



A. legislative and educational campaign has been the increased number of editorials published asking business men and other users of the mail to have corner cards on all first clas mail, suggesting that the printing be done at a local office. The Post Office Department in ts annual report points out that there has been a decrease of 8.5 per cent in the number of undeivrable uieces of first class matter. The Department claims that "No doubt it was directly lue to the persistant campaign carried on by the Department throughout the year to induce nail advertisers ti use envelopes earing return addresses in lieu of plain noncard envelopes and o keep their mailing lists proper y corrected to date."

Reports from publishers in arious Congressional districts how that postal employes are ager to urge the use of governent stamped envelopes because it increases the receipts o ftheir office and affects their salary and standing. Therefore, it is inlikely that postal employes suggest that amilers patronize private printers. The Department in its report further states that "Interviews with more than 5000 of the largest mail advertisers of the country show that over 85 per cent of them agreed unreservedly to the Department's suggestion to use return




