

radioactive waste. The National Conference of State Legislatures has organized the working group under the provisions of the Nuclear Waste Policy Act of 1982 which mandates legislative involvement in facilities selection for disposal sites. The legislative group will act as a forum to air legislative views on all aspects of the Department of Enery's (DOE) high level radioactive waste siting program. In addition, the group will be advised of the latest technological advancements in testing and drilling programs for such waste.

"The disposal of highlevel nuclear waste is a problem which we must be fully prepared to deal with," Lieutenant Governor Hobby said. He added, "I am pleased to have a legislator with the background of Senator Sarpalius collecting information and presenting our views before the committee. His district is concerned with the siting problem, and therefore it is important that he have firsthand information about what is going on at the national level on this critical issue.'
