

MUCH of the distress of many people in America today is due, not to the fact that they have not had an opportunity to earn and save money, but to the fact that they have lost

their savings in fraudulent schemes of one kind or another. Many a widow is in financial difficulty not because she was left penniless by her husband but because she lost her inheritance by investing it in "gold bricks." Many a bank depositor who once carried a fine balance is penniless today not because he did not know how to save but because he did not know how to invest.

Perhaps if I relate some wild-cat promotions that give an insight into the activities of investment sharks it will quicken a relentless determination to provide depositors with much needed w. R. 



SANITATION SAVES LIVES OF CHILDREN

Work in Santiago.

Washington,-Should a fire sweep through a children's hospital in San-tiago, Chil, and snuff out the lives of 789 Uttle children, millions would feel keenest sympathy and presidents and kings would send messages of con-

Less spectacular, but far more cheering, is the actual news that 789 lives of children under one year old have been saved in a six months' period in that one city.

And the United States had an important part in this magic boon of modern medicine.

The circumstances emerge into the news because of the announcement of the new sanitary code regulations and the decision of the United States public health service to permit Dr. J. D. Long of its staff to remain in Santiago as technical adviser to the Chilean ministry of hygiene.

Repaying Medicinal Favors. "It seems only a bit of poetic justice that the United States should minister to the land whose deserts make the world's gardens grow, bind the sores and wounds of mankind, and alleviate the pain of intense suffering in hospitals from New York to Singapore-for those are the effects of the nitrates, the lodine and the cocaine that Chile exports," says a bulletin of the National Geographic society.

"Medicine has wrought powerful changes in the geography of the world," the bulletin continues. "Quinine, for example, has been man's chief ally in conquering the tropics. And recent applications of medical science have been estimated to have saved more lives among the allied nations since the World war than were ost in that titanic struggle.

"Now Chile, by the creation of its national health service, with the assistance of the expert from our country, has embarked upon a program which she believes, at a conservative estimate, will save her nearly 30,000 ives a year.

"Such a program, through the length of her 2,700 miles, from the nitrate beds of Tarapaca to the forests of Tierra del Fuego, and her rich inmediate belts of copper, iron, fruits d the only sizable coal deposits in oth America, will have an important bearing upon her future geography and upon the world supply of the aw materials and resources she pos-

"An official resume of the work performed by the national health service since its inception last year, just received at the headquarters of the National Geographic society, tells how a fly elimination campaign, through refuse removal, and certain other santary provisions resulted in cutting lown the infant mortality rate durng the last six months of 1925 by 45.4 per cent over the deaths of 1923; and showed a falling of 31.4 per cent in the number of deaths in 1925 over hose of 1924. What Chile Has Done.

"The elongated republic, with its ne-fourth area of islands, has been livided into ten sanitary zones, a orps of health officers has been creted, quarantine regulations have peen put into effect, physicians liensed and compelled to report comnunicable diseases, sewage disposal lants installed in small communities, nunicipal sanitary codes drafted and hysical examinations of school chilren are being gradually provided.

"Infant mortality in Chile has been pproximately one-third the total morality. Of those babies that die under ne year of age about 60 per cent die nder one month old. Therefore, the port states, a great saving of life, erhaps from 80 to 90 per cent of ese deaths, will be prevented by roper hospital maternity provision or mothers.

"Four cities, Santiago, Los Leones. san Antonio and Talca, henceforth re to have their water supplies sterlized with chorine. Certain cities hich have had inadequate water for lomestic purposes, including Valpaiso, are being surveyed for an augented supply.

"In the water shortage, many towns uffer from a condition which makes or Chile's prosperity. Northern Chile the one arid region of the world which doesn't want more rain. If the limate changed and heavy rains fell periodically the water would gradnally dissolve the nitrate and wash away the country's unique reservoir of wealth."


