A total of 500 students and teachers throughout the state attended the four day event. Participants had the opportunity to tour some of the finest scientific facilities available and attend lectures and workshops by leading professionals in the scientific leading

The Symposium was jointly sponsored by the Texas Atomic Energy Research Foundation and the University of Texas. West Texas Utilities Co. is one of the Foundation's

sponsoring companies and paid for all expenses for the 49 students and teachers that attended from their service area.

The Foundation was founded for the primary purpose of conducting the world's first and largest privately financed research effort in the field of energy. 


