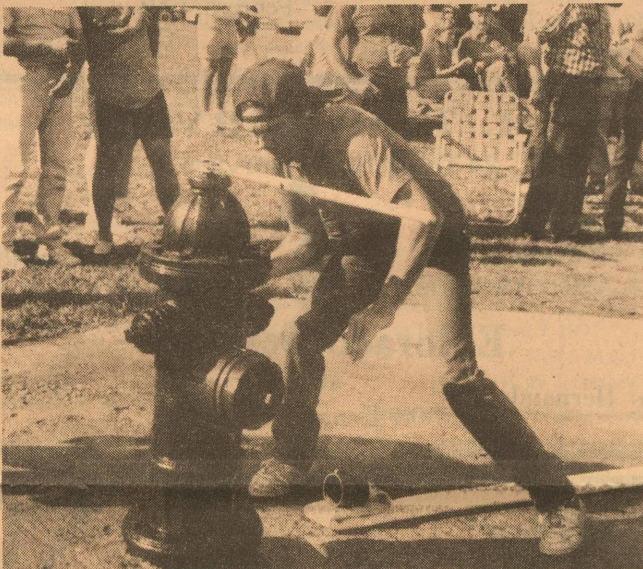
