

"There is no great loss without some small gain," as an ancient proverb has it and we might add another: "It's an ill wind that blows nobody good." Philanthropy can take a wrong course as well as any other human engers, even of widows and orphans. This is about what we have been doing to relieve the hardships of Europe. Let us be thankful that our national leaders have finally discovered America




