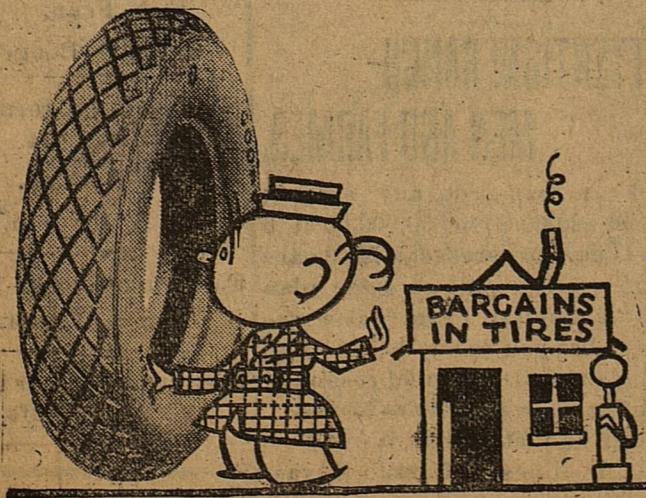

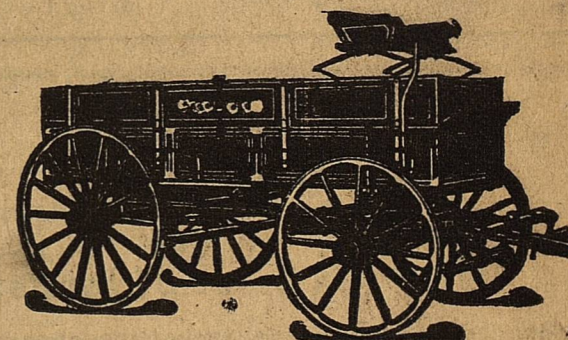

MOREHOUSE GIVES PLAN TO PROTECT PEOPLE FROM WILD-CAT PROMOTERS

American Bankers Association Official Who Has Exposed Fraudulent Schemes for Robbing Savers Draws Up Set of Rules to Foil Crooks.

ARTICLE NO. IV

THE solution to the great problem of protecting savings depositors from losing their money in fraudulent schemes is largely in the hands of our bankers. If they will co-operate with those who save they can make it hard for these plunderers to continue business. Hasten the day when our bankers without exception will gladly welcome interviews with depositors who contemplate making investments, will urge an investigation or recommend in the stead of little-known securities investments of unquestioned responsibility. In every case where customers call at the bank excited and nervous over some scheme where by investing a few hundred dollars they expect to make thousands any banker will at once sense the situation.

The banker knows that the depositor is being rushed off his feet, with "Hurry, hurry and get in on the big clean-up!" and it remains for the banker to caution the depositor against such tactics. In order to prevent this all that our bankers have to do is to suggest that their customers make it a rule always to bring high-pressure salesmen to the bank to be interrogated regarding their promotions. This will break up sales nine times out of ten, for high-pressure salesmen invariably avoid being questioned too closely by bankers who know investments.

Rules to Follow

Our bankers should urge this investment slogan: "Investigate before you invest. Consult your banker first," and so indelibly impress it on the minds of their depositors that they will always be guided by their banker's advice in making investments. Salient points which should be kept before the investing depositor are:

- (1) There are three cardinal points to all good investments, namely safety of principal, certainty of income and salability.
- (2) Safety of principal is more important than a high yield; the promise of big returns is usually a sign of a risky speculation.
- (3) It is like taking a leap in the dark to invest in promotions which are an unknown quantity and for this reason a thorough investigation should always be made.
- (4) It is morally wrong, if not criminally so, for any person to invest in any proposition he feels is a skin game, or which is tainted by trickery or fraud or opens the way for a favored few to "get in on the ground floor," clean up and get out from under before the scheme collapses. Usually the depositor finds he is not in on the ground floor, there is no chance for him to clean up before the scheme collapses and so he loses all that he has invested.
- (5) If a promotion is as good as claimed, it would not be necessary for high-pressure salesmen to resort to all sorts of questionable methods, it would not be necessary to rush a victim off his feet and sign him up before he could interview his banker, but he would be given time to consult others before investing.
- (6) The only reason high-pressure

pirates go to those who are inexperienced in finance for funds is because they can palm off on them so-called investments which in the eyes of men of experience are valueless.

(7) The glib-talking promoter is not a true friend of the savings depositor but is a wolf in sheep's clothing, he will resort to any kind of trickery to exchange a certificate of stock for the depositor's cash, his glittering promises are fictitious and he is planning how he can entrap his victims and relieve them of their savings and not how he can make good dividends for them.

(8) For every oil well that pays dividends there are many dry holes and abandoned drilling rigs, and for every profitable mine there are many abandoned shafts, and for every successful promotion there are a thousand failures, and because of these facts the savings depositor's chance of winning is too small to justify the great risk involved.

(9) Savers should steer clear of stock, shares or units in world-revolutionizing inventions which are peddled in front of empty stores or sold from house to house or through the mails.

(10) Every novice investor should remember that, as in all lines of business, black sheep have invaded the investment field. They must be shunned, while investment firms and salesmen of responsibility and integrity should be supported.

Let our banks unite in a movement designed to protect the depositor against the schemes of the wild-cat promoter—in a movement that will save our savings depositors from despair and from poverty as a result of having lost all—in a movement that will turn into legitimate investment channels the millions of dollars which are now wasted on fraudulent schemes of one kind or another. The best service a bank can render a novice investor is to keep him from making poor investments by helping him to make good ones.

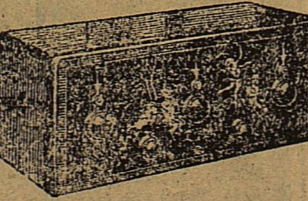

PIONEER RECALLS EARLY DAYS.

A brother's story of how cattle remained fat in the Concho Country, where feeding was unnecessary and where a cattleman could make money with ease drew Sam DeLong to West Texas 54 years ago last May 20. On that date he and two brothers rode horseback to the site of Lipan Springs to take up abode in this great land of opportunity.

"I learned a lot about the country some different than my brother told me," said Mr. DeLong Saturday as he recounted the great changes that have taken place in San Angelo and the Concho Country. Mr. DeLong was in town with his son-in-law Lewis Farris and family, and was going to Christoval, where he will be a few days with his daughter Mrs. Angus Peoples.

He said it used to be that he could fish in the Conchos and get all the fish he could carry a way inside of 20 minutes time. Bait wasn't a question. It was a matter of getting a hook in the water to get a bite. He deined to plentifully on fish then and hasn't cared for them since.

Indian fighting has become a past memory with Mr. DeLong, and he said Saturday he hadn't talked about it in a long time. He said his last conflict with a redskin was in 1874 at the ranch he then occupied, when he came upon an Indian in the act of ransacking his kitchen. The Indian strove to get his knife and advanced on him forcing Mr. DeLong to use his gun. It was goodby Indian. That was the last conflict he had with one of the natives of this country, though rangers later followed a band close to where Eldorado now is, and slaughtered several of them. He says this possibly was the last bloodshed with Indians in the early days.

Mr. DeLong will be 81 years old on November 12.

Lesson for June 27
REVIEW: WHAT WE HAVE
LEARNED FROM THE BOOK
OF GENESIS
GOLDEN TEXT—We know that all
 things work together for good to them
 that love God, who are the called ac-
 cording to his purpose.—Rom. 8:28.
PRIMARY TOPIC—Favorite Stories
 From Genesis.
JUNIOR TOPIC—Stories of the Pa-
 triarchs.
INTERMEDIATE AND SENIOR TOP-
IC—Favorite Characters in Genesis.
YOUNG PEOPLE AND ADULT TOP-
IC—Permanent Messages of the Book
 of Genesis.

The method of review must always
 be determined by the department of
 the Sunday school and by the teacher's
 preferences. For the young people
 and adults, perhaps the best method
 will be to assign the task of finding
 the most important teaching of each
 lesson.
 The following is suggestive of the
 method of review recommended:

Lesson for April 11—God created all
 things. The things which are come
 to be by the creative act of a personal
 God. God created man in His likeness
 and image, which means that man
 bears God's likeness morally and in-
 tellectually.

Lesson for April 18—The explana-
 tion of the ills and sorrows of the
 world can only be made on the basis
 of the historical fall of man as re-
 corded in the Bible. The prime actor
 in this tragedy was the personal, cun-
 ning, malicious being called the Devil.
 Because man is a free being, possess-
 ing the power of contrary choice, sin
 entered through man's belief of the
 Devil instead of God.

Lesson for April 25—Because the
 human race is an organism, Cain and
 Abel through the law of heredity
 came into the world with sinful na-
 tures. God taught them that the way
 of approach unto Him was through a
 bloody sacrifice, typifying the supreme
 sacrifice made by Jesus Christ on Cal-
 vary. Abel believed God, took his
 place as a sinner and presented his
 offer accordingly. Cain in proud self-
 will brought the fruit of the ground,
 thus ignoring God's appointed way of
 approach unto Him. Cain's offering
 therefore was rejected because he did
 not recognize himself as a sinner and
 come to God in the way which God had
 appointed.

Lesson for May 2—Noah, coming
 forth from the ark, faced the respon-
 sibility of repopulating the new world.
 In recognition of that obligation and
 out of gratitude for God's grace in sav-
 ing himself and family, he erected an
 altar and worshiped before the Lord.
 God responded and entered into cov-
 enant relationship with him.

Lesson for May 9—Lot's selfish
 choice involved him in trouble. Abra-
 ham, because of his separation from
 Sodom and unto God, was able to go
 against a mighty king and rescue his
 unfortunate nephew.

Lesson for May 16—God manifested
 Himself visibly to Abraham in the
 form of an angel. This angel was
 none other than the Son of God.
 Abraham thus met Jesus Christ. Christ
 no doubt referred to this when He
 said, "Abraham saw my day and was
 glad."

Lesson for May 23—Isaac, a child of
 the covenant given in the old age of
 his parents, was a gentle and
 peace-loving man. He suffered wrong
 rather than strive with his enemies.

Lesson for May 30—Jacob was
 chosen of God. Because of this God
 was with him. God will keep, pro-
 tect and prosper His elect ones even
 in spite of their weakness and failure.

Lesson for June 6—Esau because of
 living under the sway of his appetite
 sold his birthright for a mess of pot-
 tage. He afterward repented and
 sought to undo his deed. Though sin-
 cerely regretting his act, it was im-
 possible to change conditions. Our
 acts and choices are irrevocable.

Lesson for June 13—Joseph was
 peculiarly beloved by his father. Be-
 cause of this Jacob unwisely ex-
 pressed favoritism. This favoritism
 incited the jealousy of his
 brothers, who at the opportune
 time sold him as a slave to mer-
 chantmen going down to Egypt.
 Because of the false accusation of a
 wicked woman he was imprisoned.

Lesson for June 20—Because of Jo-
 seph's fidelity God raised him to a
 position of honor and power in Egypt.
 While in this position he made pro-
 vision against an awful famine which
 came upon the land and became a
 means of saving from starvation not
 only the Egyptians, but his brethren
 who came down from Canaan. Though
 they had wronged him he graciously
 forgave them and provided for them
 in their need.
