Q：Can a Texas resident＇s assets in another state be attached in that state with－ out the Texan being duly served by process？
Ay Any state has juris． diction or control over assets or property located within that state．And judgments can be taken and rendered against that property．But still，the U．S．and state con－ stitutions provide that no one can be deprived of prop－ erty without due process of law．This usually means ser－ vice of process or notice of the proceedings concerning your property in the other state．However，notice by publication in a newspaper has been authorized and validated in most states when the owner cannot be located or his address is un－ kown．
Q：My ex－wife is planning to change my daughter＇s name to that of her new hus－ band．Can she do that with． out my permission？
A：Yes．This requires court proceeding and a rea－ son for the requested change，but it can be done However，she must give you notice of the hearing．The court would decide the issue on the basis of good cause and what is in the best inter－ est of the child．You would certainly want to attend this hearing，preferably with an attorney，and argue against the name change．
Q：My son is in the process of getting a divorce，and his question concerns the distri－ bution of the property．He bought a 1973 car and stereo in his name．Who will get them？Will he have to sell them？
