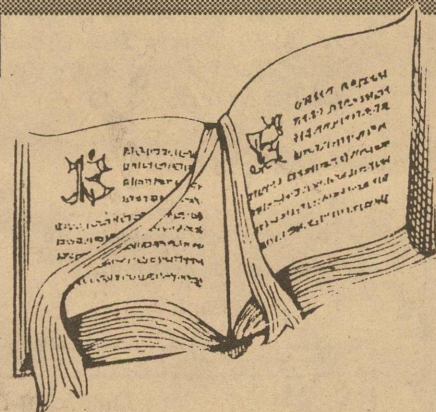

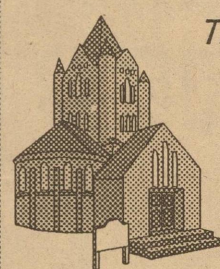

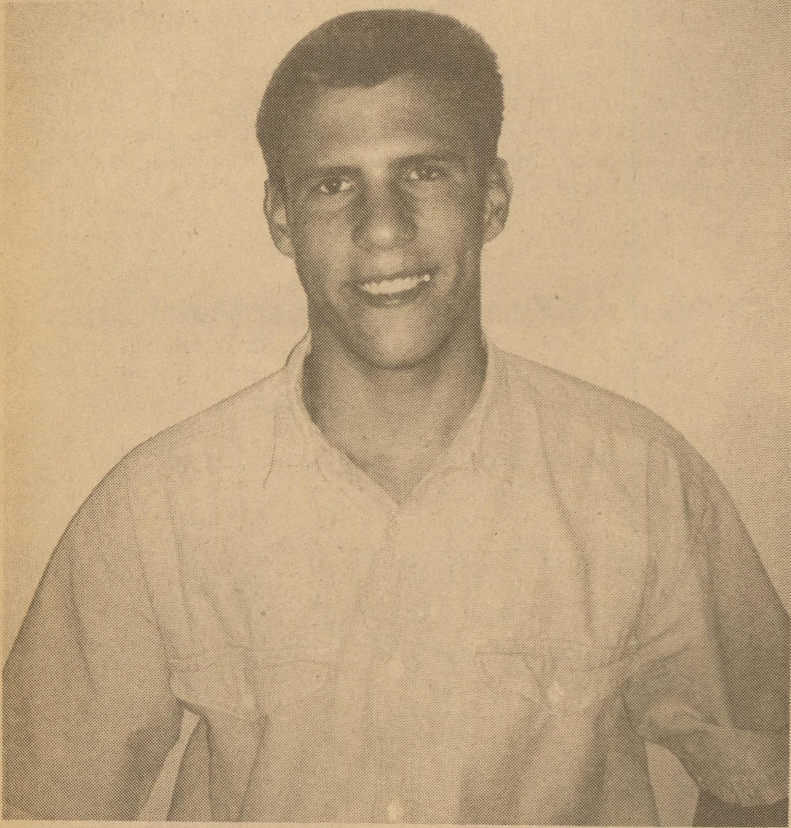

Matt was also the recipient of the National Merit Scholarship Award.

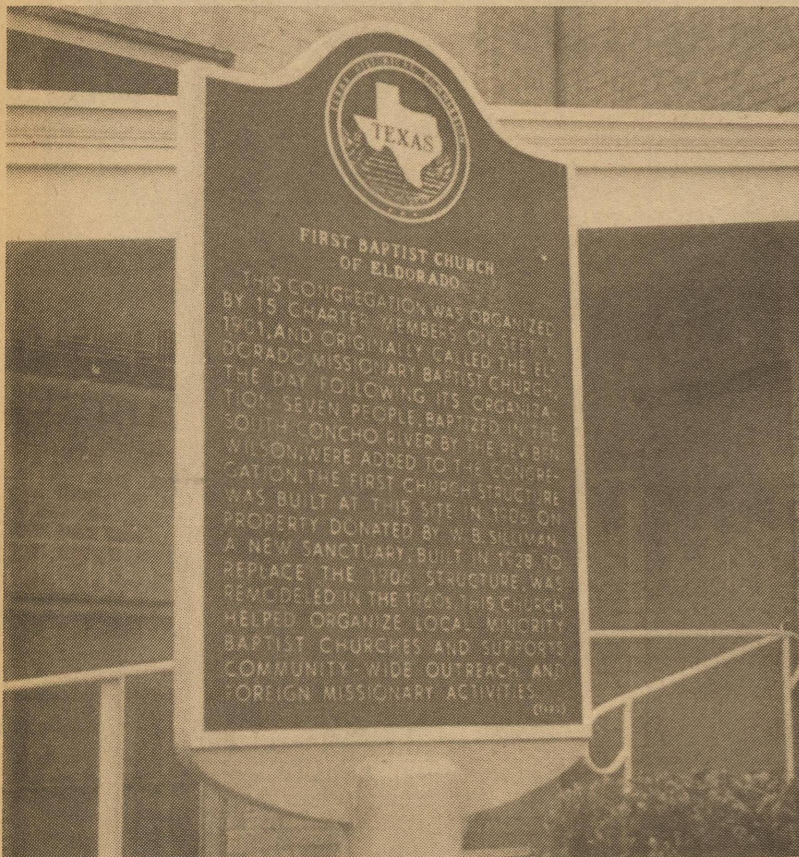
