City Continues Tire Recycling
arolyn Mayo The City of Eldorado is recycling van parked next to the City Hall. This is the 5th van that Safe Tires has brought out since last Fall. Thus far, 2639 tires have been loaded and taken from Eldorado! We understand that there are lots more tires out there, too.

What happens to these tires? Almost everyone involved in recycling knows the state of Texas is paying
businesses to shred scrap tires. According to industry tires. According to industry
experts, there are experts, there are are are
approximately 150 million scrap tires stockpiled in legal and illegal dumps in Texas. These dumps are breeding grounds for rodents, snakes, and disease-carrying mosquitoes. Tires are also environmental time bombs, capable of releasing tons of hydrocarbons and heavy metals into surface and groundwater supplies and carbon particulates into the air when burned.

Senate Bill 1340 placed a $\$ 2$ fee on new automobile and truck tires. The fee is collected by retail and can keep 2.5 cents of each $\$ 2$ to cover their costs. Another $8 \%$ of the fund may be spent on administrative costs. The remainder is used to pay state permitted scrap tire processors (such as Safe Tire)
