Only principles live. It is the principle involved in any transactions that governs its necesity or measures its results. Had this government not been founded upon principles it could not have survived the test of time nor withstood the struggle for recognition.

Consider the great and fundanental questions of civil liberty such a sthe rights of free speech and a free press, the rights of peaceable assembly and petition and to be confronted by one's accusers; the right of the peoole to be secure in their persons, nouses, papers and effects, a gainst unreasonable searches and seizures. Whence came these? They did not spring from udden whim, nor from transint passion, except, indeed, from he passion for justice. They deeloped as civilization progressd and the institution of liberty nder law became the guiding and of national unity.

Rights spring from principles and principles result in policies. We could not say that perfection always has been attained from Maybe they haven't found out the establishment of policies based upon principles. But they have been goals to strive for. In government, ethics, commercial relations, international negotiations, or in social and racial contacts there have been gross inadequacies apparent and many nequalities made manifest. However, these, nave not been the result of the principles involved, but have been the failure of the enforcement of the established policies.—Pickerill Service.





An example of what I consider a well balanced ration is the one given below, which I have used successfully for a number of years. For the sake of those not familiar with this method of feeding, I shall explain that mashes are customarily put in hoppers and kept constantly before the hens at all times. The grains are preferably fed by hand with the feedings far enough apart so the hens will eat plenty of mash in between times. The grains are called scratch feeds, by the kay, because they are usually buried in deep litter. That makes the hens have to scratch it out, thus getting much needed exercise.

100 lbs. yellow corn. 100 lbs. wheat or heavy oats. Mash Feed.
