## R.R. Calcote

R. R. "Bob" Calcote 89, died Saturday, May 15 1993 in a nursing home in Midland, Texas. Services were held in Ellis Funeral Home in Midland and graveside services were held May Eldorado Cemetery on May 17th.
Bob $\begin{array}{ccc}\text { Bob } & \text { was } & \text { born } \\ \text { November } & 8, & 1903\end{array}$ November County Texas. He was a rancher and owned Oilfield Cafe at Hadacol Corner near Midkiff, returning in 1970. He was a member of Oddfellow Lodge in Rankin, Texas.

Survivors include a son Herman Calcote Gleenallen, Alaska; daughter Helen Lawson of Midland; 11 grandchildren; 17 great-grandchildren; and numerous
nephews. "Uncle Bob," known fondly by nephews and nieces, was the last serving nieces, was the last serving
son of the Schleicher County pioneer family of Robert Lee and Emma Henslee Calcote Bob was preceded in death by his loving wife Winnie, his parents and ten brothers and sisters; Effie, Maude, Media, Charles, Bill, Fines, Busters, Henry, Ed and Minnie.

The Calcote Family moved to Schleicher County
in 1901. They bought ranch in 1901. They bought ranch land eleven miles north of Eldorado. Robert Lee, known
to all as "Peg Leg" because to all as "Peg Leg" because leg, built a store on the property. Calcote Store wa an ideal location because it was about half way between
San Angelo and Sonora on the only dirt road between the wo sites. In the early 1900's a trip from San Angelo to sonora in horse or ox pulled wagons required several days
traveling, usually camping ground and sold fresh horses She was born January 11, 1951, in San Angelo. She and supplies.
Later when motor venicles traveled this road the Calcotes sold gas and oil as ell as supplies.

The store remained open until the 1920's. Robert 1925. Emma, with the hee 21, her sons, continued to ranch until October 5, 1940 when she, her son Henry, Henry's wife Dardanella and their baby Patsy Irene, were all killed by a former employee of the Calcote Family. About a year late the ranch land was sold.

Matthew Williams, '93 salutatorian, has recently been named a National Merit
Scholar. Williams is the first Scholar. Williams is the first
EHS graduate to receive this honor since the inception of the program.

The process begins for a student when he/she is a junior and takes the PSAT/NMSQT. Of the one million students who take the test, 50,000 are designated as commended scholars.
Of the 50,000 commended scholars, 15,000 are chosen as finalists. At this
point each student must take point each student must take the SAT and write an essay locusing on his academic Based on the student's SAT scores, his essay, and SAT scores, his essay, and
his activities, the selection committee makes its final choices. Williams scored 1450 out of a possible 1600 points on the SAT. He has
also been active in basketball, track, debate, readywriting, one-act play and science

The City of Eldorado conducted a Town Meeting on Tuesday, May 18 , to outline the City's options for
the future of solid waste the future of solid waste
collection and disposal collection and disposal. A

citizens present in addition to citizens present in addition to

$\qquad$ opened the session, giving those in attendance a brief background on the evolution of Subtitle D which will go into effect October 9, 1993 , and its direct impact on small communities such as
Eldorado due to Eldorado due to much higher operating costs and 30 -year monitoring requirements. Mr.
Nikolauk introduced Gary Nikolauk introduced Gary Harris from the engineering
firm of Parkhill, Smith \& Cooper of Midland. Mr Cooper of
Midland. Mr. Harris has been directly
involved
SPEC (Sparsely Populated Entities Coalition) who requested and received variance for WT communities from some of the stringent standards outlined in Subtitle D. Mr. Harris' firm completed a written study outlining the options available to the City of Eldorado. They also estimated costs associated with each option using a 15 year period and an assumption that $80 \%$ of the
trash generated within the trash generated within the
City of Eldorado is City of $\begin{aligned} & \text { Eldorado } \\ & \text { residential while } \\ & 20 \% \\ & \text { is }\end{aligned}$ residential while $20 \%$ is

3) City continuing hauling of City of Eldorado customers' garbage and operating landfill under Subtitle D standards with Arid Exemption application made and new truck and mpactor purchased

however, that whichever option is chosen, the rates will at least double to cover the incre
An unofficial poll was conducted among those
present and the voiced present and the voiced
consensus indicated a desire to continue operation of the to continue operation of the
landfill in acceptance with Subtitle D. Those speaking out felt that despite the increased costs of landfill maintenance and additional equipment needs, the most important factors were convenience and level of service.
The City will be taking the initial steps toward certification of the landfill in the near future, beginning with closure of filled areas
and decisions equipment purchases.
