Students Teachers Attend Science Symposium

Forty-nine outstanding high school students and teachers from West Texas Utilities Co. service area attended the 33rd Annual Texas Energy Science Symposium at the University of Texas in Austin. The conference got underway Tuesday, June 8th and ended Friday, June 11th.

A total of 500 students and teachers throughout the state attended the four day event. Participants had the opportunity to tour some of the finest scientific facilities available and attend lectures and workshops by leading professionals in the scientific field.

The Symposium was jointly sponsored by the Texas Atomic Energy Research Foundation and the University of Texas. West Texas Utilities Co. is one of the Foundation's

sponsoring companies and paid for all expenses for the 49 students and teachers that attended from their service area.

The Foundation was founded for the primary purpose of conducting the world's first and largest privately financed research effort in the field of energy. The goal of the Foundation and WTU is not research alone, but also to broaden knowledge of energy science in Texas schools and to heighten awareness of the privileges and responsibilities that scientific discovery presents.

There are over 1,000 accredited senior high schools in the state of Texas, and West Texas can be proud of their schools for being chosen to send teachers and students to the Symposium.

As superintendent, Reverend Bridges ministers extensively in church services, rallies, conventions, and camps. From the district headquarters in Fort Worth, he oversees the various ministries of the North Texas District Council's 550 churches and 1,700 ministers.

A native Texan, Reverend Bridges was born and raised in Houston. He is married to the former Joyce Lee Sterling, and they have three adult sons: Kermit, Kendall, and Keenan - two of whom are ordained with the Assemblies of God.

Reverend Bridges did his

undergraduate study at the University of Houston and at Southwestern Assemblies of God College, where he graduated with honors. He has done graduate study at the University of Wichita and Southern Methodist University. He holds a Doctor of Divinity conferred by Southwestern Assemblies of God College.

Reverend Bridges is an ordained minister with the Assemblies of God and has pastored churches in Houston, Dallas, Greenville, and Waxahachie, Texas, and Wichita, Kansas.

He has served Southwestern Assemblies of God College as vice-president and presently serves as chairman of the Board of Regents. He also serves the General Council as a member of the National board of Christian Higher Education.

Prior to his election as district superintendent, he served the North Texas District Council in the capacities of assistant superintendent, and as a sectional, an executive and a general presbyter.

TOP OF THE DIVIDE by Thomas Giovannitti

We are in New Jersey this week visiting my parents and my brothers and sisters. We were all home for Maria Ellena's wedding on June the 12th. It had been three years since all nine of us were home. It was great, of course. (Those of you from close families know what I am talking about.)

If you're from a small but close family, just multiply the fun by nine and you get some idea of what we enjoy together. I may have mentioned this before, but I am the middle child of nine children. I am about eleven years younger than my oldest sibling and fourteen years older than the youngest, my sister Ann. There are five years between Carlo, my brother next oldest to me, and there are three years between me and my sister Conchetta, the next youngest. I am a few years older

than the baby boom generation, but just a little too young to remember the war years. Because I was the fifth, my dad did not have to serve in WWII. Chetta was born somewhere very close to V-J Day.

Because of where I am in the Family I got to be, for a time, the youngest, the middle, and the oldest at home. Although the youngest for three years, since my sister Chetta was only the second girl, Janine, the second oldest, sort of commandeered her as her private project so my older brothers had only me as a test dummy. I can really identify with those guys in the seat belt adds, but that is another story.

We are a great family for telling and retelling the same stories. The children, my parents' grandchildren and now their children never seem to tire

of the telling. I don't know how long these tellings will go on or if they will get passed on. I have tried to pass them on to my children and to also tell them stories about themselves. It is our myth, our connection with our history, ourselves. I often think how sad it must be to grow up with no history, no past, no family. I marvel at our telling and retelling with the changes in these stories brought on by the changes in all of us. Oh, the truth is always the same it is merely seen differently, with, I hope, more mature, loving and sensitive eyes. If I see that, and I know my siblings see that, then there is hope that our children also see that. Tolerance, love, compassion, and understanding are learned in families. I think I have had the very best teacher.





Mr. Covino has an impressive list of credentials and accomplishments that include a Masters Degree in Art Instruction from the Pratt Institute of Art in New York;

taught in famous art schools; author of seven books including; The Fine Art of Portraiture, Discover Acrylics with Frank Covino, and Controlled Painting; has his own Art Academy in Southport, Connecticut; and has a series of video tapes on the market. Stark To Attend Interlochen Arts Camp

Steven Stark, grandson of John and Jo Callison, is an eleventh grade student at Enid High School in Enid, Oklahoma. Steven has been selected to attend Interlochen Arts Camp in Interlochen, Michigan. Interlochen is recognized as the "premier fine arts camp in the world." Interlochen began as a music camp in 1927 and will have

about 1,300 students from June 27 to August 23 during the 1993 summer term. In order to qualify, Steven had to submit an application, a tape of cello performance, and manuscripts of his original compositions. Steven was selected to major in advanced music composition.

Some of the groups with

which Steven has performed during the 1992-1993 school year that have helped prepare him for Interlochen are: Enid-Phillips Symphony Orchestra, Enid High Strolling Strings, Enid High School Orchestra (1st chair), North Central Honor Orchestra, Oklahoma Music Educator's Association (All-State), and Tri-State Honor Symphony (1st chair).

Some of the honors Steven has received during the 1992-1993 school year which have prepared him for Interlochen are: district solo contest (superior rating), National Merit Scholar qualifier, acceptance to Quartz Mountain summer arts camp in Oklahoma on full scholarship, consistent placement on Principal's honor rolls, and Honor Society member. Steven also maintains a 3.48 grade point average.

Steven's promising compositions have been performed, and he is hoping to gain maturity and knowledge in both the areas of composition and cello performance. He will be helped at Interlochen by some of the finest conductors in the world, as well as such notable artists as Itzhak Perlman, world renowned violinist and Yo-Yo Ma world renowned cellist. Interlochen also boasts faculty members comprised of noted artists and university professors.

First Logo Sign Placed In Ozona

Tiny Ozona, on Interstate 10 in West Texas, will be the site of the state's first business logo sign.

The blue signs advertising nearby gas stations, restaurants, lodging and campgrounds will be similar to those in 37 other states.

Texas' first such signs will be unveiled at 9 a.m. June 17th at a site east of Ozona.

The Texas Transportation Commission in September approved the state's first logo signs for placement along Interstate highways in counties with fewer than 20,000 people. Interstates cross 35 such counties in Texas.

"Not only will the signs raise money for Texas transportation, they make travel on Interstates safer," said

Arnold Oliver, executive director of the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT). "Too often, travelers can't see a business sign until it's too late to exit. The logo signs will guide motorists in advance."

The logo signs were authorized by the Texas Legislature in 1991. The contract to erect the signs went to Texas Logos, Inc. Businesses pay a rental fee to display their logos, and TxDOT will receive 5 percent of these fees.

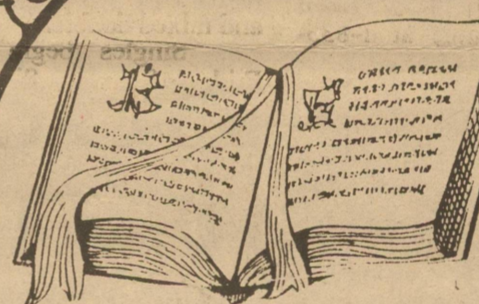

Census Bureau Looking For Agriculture Census Forms

submitted by the US Department of Commerce, Bureau of the Census

A drive to round up report forms that have not been returned by farmers and ranchers in 1992 Census of Agriculture has been started by the U.S. Bureau of the Census.

According to George

Pierce, Assistant Chief of the Census Bureau's Agriculture Division, "...the completeness and accuracy of the census report form." Just as important, he says, is the time element; a true picture of the Nation's agricultural industry cannot be presented until the forms are returned.

Agricultural procedures received their forms last December. Most have completed and returned them.

The census is the only source of comprehensive, consistent agricultural data for each county in the Nation. It is the basis for major decisions by farmer organizations, marketing associations, cooperatives, Congress, the U.S. Department of Agriculture, and Federal and state agencies. The data also are used widely by farm

publications.

Individual reports are confidential by law and are used only to tabulate totals.

Advance reports for all counties, states, and the Nation will be published starting this fall. Reports will be available through the U.S. Government Printing Office as well as many universities, and depository libraries.

Jackson Receives TASS Award

A Certificate of Appreciation was awarded to Frank Jackson of Eldorado for his outstanding performance as a field enumerator for the Texas Agricultural Statistics Service. Jackson received the award for exceptional performance as a field enumerator, with special recognition for completing work on time with minimum supervision and expenses. Jackson has been with the Service for 2 years and is one of more than 110 field enumerators who personally interviews farmers and ranchers about their crop production and livestock inventories. Rick Perry, the Texas Commissioner of Agriculture, recently presented the award at an annual midyear training school in Austin.

Perry spoke about the importance of creating jobs in rural Texas and of using data collected by field enumerators to aid in this endeavor. "I want to thank each of you, for the job you do out there is helping us make those decisions where processing plants ought to be, which natural resources are going to be available, how many farmers, how many ranchers, and how much produce is going to be available," Perry said. "The job that you do is extraordinarily important to those of us, whether we're producers, processors, or quite frankly, whether we're consumers," Perry told the audience. "We are proud of the work of all of our field

enumerators," State Statistician Dennis Findley said. "Their enthusiasm and dedication are evident in all survey work they do for the Texas office, which ultimately benefits the entire Texas agribusiness industry." Texas Agricultural Statistics Service is responsible for implementing the cooperative program of Agricultural Statistics between

the National Agricultural Statistics Service, the United States Department of Agriculture, the Texas Department of Agriculture and the National Association of State Departments of Agriculture. The Service has responsibility for gathering and disseminating crop, livestock and economic statistics about Texas agriculture.

Donating Your Body To Science

Even if you're not a physician or a research scientist, you can make a valuable contribution to medical science. "If you're comfortable with the idea, willing your body to a medical school makes a substantial contribution to the training of physicians," said Dr. Cassius B. Bordelon Jr., who teaches anatomy at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston. The study of human anatomy is absolutely essential to the basic medical sciences, he said. "You can teach with pictures, and you can teach with plastic models," Bordelon said, "but there's no substitute for the real thing. We expect medical students to be able to understand how a body is constructed." That's why the training of medical students is dependent on the generosity of people who will their bodies. "Most people donate their bodies for very humanitarian reasons," said Trish Morgan, who registers donors for Baylor's willied-body program. "They're interested in helping the advancement of science. While the foremost need for bodies is for basic

anatomical study, Bordelon said, medical schools do more than use bodies for study by first year medical students. They are also used to improve surgical procedures and develop new ones. Medical schools maintain strict guidelines, generally accepting only adult bodies. The schools cannot use a body with contagious disease or serious physical damage, including that from an extensive autopsy. Schools with particularly successful body-donation programs may accept only willed bodies, declining to accept any signed over by next of kin. Many medical schools ask each donor to agree to the transfer of the body if another school's need is greater at the time of the donor's death. After a body has been used for study, it is cremated. By that time, the body will have helped train future physicians and perhaps have fostered new life-saving knowledge for those still living. 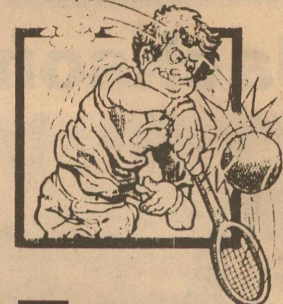
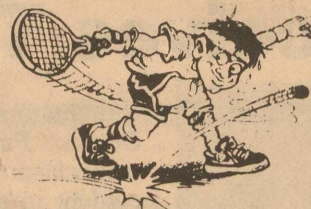

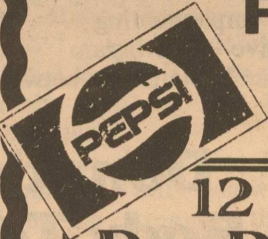
