the high school administration and athletic council enforce a policy which addresses the athletes and their behavior while on the team, and to suspend hem not only from athletics but all UIL activities. The policy was intended to set UIL participants and to and instill discipline as well as instill discipline as well as
moral conduct It is also a tool moral conduct It is also a tool when one or more of their athletes violates the policy, it dictates what action will be taken and to what degree necessary to resolve the problem.
My concern is the method used to enforce this policy and the fact that this policy is being applied selectively, and not applied to all those that violate it. It should be mentioned that the mention in the anticle which is a federal law, and yet they were suspended
