





### Explaining the Wind

The blowing of the wind is owing to the presence of more air at one place than at others. This causes a push from the places of more air toward those of less, and the greater this difference in quantity of air the greater the push, and the faster the winds. Now, it is difference in tem perature that causes the difference in the accumulation of air: in March the difference in temperature between the southern and northern portions of the United States is greater than at any other time of the year, hence the difference in atmospheric pressure be tween these regions is then greatest and the resulting winds strongest. These winds are not mainly north and south. as the pressure is, but from west to east. This is owing to the effect of the rotation of the earth, in a way fully understood, but not capable of brief explanation.


