| TOM HUNTER "It is manifestly unfair that real estate be required to pave our roads. No part of the riad bond issues of the counties shall be paid by the levy f an ad valorem tax. Those who use the roads shall pay for them. Adjustments shall be made with counties, not bonded, by road improvement." <br> "Reduced tax burdens and fair price for his products is the greatest relief that can be offered for the farmer. A sales tax on out of state produced or produced commodities will stabilize his market prices." <br> The practice of a state official receiving compensation from corporation is wrong. This practice shall be made a felony. One who betrays his trust to the extent of taking a bribu should be executed." <br> "Our primary election laws shall be rewritten so that voters are permitted to express first and second choice when the num ber of canidates exceeds two and three when the number exceeds three. This will prevent organized combines from setting the stage for a run-off with "bumper" canidates." <br> "Permenete relief and reforms shall be had, affording every person the opportunity to provide for himself and his family. The provisions for subsistencs are advisable; though a national question, the state should co-operate." <br> "Trusts and monoplies shaly not be permitted. Holding company operation of subsidiaries shall be denied permits to du business. A combine of wealth will not be permitted to sell at a loss in one community for the destruction of indépendent business while making its profils elsewhere." <br> "Out of state chain stores must go. A levy upon the num. ber of stores operated and a sufficient sales tax upon their gross sales will remove the cancer. These master chains are committing us to a rule of plutocracy. In one Texas county these chains are responsible for clos. ing more than 1000 stores." <br> "The state owes every boy and girl an available free accredited high school education. The scholastic apportionment and above. Higher education shall be encouraged." <br> "Our state's business cannot be effectively and economically administered througt its present 131 units of government. An individual's or a corporation's business operated so incoherent ly would soom be bankrupt." <br> There shall be created a board of public relations of five to seven members.
