## Filing Deadline Nears

Wednesday, March 20 is the deadline for
filing for application for a place on the ballot for the May 4 elections. A number of city and county offices are to be filled.

Mayor Richard Preston's term is expiring as is Councilmembers Barbara Jackson and J John Nikolauk.

The terms of Tip Finley and Dobs Lively, School District Trustees, are expiring.

The tenure for Water Commissioners Steve Sykes and Howard Derrick has expired. They are both ineligible to run in this election.

Our hospital, schools, water, and local government are of vital concern to our community.

Local officials are urging citizens of Eldorado and Schleicher County to file for these positions.

Patriotic songs were played by the Eldorado High School Band. The Elementary students sang "God Bless the U.S.A." The Band played the National Anthem as the Color Guard from The Eldorado Air Force Station presented arms. Members of V.F.W. Post 9842 saluted our flag and our returning soldier.

Judge Johnny Griffin proclaimed, "Welcome home Floyd Fay. Today is your day."

Floyd seemed almost speechless as he looked into the faces of his friends and neighbors. "It's nice to be home," he said. The crowd cheered, letting him know that it was good to have him back.

A 1982 Graduate of Eldorado High School, Floyd joined the United States Army in 1986.

Floyd and his wife Mary have three sons, Tony, Jordan, and John. The Fays will be here for about three weeks. Then they will return to Fort Campbell, Kentucky.

Floyd's mother, Helen Fay, spoke for us all when she said, "I'm just happy to have him home safe and sound."

drive vehicles in excess of 26,000 pounds or transport hazardous pounds or transport hazardous vehicle to be placarded are required to have a commercial drivers license (CDL) by April 1 1992. Bus drivers, including school bus and church bus drivers, who drive buses designed to carry 16 or more passengers, including the driver CDL by the same date
Exempt from

Exempt from the CDL equirements are farmers when they are driving within 150 miles of their farm, military personnel, recreational vehicle operators, emergency vehicle operators, and fire fighters when operating fire fighting vehicles or equipment.
