Although rheumatoid arthritis affects people of all ages, it usually affects older people. A lot of times arthritis runs in families.

Arthritis usually works in a cycle in that it is worse when waking up in the morning and then usually gets better as the morning progresses. Arthritis can interfere with our regular activities or become crippling so we will try anything to feel

One of the treatments used is gold, which is very expensive, and may not be very effective. The power of gold to treat rheumatoid arthritis over long periods apparently is overestimated, according to a report in the Annals of Internal Medicine by researchers with the University of California at San

Francisco and the Kaiser Permanent Medical Center in Oakland. Gold salt injections, a 50 year old remedy prescribed frequently to arthritics, appear to be no more effective at relieving inflammations

associated with arthritis than

A study comparing 142 patients treated with gold salts and 284 patients who received other medications found that those receiving gold salt injections showed little

improvement.

other therapies.

Alternative treatments for rheumatoid arthritis are anti-inflammatory drugs, moist heat, chiropractic adjustments, and therapy. Contact your Medical or Chiropractic Physician for proper care if you think you have arthritis.



Unofficial City Council Minutes


