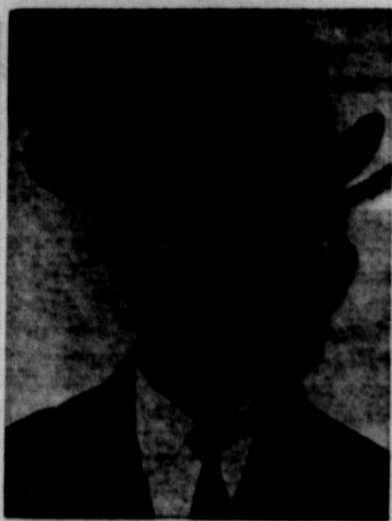

Dean Burger, Ken Burger and Joe Gordon are installing underground irrigation pipeline for better distribution of irrigation water.

Leon Daugherty is staking his land into 100 foot centers. We will make a grid map to locate the high points and the low points and will make him a sheet showing where to fill the land and where to cut the land.

Herb Graham has completed the land leveling on his farm just east of Pampa.

Tom Anderwald has completed leveling on a field on his farm. He has also worked over his tail-water recovery system. Tom has developed a very good system of recovering all of the water and tailwater that falls on his farm.

John Spearman is planning to level some land on his farm located northeast of Pampa.

Stan Kretzmeier is constructing a diversion terrace on his farm located west of Pampa.

Grass planting time is here. The grass should be planted before the first of June. Now would be a good time to get the seed and be ready when you decide to plant the grasses.

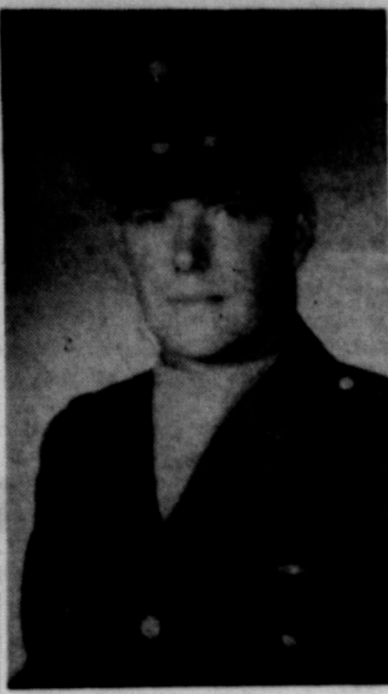
