"Old Main Street Day" Set For Saturday

"Old Main Street Day" is finally here. The fun will begin this Saturday, July 18 at 9:30 when the parade begins. Main Street will be blocked off so cars will not be allowed to park in front of the businesses for the parade or after. Bring your lawn chairs or blankets. The parade will begin at the corner of Louis and Main. If you are riding on a float or car, etc. you will need to be at this intersection by 9:00 a.m. to get lined up for the parade. There will be a \$25.00 cash award for the most original parade entrant. The parade will go down Main street to the court house square. The Pave Paws color guard will raise the flags on the court house lawn to officially start the days' festivities.

The historical buildings along Main street will be open for walking tours as

soon as the parade ends. Local artist, Billy Frank Blaylock will have his "Pioneer Collection" for viewing in the window gallery next to the Playhouse. Also, the silver bowl that the Chamber Pride Committee won for Eldorado in the "Keep Texas Beautiful" competition will be on display in the window gallery. Mr. Bob Bluthardt, Director of Education at Fort Concho, will be in the Museum to speak and answer questions about Fort Concho, Fort McKavitt and other area Forts.

From 10:00 until 12:00 there will be fun rides for children along main street. There will be a 10 cent charge for each ride. There will be a petting zoo set up on the lawn of the court house for the kids to see and pet the animals. Also between 10:00 and 12:00 the old jail will be open for tours by Orville

Edmiston. Lunch will be served for \$4.00 between 11:30 and 1:30 at the pool hall.

The first Variety show theater performance will be held at 11:00. Tickets are \$4.00 for adults and \$2.00 for children 11 and under. Another performance will be held at 3:30. Tickets can be purchased in advance by calling 853-3343. Again, there will be limited seating. Any extra tickets will be sold at the door. Everyone is urged to see one of these spectacular performances. Eldorado has one of the most talented theater groups around the area and this is definitely a must for the day.

At 2:00 p.m., a special recognition ceremony will be held behind the court house

for local volunteer Doug Yates. Doug has spent numerous hours helping plant flowers and taking care of the parks around the City. Doug has helped Eldorado be a "Keep Texas Beautiful Proud Community" for preserving a clean and beautiful environment for the residents and visitors to the City.

To stay beautiful, these garden spots need constant care; water, replanting, weeding, cleaning and some T.L.C. One citizen greatly responsible for this work and a lot of T.L.C. is Doug Yates. Every week Doug spends many hours contributing his labor for the benefit of the public.

Doug not only loves flowers, he is also a great sports enthusiast. He has supported and encouraged three generations of Eldorado school students in basketball, track, tennis and football. My daughters, who played basketball in the '70's remembered his support at every game. They related that if Doug wasn't there the games were not complete!

Several years Doug was elected "Fan of the Year" by the students, and is now a life member of the Booster Club. This enables him to attend all sports events free.

Dozier T. "Doug" Yates was born October 19, 1915 in

Schleicher County on the H. Leslie Jones Ranch near Ft. McKavett. He was the fourth child born to the union of John Wilson and Sophronie Elizabeth Odell Yates. Doug had four brothers, Wendell, J.W., Earl and Harold. He also had three sisters, Lorene (Scott), Vivian (Love) and Melvin (Bulerson).

Doug attended first grade at Ft. McKavett Elementary School. Later he attended several rural schools in Schleicher County; Rudd, Tisdale and Cliff. Blanche Newlin was his teacher at Cliff Rural School. His freshman year he transferred to Eldorado High School.

Doug was Schleicher County's first man to be drafted for selective service in World War II. A grand parade, with the band playing and friends and loved ones cheering, bid him a farewell to arms in 1940.

Saturday, July 18th, during Old Main Street Day, Eldorado will be honoring Doug Yates. A ceremony on the courthouse lawn will be held at 2:00 p.m. Don't miss the chance to say "Thank You" to a faithful volunteer of our community!

TOP OF THE DIVIDE

I received my Vietnam Veterans ball cap in the mail Tuesday. Even after more than twenty years since I was "in country", that war seems to have been one of those defining moments in my life.

I do think that we veterans of that war have let the country define us. The Gulf conflict gave the news media a perfect opportunity

to group all Vietnam Veterans into one homogeneous group. At least to me, the press made it sound as if the soldiers of the sixties were not made of the same metal as those of the desert. Not so!

Many Vietnam soldiers were drafted, but that made them no less professional and surely no less interested in saving their own lives and

those of their comrades. I think I would go so far as to say that Vietnam veterans, given the enemy, the cause, and the control by the political situation of that time, deported themselves more than adequately, in fact valiantly.

There really was no other reason for me to write on this subject other than

receiving my cap. I plan to wear it often. I was not a major operator "in country" but I was there. I did the job assigned to me, kept my head down, and did not volunteer to extend my tour. I felt and probably still feel that that war was a mistake but the mistake was made by the government; those who served made no mistake.

Letter To The Editor

Dear Editor,

Recently, you commented on the lottery. I have been waiting for someone to respond. I am usually a quiet individual (my husband being the outspoken one), but since no one has spoken up, I feel I must.

I think the Lottery is a tax on people who either don't think or cannot add. I recently contacted the State Comptroller to see how much Schleicher County contributed to the Lottery. From May 29 through June 18 of this year \$20,000.00 was paid into the Lottery from Schleicher

County. This represents \$952.38 per day. At this rate, in a year's time, \$347,618.70 will have been siphoned away from Schleicher County's economy. Yearly, this roughly equals to \$115.87 for every man, woman, and child in the county. Can you imagine the good \$952.38 a day would do for our local churches, charities, community projects, or families in need? Can you imagine a county taking care of it's own? It's a sad commentary that we have to rely on State or Federal Agencies to take care of our basic needs.

Does anyone actually think our state government will cure any of the Texas' woes with this Lottery windfall? Will Schleicher County receive any benefit from this besides more state government?

California swallowed the Lottery hook, line, and sinker. Now they have the burden of an unfair tax on those who can least afford it layered on top of a state income tax as well as the highest property taxes in the United States. Is California better off because of the Lottery? No! Increased spending far outstripped the

revenues brought in for California. Can it be any different here?

Of course, many people say "It's my dollar, let me have fun." Yes, it is your dollar and you might win a million - when a frog sprouts wings! Yes, a very few lucky people will win, but looking at the big picture, we all lose. I will forego my slim chance at a million and help a local charity. I choose to put my dollar where it counts and where it can add up for the good for Schleicher County.

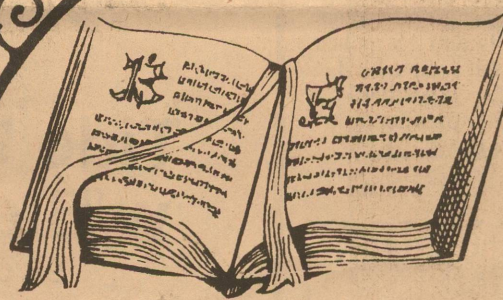

* The grill should be sturdy and stable. Keep it on a level surface away from children, foliage, chemicals, and of course, the house and garage.

* Wear an apron, and avoid baggy clothing.

* Use long-handled utensils and sharp knives for cooking. Keep them close at hand to avoid having to leave the fire unattended.

* Have a water bottle and a fire extinguisher handy in case of a sudden flare-up.

* Line the bottom of the barbecue with aluminum foil and cover it with an inch of ash to absorb grease drippings. Stack the charcoal in a pyramid shape at the center of the grill.

* If using lighter fluid, read the directions carefully. Use only the suggested amount, and allow it to soak into the coals for a minute before lighting.

* To start the fire, throw a lighted match onto the coals or use a fireplace match. Wait until the coals are ash covered (half an hour or so) and then use a poker to spread them out evenly in the grill. Replace the food rack and begin cooking.

* If the coals are too hot, spread them out. If they're too cool, gather them closer together. Never squirt starter fluid on a fire or hot coals.

* Douse the grill thoroughly with water when finished. Close the grill's vent and allow the coals to cool overnight. Dispose of them in a non-flammable container.

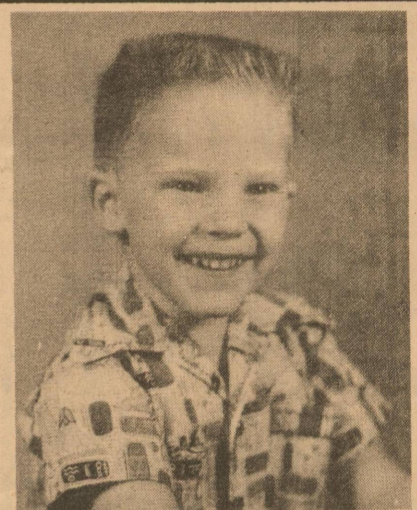
