> Pete Torres was shot about 6:00, on Saturday, April 25 th, while feeding his cows and goats on his land east of town. He was facing due east, tying up his dog, when he heard a shot and felt it hit him behind neck. more heard three or four more shots and went to his pickup and honked horn so whoever was shooting would quit," stated Pete's son, Albert.
