er who injures another er who injures another
person in an accident will receive a minimum of 30 days in jail, even it he receives probation for th
rest of the sentence rest of the sentence. Killing someone while
driving drunk carries the same two to ten year penalty the offense now carries. But, the new law
would require then would require that such
defendants spend at leas defendants spend at leas
four months in prison even if they are granted probation.
Juveniles who are ar rested for drunken driv
ing will face the ing will face the same
