Blucats Slip By Eagles

Eldorado played a great game against the Coleman Bluecats on Friday night, September 17th, but it wasn't enough to pull off a win. The Bluecats made a touchdown and a field goal with 2:49 left in the game, making the final score 21-20, in favor of Coleman.

The Casey Triplett scored for the Eagles on a 9 yard run with 1:58 left in the first quarter. Robert Sanchez made the PAT, making the score 7-0 at the end of the first quarter.

Both the Eagles and Coleman scored in the second quarter. Pepper Nix scored for the Eagles, catching a 39 yard pass from Farley Dakan with :30 left in the quarter. The PAT was good, making the score at half time 14-7, in favor of the Eagles.

Both teams also scored in the third quarter, but Coleman blocked the Eagles PAT, leaving the score 20-14, in favor of the Eagles. Hunter Preston

scored caught a 24 yard pass from Farley Dakan with 2:17 left in the third quarter.

In the fourth quarter, Coleman scored with 2:49 left in the game, but the Eagles were unable to come back.

Hutto's Injured In Head-On Collision

Glyn and Robbin Hutto of Eldorado were injured in a head-on collision at 4:10 p.m. on Friday, September 17th on U.S. Highway 277 about 7 miles south of San Angelo. Merced Valdez of Sonora, the driver of the other car, was killed.

Valdez was driving a 1981 Cadillac that swerved across the highway and collided head-on with the Hutto's pickup truck.

Glyn and Robbin were taken to Angelo Community Hospital for treatment of multiple injuries. Robbin was released from Angelo

Community on Saturday, but Glyn remains with multiple fractures in both legs, fractured ribs, a concussion, and many other bumps and bruises.

The Hutto's truck spun around and rolled over on its top after being struck. Glyn was pinned inside the truck, and had to be removed by San Angelo firefighters with a hydraulic device (JAWS). Both Glyn and Robbin were wearing their seat belts. Valdez was not.

Glyn works for Farm Bureau and Robbin is a kindergarten teacher at Eldorado Elementary School.

TOP OF THE DIVIDE

Nicolas mentioned that he thought it was odd that no two families seem to have the same type of microwave. Maybe it is his interest in eating that made microwaves more of a presence to him, I don't know? He is right. I don't recall seeing another microwave like the one I have. They all have different controls too.

For what I use our's for the one we have is just fine. Our microwave has no automatic, no timed bake preset, or any of the other things that are in the deluxe models. As it turns out I was right to buy the cheap one since we use it mainly to reheat left overs. Is there another use for a microwave?

The microwave seems to be the blender of the nineties. Blenders also came, or still come in all different styles, sizes and complexity of operation, but they all do pretty much the same thing. Blenders, in the end, just mash whatever is put into it until it liquefies, depending on how long I let the little whirling blades whirl.

Microwaves are the same. They heat whatever I put in them and how hot the item gets depends on how long I heat it. Other than TV dinners, no one

that I know cooks meals in a microwave. (I haven't seen one that is big enough, for one thing.) It appears that centering the food and rotating it is important in microwaving, but I don't know why. Those microwaves are supposed to bounce off the sides of the oven and I guess by some magic or nuclear trickery heat the food as they pass through. They also heat the container even though I thought they are not supposed to do that. They have contributed one more thing to the advance of civilization, they have gotten TV dinners out of those metal trays and into a microwave safe dish.

I can't always judge the amount of time very well, so I have wasted a few baking potatoes and melted my turn table. I have pretty much resigned myself to use the microwave to reheat leftovers, which it does much more efficiently than regular stoves. My machine is also limited since it has only a knob type of timer and so it is hard to get those fractional portions of a second called for on the package of food now made only for microwaves.

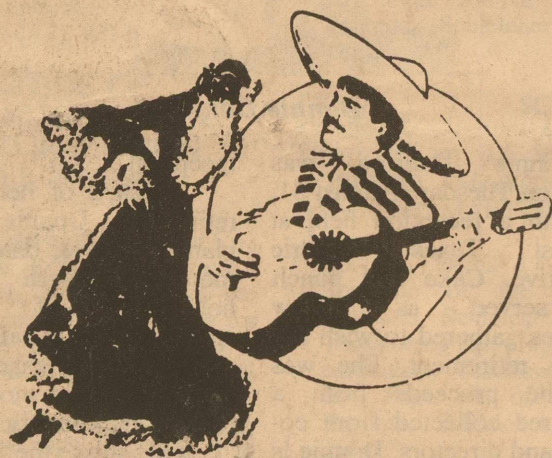
Dear Editor,

American Simmental & Simbrah Summer Classic Held

Several West Texas competitors participated in the American Simmental and Simbrah Summer Classic XII, held July 12-16, at Springfield, Illinois. Competitors included Amy Clark, Catherine Lloyd, Tabitha Lloyd, and Casey Kidd of Eldorado; Kami Williamson and James Williamson of Menard; Brandon Green and Jerred Green of Wall; Jenny Phillips and Jason Phillips of Garden City; Lori Sam Fambro of Breckenridge. Twenty other Texas competitors also participated in the week long event.

Nearly 250 junior members, representing 25 states, were in attendance, the second largest Classic ever. Contestants accumulated points in seven competitive events, including: sire summary quiz, herdsman quiz, public speaking, showmanship, heifer competition, a heifer sales talk, and cattle judging. Other activities held during the week-long competition included advertising & promotion, a highly competitive beef bowl tournament, two dances, a cookout, a festive awards banquet and an educational program.

Kelly Crawford of Santo, Texas, won the senior division overall competition, while Jordan Redalen of Fountain, Minnesota, finished first in the junior division. The Texas #1 senior team of Kelly Crawford, Jenny Phillips, Jeff Prokop, and Philip Tom, won its ninth consecutive senior division team championship, with the Minnesota #1 team in the runner-up position. In the junior division, the two states reversed positions with Minnesota #1 easing past the runner-up Texas #2 team, made up of Coty Koehne, Brenham; Lori Sam Fambro, Breckenridge; Mark Jousan, Joaquin, and Casey Lawson, Joaquin.

In the senior division, Brandon Green placed 16th overall in the senior judging contest and was a member of the Texas/Louisiana team that was second in the Beef Bowl competition. Jenny Phillips, a member of the overall team, placed 20th in sales talk, 13th in judging, and 14th in showmanship.

In the Junior competitive events, Jason Phillips placed 8th with Lori Sam Fambro 10th in the overall top 10 division. Jason was 9th in sire summary, 6th in herdsman quiz, 6th in judging, 10th in showmanship, and also a member of the Texas Junior team that placed 2nd overall in the beef bowl. Lori Sam placed 6th in sales talk, 4th in showmanship, and was a member of the 2nd overall Junior Team.

Tabitha Lloyd placed 4th overall in junior sales talk. Both Tabitha and Catherine Lloyd were called back in the top 20 junior showmanship competition, but failed to make the top 10 individually.

In the overall top 20 Simbrah heifers competition, Texas members had nine out of the top 10 Simbrah heifers in the show, the best Texas has ever done in the overall Simbrah competition. Heifers are placed in their respective classes, and then placed to recognize the top 20 heifers in the show.

Casey Kidd's heifer was named Grand Champion Simbrah. Tabitha Lloyd's class winning Simbrah placed 3rd overall, closely followed by Amy Clark-4th, Catherine Lloyd-5th, James Williamson-7th, and Kami Williamson-10th overall. Other Texas exhibitors that placed in the top 10 were Shaun Neumann, Round Top-Reserve Grand Champion; Kelly Crawford, Santo-6th; and Philip Tom, Campbellton-10th. Texas easily won first in the State Premier Heifer Team competition followed by Oregon and Arkansas.

The Fourteenth Annual Summer Classic will be held in conjunction with ASA's 19th Annual Summer conference at Murfreesboro, Tennessee, during July of 1994.

SCISD Board Met

The regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of Schleicher County Independent School District was held on September 13, 1993 at 6:00 p.m. in the Administration Building.

Mr. Peters, Middle School Principal, informed the board about the middle school student population (8th grade-59 students, 7th grade-46 students, 6th grade-56 students, 5th grade-61 students). Mr. Peters also reported that the Middle School had received \$30,000 from TEA for performance gain and outstanding effort and had received an acceptable performance rating on the Academic Excellence Indicator System. Mr. Peters stated that several members of the middle school staff will be speaking at the Texas Business and Education Coalition in Austin on November 10th. Mr. Peters also discussed the reading challenge that is taking place in the middle school which encourages the students and parents to read one million pages giving the students the chance to take a trip to Schlitterbahn in New Braunfels.

Mr. Barton shared with the board a copy of a letter from TEA recognizing Eldorado Elementary for being rated as RECOGNIZED as a result of high performance on the Academic Excellence Indicators. Mr. Barton also presented current enrollment figures with the board. Elementary-319, Middle

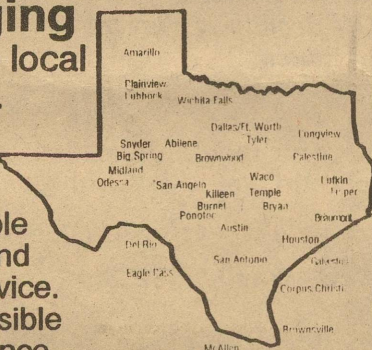
School-222, and High School-216.

"Ag In The Classroom"

"Ag In The Classroom", an educational program aimed at all San Angelo fourth graders has been set for September 23rd and 24th at the Texas A&M University Research and Extension Center here. The program is being sponsored by the Texas Agricultural Extension Service and the Texas Farm Bureau in

cooperation with the San Angelo Independent School District. Organizers expect over 1,200 youth to participate during the two days.

Ken Cook, District 7 Extension Director said the purpose of the program is to familiarize young people with the workings of modern agriculture. "The object here is

to go beyond the children's barnyard concept," said Cook. "We're striving to promote awareness and generate interest in agriculture which is a vital part of the life and economy of West Texas."

Each day is divided into eight, 10-12 minute stops. The Extension Service stops include Live sheep and goats, range management, egg-to-chick and bookkeeping. The Farm Bureau stops include a cotton gin model, a Texas Sheep and Goat Raisers' Association Auxiliary booth and a cotton farm equipment display. Beef cattle displays featuring animals from the Case Hereford Ranch at Eldorado and the Rocking Chair Hereford Ranch at San Angelo will also be featured.

The Extension Service has prepared information sheets on each of the stops to acquaint teachers on Ag in the Classroom prior to the event.
