## 2nd Annual E-Day Sweeps City

"E-Day", Eldorado's Second Annual Community Clean-up was well attended with 88 people registering at 900 a.m. Saturday on the Courthouse lawn.

Blessing for the workers was asked by the Reverend Hawley Wolfe, Pastor of the First Presbyterian Church. Mayor John Nikolauk proclaimed the day "Recycle Eldorado," officially launching the recycle program.

Barrels were placed on city property on South Main for aluminum cans, metal cans, clear glass, and colored glass collection. All citizens are urged to sort and save these items at their homes and businesses and bring them to this location. The city will then transport these materials to San Angelo weekly, where they will be forwarded to recyclers. This campaign is designed to reduce the load on our landfill, as well as contribute to a better environment. Mayor Nikolauk and Nancy Lester, Recycle Committee Chairman, appeared on KLST-TV last week publicizing both the

Community Clean-up and the Recycle Program.

Clean-up efforts were visible all day Saturday as both organizations and individuals mowed, hoed, chopped, raked, weed-eated, and painted along Highway 277, Main Street, and other areas. Volunteers from the city and county, farmers, ranchers, and businessmen provided heavy equipment including front-end loaders, back-hoes, dump trucks, flat-bed trailers, stock trailers, pick-up trucks, shredders and mowers. Nancy Lester and her Food Committee did their usual outstanding job of preparing and serving a delicious lunch to all workers, with everything being donated locally.

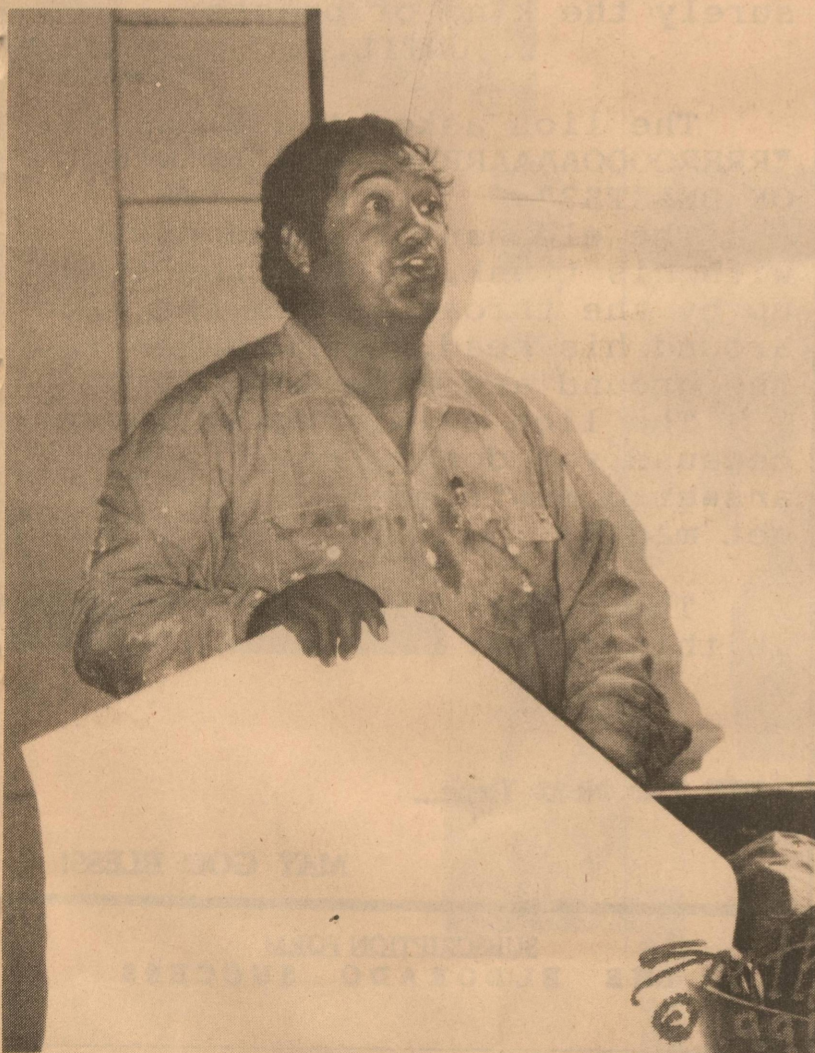

## Re-Districting Hearing Held

Remarked Doug Yates, long time Eagle supporter, "They looked like a team! They really looked like a football team out there tonight."

With 3:12 remaining in the fourth quarter, the Eagles scored on an option play to the left by Cy Griffin to clinch a victory over the Badgers. The PAT was made by Jorge Arispe. This was the first district game for the Eagles and it places their record at 4-0.

"It was an important win for us," said Coach Doug Kuhlmann. "Not only for our confidence as a team, but also to begin the district schedule with positive results."

Defense played well again and had its second shut-out in a row after defeating Irion County 6-0 the week before the McCamey ball game.

The Eagles seem to make the big plays to win their football games during this season. Against McCamey, the Eagles stopped a fake punt. Again, the Eagles made the big play by tackling a McCamey offensive receiver on the 8 yard line with time expiring on the clock to end the game.

The Eagles play Ozona in Eldorado Friday night for Homecoming.

The football players and their parents will be introduced during the pre-game ceremonies, and the homecoming queen will be announced during half-time activities.

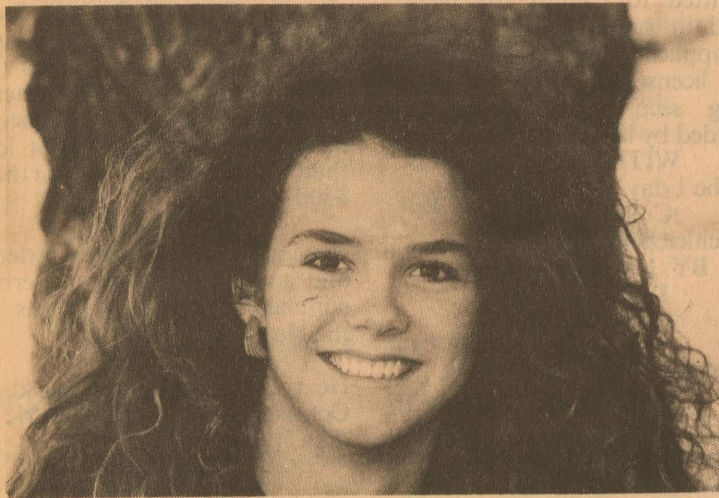
**TRACI PAXTON**

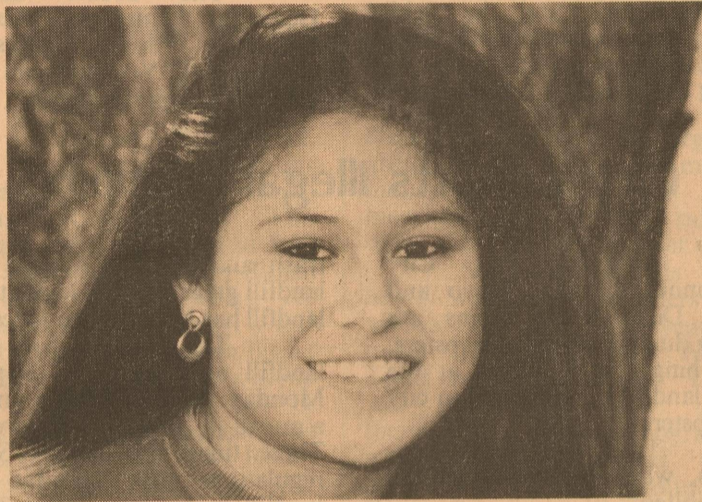
**LUPE ROMO**

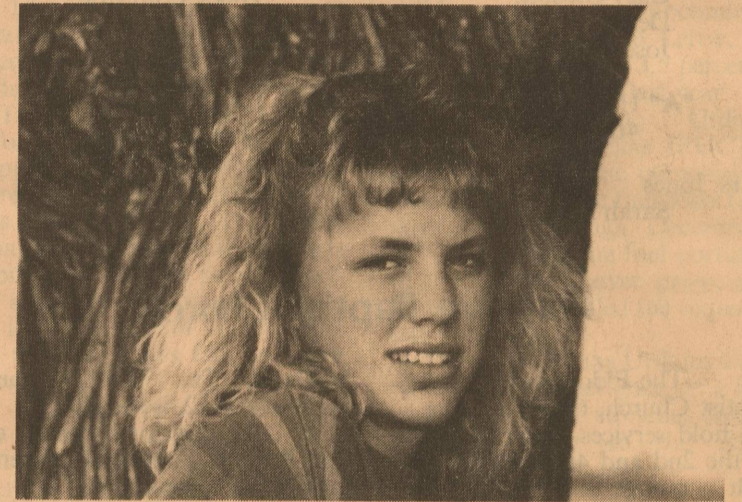
**LINDY HARDY**

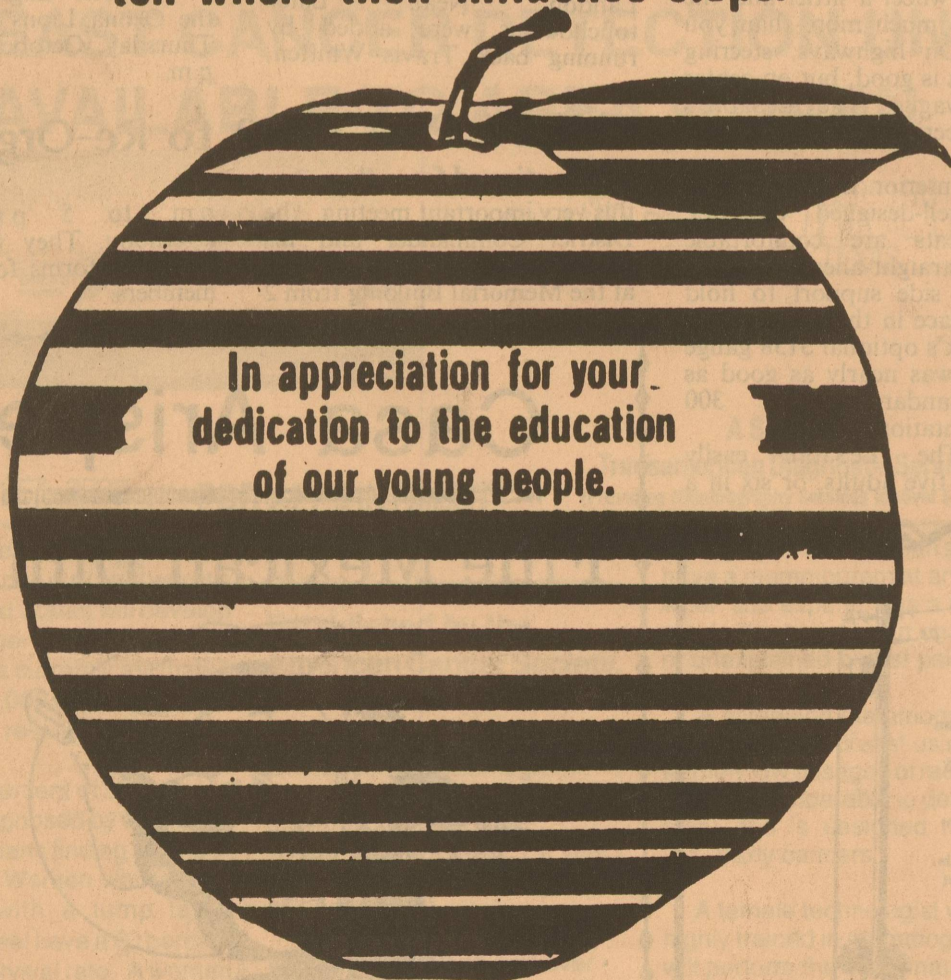
## Brush Management Demonstration

The Eldorado-Divide Soil and Water Conservation District will sponsor a Brush Management Demonstration on Monday, October 7, 1991, 1:30 p.m. at Oran Enochs Ranch on Hwy 277 North. (Approximately 4 1/2 miles north on Hwy 277, turn west at cattleguard, signs will be posted.) Stewart Herring, of Ford Tractor, San Angelo will be on hand to demonstrate the Brush Boss.

The Brush Boss has been tested through Texas A&M University. Studies have found that the Brush Boss has the ability to pull up, roots and all, 55 mesquites/hour and 141 red berry junipers/hour. Average cost would be .10/plant for a 40-HP tractor and 13.4 cents/plant for a 75-HP tractor. Mesquites up to 5 inches basal trunk diameter can be grubbed with a 40 HP tractor.

A&M Extension Service, will be on hand to talk about chemical application on brush control. He will discuss methods, amounts and uses of various chemicals on the market. Anyone interested in brush control is invited to come. In conjunction with the brush management, the Eldorado-Divide Soil & Water Conservation District Zone 3 Director's election will be conducted.
