

Good Friday services were even more dramatic but this article is already too long. I do know this much, all of those memories have left with me, I think, a much deeper appreciation of just what it means when Jesus said, There is no greater love than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends" (John 15:13). He did and I hope I am His friend.




