
was a Baptist. Her husband preceded her in death on July 10, 1979.

May 7, 1992 **Schleicher County 4-Hers Sweep District Roundup**

On Saturday, May 2, Angelo State University played host to over 400 4-H members from across Extension West Central District who were here to compete in the annual District 4-H Roundup. The Roundup featured contests designed to test the skills of youths from the 17 counties which comprise the District. Schleicher County, with 24 entries was honored with a special award based on a total number of contests entered. January 23, 1992 **Eldorado Middle School Chosen For Pilot Effort**

Year In Review

November 19, 1992 **Jail Break**

At 8:20 a.m., Wednesday morning, November 18th a prisoner escaped from the Schleicher County Jail. Frank Guevara, who was being held for the Tom Green County Sheriff's Department, injured Jailer Ricky Griffin with a sharp instrument and escaped into Eldorado. Law enforcement officers from the surrounding areas came together in Eldorado to assist in Guevara's capture. Guevara was apprehended at 12:50 p.m. less than a mile away from the jail, on Callandar Street.

March 26, 1992 **Dr. Johnson Resigns**
