## FLDS has never before built a temple

Sources close to Prophet Warren
Jeffs of the Fundamentalist Church of Jeffs of the Fundamentalist Church of
Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints tell the Success that the reclusive leader is planning to build a temple here in Schleicher County similar in size and scope to the one originally built by Mormon founder Joseph Smith in Nauvoo, Illinois.
"Warren has gone too far," one Utah man said on condition of anonymity.
"He thinks he is God, so he has to have a temple."
Aerial photos of the YFZ Ranch show a massive foundation under construction just west of the already completed meeting hall. The footprint of the foundation roughly matches that of the original Nauvoo temple.

## Commissioners approve moving

 Dist. Courtroom to Memorial Bldg.The Schleicher County Commissioners court met Monday, November 8, 2004, and, among other busines discussed using the Memorial Building to hold District Court. County Judge Johnny Griffin explained that Dist Judge Barbara Walther is unhappy with the current court room, located on the 2nd floor of the courthouse. He noted that the lack of an elevator renders the room inaccessible to people with disabilities and the poor heating and lack of air conditioning makes the room uncomfortable most months of the year.
Griffin said that he had met with Walther and had agreed to relocate the court room to the Memorial Building. "I hope that's OK with y'all," Griffin said. "I told her we would do whatever she needed."
One concern was the need to renovate the women's rest room in the Memorial Building, especially replacing the door in order to make it handicap accessible. Griffin said that the doorway would need to be widened to accommodate wheelchairs and that a hallway would be constructed connecting the rest room to

Ben Bistline, long-time critic of the FLDS and author of The Polygamists: A History of Colorado City, Arizona tells the Success that the construction of a temple at Eldorado will bring a new dynamic to the FLDS story. "This will have serious repercussions," Bistline said. "Warren building a temple means this will be a bigger and more permanent move than I would have anticipated." Author Jon Krakauer agrees. "This is a significant development," Krakauer told the Success on Tuesday. "The fundamentalists have never before built a temple. Warren Jeffs is proving to be a different kind of prophet."
Krakauer, who wrote Under the Banner of Heaven, cited Mormon prophecy that "the destructions" will begin with the laying of the temple cornerstone. "I can't tell you exactly what this means for Eldorado", Krakauer added. "Just

## State school board adds marriage definition to health textbook

Craddick (R-Midland) released a list of 119 members or memberelects who he says will vote for him as speaker when the Legisl
ture convenes in January
Promising in a written state ment to lead the House "with a fair, even hand," Craddick said that no one would be "shut out of the legislative process."

Voters shut out some
Craddick couldn't speak for the Texas electorate, which did vote to shut a few incumbents out of the legislative process.
In Travis County, Republican House Rep. Jack Stick, serving his first term, lost narrowly to Demo cratic candidate Mark Strama.
In Houston, the race pitting longtime Republican Rep. Tal madge Heflin and Democrat cha lenger Hubert Vo, a Vietnam na tive, was still hinging on a coun of absentee ballots ongoing on Monday.

Heflin has served 11 terms in the House and is chair of the House Appropriations Committee, the group at the heart of the state budget-making process.
The House will have $87 \mathrm{Re}-$ publicans and 63 Democrats if $V_{0}$ wins, though that GOP margin could drop by one if a requested recount affects the outcome of the race between narrow winne Republican Rep. Todd Baxte and Democratic challenger Kelly White in Travis County.

## "District of Travis".

Years ago, singer Michael Martin Murphy said he didn't live in Texas, he lived in Austin. And Austin is in Travis County, which some had quipped may as well call itself the District of Travis.

Showing that it is a bit different from the rest of the state, Travis County went for Democratic presidential candidate Sen. John Kerry, giving him 56 percent of the vote President Bush carried the state of course. He got 61.14 percent of the vote statewide, compared to 38.24 percent for Kerry. Other than Travis County, Kerry did best in South Texas along the border, Paso and the Beaumont area.
