Copies of the documents may be obtained by depositing \$100.00 with the Architect for each set of documents so obtained. Such deposits will be refunded on return of the Plans, Specifications and other documents in good condition within 10 days after bid opening.

A certified check or bank draft, payable to the Local Authority, U. S.

Government Bonds, or a satisfactory bid bond executed by the Bidder and acceptable Surety in an amount equal to five (5%) per cent of the bid shall be submitted with each bid.

The successful bidder will be required to furnish and pay for satisfactory performance and payment bond or bonds.

Attention is called to the fact that not less than the minimum salaries and wages as set forth in the Specifications must be paid on this project.

The Local Authority reserves the right to reject any or all bids or to waive any informalities in the building.

No bid shall be withdrawn for a period of sixty (60) days subsequent to the opening of bids without consent of

Mrs. Ted Longino of Sapulpa, Okla., is visiting her parents Mr. and Mrs. C. B. Peabody.

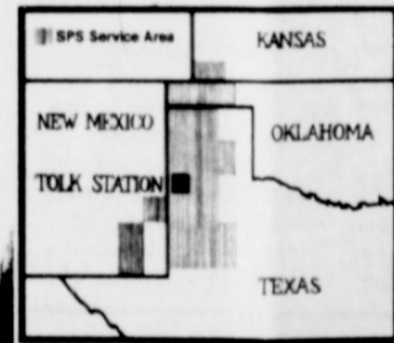

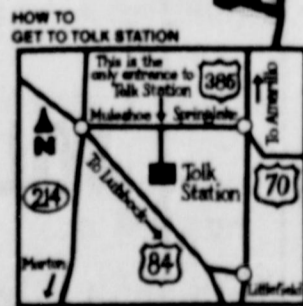

Some Answers for AT&T stockholders

In Southwestern Bell's territory, there are 224,000 AT&T stockholders and more than 100,000 of them are right here in Texas. Many of you have questions about what will happen to your AT&T stock after divestiture.

Currently, AT&T stock represents an investment in the total Bell System - Long Lines, Western Electric, Bell Labs and the operating companies, like Southwestern Bell. At divestiture, the assets of the Bell System will be divided.

For example, a share owner who currently owns 50 shares of AT&T stock will still own 50 shares of AT&T stock after divestiture. In addition, the stockholder will own a proportionate interest in the divested operating companies.

No final decision has been made on a procedure for dividing the stock once AT&T spins off the 22 operating companies. However, AT&T is working on a plan to make it easy and inexpensive for share owners to manage their holdings.

Specific investment procedures and other details have not been finalized. Any plan regarding AT&T stock requires review by the Bell operating companies, the Department of Justice and the federal court before it can be enacted.

Whatever plan is accepted, AT&T is committed to ensuring the plan is fair and equitable. In addition, AT&T plans to minimize, as much as possible, transaction costs associated with the consolidation of small share holdings.

Check Identification Whenever in Doubt

It's a good idea to make sure you're satisfied before letting anyone in your home. That's why every Southwestern Bell employee carries an identification card.

The ID card shows his or her name, a photograph and an expiration date. The next time a Bell employee comes, you can request

identification, if desired. He'll understand that you don't let just anyone enter your home.

Planning Before Emergencies Occur

The best way to prepare for emergencies is through advance planning. Make sure that every family member - especially small children - understand what they should do when the unexpected happens.

Remember to keep important telephone numbers near the phone. Police, fire and ambulance numbers should head your list. You might also note doctors, hospitals, neighbors and near-by relatives.

They should give the nature of the emergency, name and address and a contact number. If the emergency requires leaving the house, always give a neighbor's phone number instead of your own.

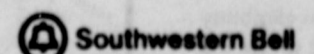

Area Cooks Invited To Display Culinary Skills To Win McLean Bucks

McLean cooks will get an opportunity to display their skills and to win some "McLean Bucks" if they participate in an up-coming Chamber of Commerce event. In an effort to promote Christmas shopping at home, the McLean Chamber will

sponsor a Christmas Bakeoff contest, with the winners to receive "McLean Bucks" (money which can be spent with any McLean merchant) of \$150 for first place, \$100 for second place, and \$75 for third place.

The competing cooks must send in an entry blank with a copy of the

recipe which they will use by Dec. 1. There is no entry fee, and cooks may enter as many recipes as they want. On Dec. 11, the competing cooks will bring their prepared dishes to the McLean Lions Club at 10 a.m. where out-of-town judges will choose the winners. The dish must be a des-

sert, and will be judged on appearance and taste. Only those cooks who have mailed in their entry and sent their recipes will be eligible to compete. At least 30 recipes must be entered, or the contest will be cancelled. The competing recipes will be printed in a booklet, and will be offered for sale by the Chamber on the day

of the Bakeoff. Following the judging, each dessert will be served for \$1 per slice to those who attend the Bakeoff. Cooks who wish to enter, should write their recipe on a 3x5 card. The recipe should include a list of all ingredients, with the amount used,

complete instructions for preparing, including type and size of pan used, and the time and temperature at which the dish is cooked.
