electric power-it's Southwestern's largest. Alectric power-its Southwestern's largest being built next to the one which will be fired up this month. The units cost more than $\$ 200$ million apiece. They can each provide
enough electricity to supply a city of 225,000 people.

Tollk Station will burn coal - ground as fine as talcum powderto produce electricity. The coal SPS uses comes from mines near
Gillette, Wyoming. It is a low-sulfur coal. Tolk Station Unit No 1 will burn approximately 315 tons of coal per hour. That's about 7.560 tons per day. The coal is delivered by 110 -ar train
directly from the Wyoming mines. Coal-fired plants are directly from the Wyoming mines. Coal-fired plants are
