The elusive FLDS prophet Warren Jeffs remains at large this week despite the increased attention from state, federal and local law enforcement agencies. Jeffs was named to the FBI's Top. Ten Fugitive List two weeks ago.
Sheriff David Doran reports that there is still no reason to believe that Jeffs is at the YFZ Ranch, some four miles north-northeast of Eldorado However, lawmen seem to be focusing there attention here, just in case. Doran said a representative from the Texas Attorney General's office met at Texas Attorney General's office met at
his office last week with lawmen from his office last week with lawmen from
the FBI, Texas Rangers, Texas DPS the FBI , Texas Rangers, Texas DPS
Special Crimes Unit, as well as Doran Special Crimes Unit, as well as Dor
and Chief Deputy George Arispe and Chief Deputy George Arispe. The purpose of the meeting, Doran said, was to compare notes and share
information. information.
On a lighter note, the increased publicity that accompanies Jeffs' Ten
Most Wanted designation has prompted Most Wanted designation has prompted a number of people across the state to write and call with unique recommendations for apprehending Jeffs.
One woman wrote to say that she is a psychic and offered her services while an Odessa man, convinced that Jeffs is

- hiding at the YFZ Ranch, recommended building a levee around the ranch and then pumping it full of water.
"We've heard it all," Doran said. "Everything from camouflaged night assaults to satellite surveillance.
The sheriff, says he thanks everyone for their input, but explains that his office is cooperating with state and federal officials to bring the manhunt for War-
ren Jeffs to a successful and peaceful conclusion.
"The last thing we want is for someone to get hurt...or drowned," Doran said.

## County eyes airport grants

The County Commissioners met Monday, May 22, 2006 in yet another brief meeting.
Present were County Clerk Peggy Williams, Commissioners Matt Brown, Kirk Griffin and Johnny Mayo. Judge Johnny Griffin and Commissioner Bill Clark were both absent.
Also present were Road Superintendent Clay Burleson and Treasurer Karen Henderson.
Commissioner Mayo served as Judge Pro Tem and moderated the meeting. The court proclaimed May as Fair Housing Month for Schleicher County.
The court then approved a resolution to have Judge Johnny Griffin sign contracts with HOWCO Service for grant administration services.

County Clerk Peggy Williams presented the court a bid of $\$ 37,166.00$ from Southwest Texas Coop for purchase and installation of outside lamps posts for the courthouse security
Commissioner Mayo gave the court an update on a trip to Austin on May 11, 2006 to the Texas Department of Transportation Aviation meeting.
Mayo told the court the state offered Schleicher County two options on two $90 / 10$ grants for updating the airport runway. One option was a grant in the mount of 3235,000 for repaving the current runway with gravel.
The second option was in the amount of $\$ 836,000$ which would put down hot mix on the runway and pads around the hangers and install updated night landing equipment on the southern portion of the runway.
Mayo said the county's 10 percent match could be paid out over a threeyear period. He further advised that they discussed funds for installing a designated Ag containment area for crop dusters and the state suggested the county set up rules governing parking of Ag-use planes.
The meeting ended with approval of an indigent request in the amount of $\$ 239.56$ to pay a over due electric bill. The men also approved budget transfers for County Treasurer Karen Henderson.

## Governor Perry orders flags lowered in memory of Lloyd Bentsen

AUSTIN - Gov. Rick Perry Tuesday ordered flags at state buildings to be flown at half-staff for five days in memory of Lloyd Bentsen, who represented Texas in the U.S. House of Representatives for six years and in the U.S. Senate for 22 years.
"Today we mourn the loss of a war hero and true Texas leader who earned the respect of the nation with his dedication to public service," Perry said. "Anita and I extend prayers of comfort to his family in their time of grief, and urge all Texans to remember and honor his life of service."
Flags will also be flown at halfstaff on the day of his burial services.

Lost About "Lost City"

Political columnists are not cinema critics. So I can only offer my strictly personal view of "The Lost City," Andy Garcia's new film about preCastro Havana, a movie that for Cubans in the United States became a sort of legendary, eagerly awaited project during the 16 years it took Garcia to make it: I was ready to love it, but was hugely disappointed.
That's my opinion as your average moviegoer, not as a Profession-
 not pretend I know enough about cinema to write a profession al film review.
Not that profes sional film reviewers sisagreed. Almost unanimously, critics panned it. That's their job. The problem comes when movie reviewers pretend they know enough about politics to write political commentary. Beyond tearing the film apart on its artistic merits, too many film critics waded into Cuban political waters and quickly found themselves in way over their heads.
The movie tells the story of Fico (played by Garcia), a nightclub owner in late 1950s Havana whose middle-class family is torn apart by Fidel Castro's revolution. The script was written by the late Guillermo Cabrera Infante, widely considered
Cuba's greatest novelist, and from a historical point Cuba's greatest novelist, and from a historical point of view, the film is dead-on.
But the politics in the story's background went right over the heads of film critics playing political commentators with no understanding of Cuba beyond the myths officially approved by Hollywood. The same Hollywood that turned down Garcia's project but perpetrated on the public pro-Castro garbage like the laugh-a-minute Robert Redford melodrama "Havana" and "The Motorcycle Diaries," a romantic ode to Che Guevara.

Complained one Andy Klein of something called Los Angeles City Beat, "We hear not a word about Castro's early push for 100 percent literacy." As if that excused 47 years of dictatorship, as if Cuba before Castro had not already ranked fourth in literacy in Latin America.
Oh, yes, Garcia made the unforgivable error of pretending "life sure was peachy before Fidel Castro came to town and ruined everything," as The New York Times' Stephen Holden put it. Maybe Holden went to the bathroom and missed all the scenes that depicted the tyrannical and corrupt rule of Batista. Garcia, whatever his faults as director and star of this movie, was equally critical of Castro and the dictator who preceded him.
Another unpardonable socio-political error: Too many middle-class white Cubans. The movie, claimed Rex Reed, "fails to focus on the povertystricken workers whose plight lit the fires of revolution." It was a popular reprimand.
Rex, Stephen and the Andy who is not Garcia but gets to insert clueless political commentary in his film reviews do not seem to know that the Castro rebels were almost all college-educated, white, tro rebels were almost all college-educated, white,
middle-class Cubans who abhorred Batista's rule. middle-class Cubans who abhorred Batista's rule.
Batista himself came from a working-class family, Batista himself came from a working-class family,
never graduated from college and was of mixed never graduated from college and w
black, Chinese and Spanish ancestry.
Which does not fit the condescending lefty stereotype that to be authentically Lah-tee-no, you must be a member in good standing of the poor, oppressed brown masses. Stick to what you know, film critics.

## The Wasps now have a home

On March 8, 1943, a group of
Women Airforce Service Pilots Women Airforce Service Pilots ar-
rived at Avenger Field in Sweetwa ter to start the only all-female air training facility that operated during World War Two. The women trained briefly in Houston, but the skies were too crowded and the weather was bad, so they moved the training to Sweetwater, which had 300 days of sunshine every year and lots of room.

Rig Edwards was one of 400 pilot instructors at Avenger Field. Each instructor was in charge of five girls. Rig's daughter, Sandra Spears, helped get him to work. "We would drive up to the enrance early in the morning and the guard would shine his light into the car. My sister and I usually had on our pajamas. When he saw that it was us, he would wave us on in.
Then when it was time for Daddy Then when it was time for Daddy
to come home in the afternoon, he to come home in the afternoon, he and we'd go get him.
The women pilots received six months training at Avenger Field. "There were 25,000 women that applied. The women had to know be accepted into the program. The

men could learn how to fly from the ground up, but WASPs had to have a commercial pilot's license to get in. At that time there were only about 3,000 women in the United States that qualified. Of those, there were 1,845 accepted into the program. There were 1,074 that actually graduated and got their wings. They were then stationed all over the US."
The WASPs flew 77 different types of aircraft. They could not fly outside the US.
"One of their main duties was to ferry planes from aircraft fac tories on the west coast or Texas to the east coast so they could be sent off to Europe. Some women pilots tested planes after they were repaired.

Others were tow pilots, where they were towing targets for the men pilots to shoot at. And they were using live ammunition."

The trainers and students were all civilians, except for military pilots who gave the WASPs their final check flight.
"WASPs were not recognized as veterans until 1977. They paid their way to get here. If they washed out of the program they paid their way home. If they were killed in action, the girls usually took up a collection to have the body up a collection to have the body
sent back to the family. When the sent back to the family. When the program closed in December of 1944. they had to pay their way to

After the program ended some women joined the military others became housewives or started other careers. For some time, efforts were made to have a museum to honor the WASPs On Memorial Day of last year, the WASP museum opened in Sweetwater. Sandra is a board member.

We have a hangar where huge photos of WASPs line the walls Beneath the photos is informa tion about the girls. The museum is attempting to interview all the remaining WASPs as an oral history project. 38 WASPs died in action."

## Governor <br> signs business component of tax reform plan

AUSTIN - Gov. Rick Perry on May 18 signed into law House Bill 3 subjecting most Texas businesses to a 1 percent tax on profit, minus deductions for either cost of goods sold or personnel costs.
The tax will take effect on Jan. , 2008. It is a component of a wideranging plan hailed by the governor's office and many texas priss A Ascociation
others as "the lhers as "th erty tax cut in exas history," $\$ 15.7$ billion.
Combined
 hese cuts are expected to rel
duce the school
district property tax rate by one third Of course, if appraisals increase at a normal rate, the sensation of a lowe
tax burden might not last for long.

Perry's office said HB 3 will
Reward employers for creating jobs and investing in employee ben efits. "Every time a business puts a Texan to work, pays for health insur ance or invests in a pension plan... their tax liability will go down."

Protect small employers so that they can continue to drive Texas' economic growth.

Exempt sole proprietors and general partnerships from the tax, as well as businesses whose gross receipts otal $\$ 300,000$ or less, and those whose x bill is less than $\$ 1,000$; and
Rewardemployers who create jobs and contribute to the economy, but will penalize businesses that hire illegal mmigrants with higher taxes.
HB 2, another part of the tax reform plan, devotes future excess revenue to
property tax reduction until the rate reaches 75 cents per $\$ 100$ valuation. The governor had not signed HB 2 into aw as of May 21.
Members of the 80th Texas Legislature will file bills making clarifica tions to HB 3 and perhaps carving out exceptions to it in the next regular session, which convenes in January.

Damper on tax-cut euphoria
Already, critics of the tax reform plan are saying it will create a $\$ 25$ nd 2010
Chief among those critics is state Comptroller Carole Keeton Strayhorn, whose assertions may be colored by the fact that as an independent can didate, she is campaigning to get her name on the election ballot and unseat Perry as governor in November
Strayhorn said that if elected, she will work to repeal the Perry tax reform plan and come up with something better.
Meanwhile, Perry is waiting for Strayhorn - the state's chief accountant - to certify HB 1 before he can sign it into law.
HB 1 is a major component of the tax reform plan passed by the Legislature during the special session that ended May 16. It is supposed to hack down the maintenance and operations portion of all school district property tax rates by 17 cents per $\$ 100$ valuation in 2007 and by 33 cents per $\$ 100$ valuation in 2008.

Power struggle in ballot process Strayhorn turned in more than 230,000 signatures to get on the ballot, but the signatures must be verified by Secretary of State Roger Williams.

Perry appointee, Williams seemed to be in no rush to verify signatures submitted by either Strayhorn or entertainer-novelist Kinky Friedman, who also is running against Perry as an independent.
